

Mail your packages early. Be sure that your packages are securely wrapped and tied. Packages containing breakables such as glass, china, radios, watches should all be packed in corrugated cartons with a cushioning material two inches thick around the article between the carton and the article being packed.

Always remember that even tho your parcel is stamped "fragile," once it is inside a parcel post sack no one can read that "fragile" sign. Furthermore that sack with your "fragile" package might be on the bottom of sacks stacked clear to the ceiling of a mail car.

Other gardeners may think of a NATIVE as a wild plant. He may ber 6. lose interest in NATIVES that are too generally available.

Another user of NATIVES is the gardener who likes to have plants about him that he has discovered while vacationing elsewhere in the West.

NATIVE plants are not particularly insect or disease resistant. Sometimes trouble will develop with NATIVES that are droughtresistant when they are placed under garden conditions. Plants in this class are often susceptible to
