## Headed For Trouble



'The pleased smile on this tippler's face may soon be wiped away. Right now he is only drunk. But if he succeeds in starting his car he may become even more dangerously so. He may become, indeed, dead drunk.

Every day hundreds of drinkers around the world mix cars

with cups and drive to their deaths. Unfortunately they often take sober motorists and pedestrians along with them. There is nothing on the road more dangerous than a drunken driver, to himself, to all unlucky enough to share his route.

The above photograph was taken from a World Health Organization cartoon film entitled "To Your Health." The film's lessons can be applied to many other hazards posed by over-indulgence besides road accidents. For almost invariably alcoholism is linked to mental illness.

Several years ago the World Health Organization devoted a special issue of its bimonthly magazine "World Health" to alcoholism. One of the photos illustrating the lead story was captioned: "This Man is Sick, Not Drunk." Pictured above was an alcoholic who had

reached an ultimate state of depression.

It is in recognition of alcoholism as an increasing grave mental health problem that WHO and the Pan American Sanitary Bureau, its Regional Office for the Americas, are working to aid nations in cutting down the tragic human and economic wastes that result from too much drink.

Deaths and injuries on the road are only one of alcoholism's more dramatic damages to a society. Alcoholism is a disease. Like all diseases, its evils are not limited only to those who suffer from it. Directly or indirectly it affects all of us, all society. Society therefore must combat it in self-defense — else, like the drunk behind the wheel, society itself may be "Headed For Trouble."
