## EDITORIAL- HEART-THROBS IN THE COUNTRY.

There are numerous reasons why so many want to get away from cities and live in the open spaces, out here in God's country. We who have pulled out of the hardened arteries of traffic, smoke, noise, struggle and that inexplicable coldness of heart, often feel the warm tug of the heartstrings over some trivial event or a major disaster such as death, sickness, accidents.

This was brought home to Alpine folk last week when Mrs. Fred Rushing had just come home from the hospital with a new baby and was suddenly stricken by gastric hemorrhages and lay near death in a hospital.

Fred later declared that he had never realized how wonderful the people of Alpine had been; how many had phoned the hospital seeking news, offering blood, help.

This same evidence of fellowship showed recently when the Vincent family was burned out in Peutz valley and help and money came from all sides. Also when fire destroyed the La Force home two years ago and Alpine did itself proud in turning up with help, furniture, clothes.

Yes, we have many heart-throbs out here in the hills. Perhaps it is because we are closer to Nature, to God, to our fellow man-- maybe to our real selves.
