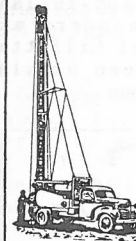

BUTCHER NEW HEAD OF CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

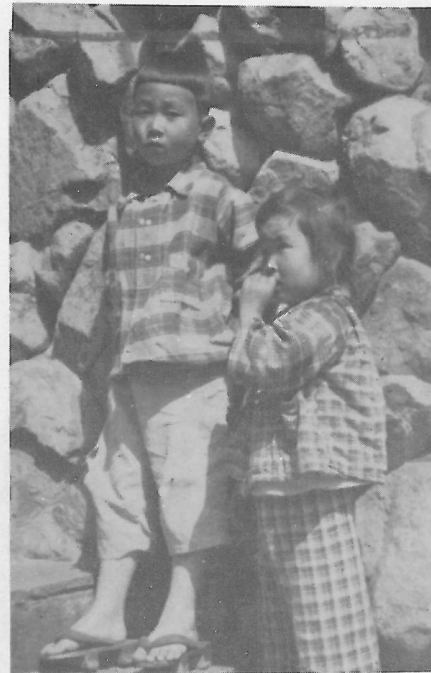
Annual election of officers was Tuesday night at George Butcher's home with nine of the 13 new directors present who named him president for 1952-53, succeeding Cecil Lewinson. Alec Clitsome was made treasurer. Clarke Irvine remains as secretary. Judge Walters acted as chairman.

Next meeting is Tues. the 29th at the same place, to outline plans for the year. Three major items are to be stressed: the new sanitary district; zoning, and water. Other matters to be worked upon involve many civic improvements including added fire protection and policing, the latter being practically nil.

"The chamber is committed to work for the general betterment of this community" declared President Butcher "but we need the support of every resident, property owner and business. The public is invited to take memberships, and every business is urged to help". Directors plan a big community barbecue this fall, with other events to raise funds for the projects visualized to improve and enhance property values and living conditions here.

Judge Walters, chairman of the sanitary district committee, reported that the option has been obtained at \$1,000. for the two acres site from Mr. Holland, and attorneys are preparing boards for the election soon to be held. Final survey was completed last week.

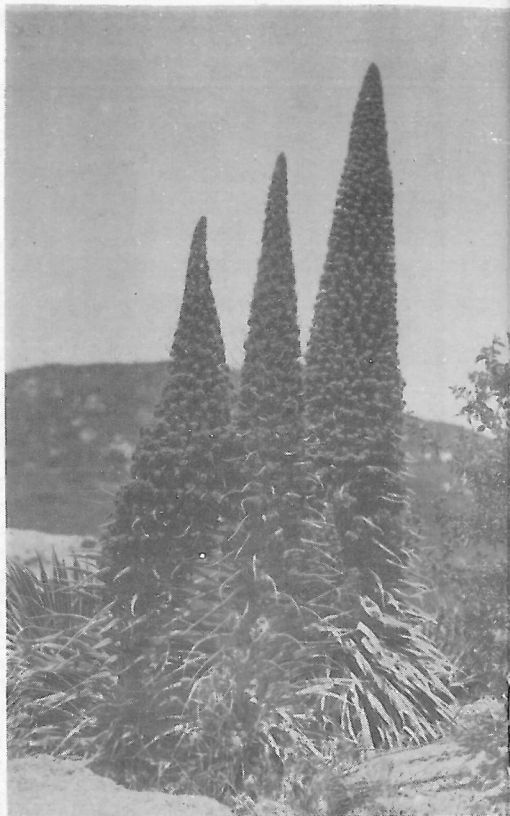
