BARRETT LEASES OLD P.O.

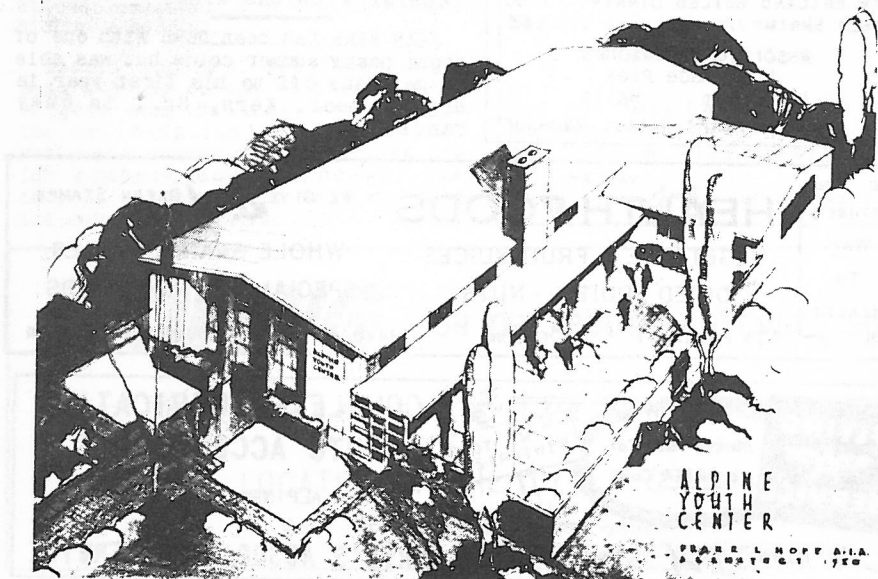

JEAN KERN has been down with one of those nasty summer colds but was able to get Hans off to his first year in high school. Kern, Sr., is busy ranching.

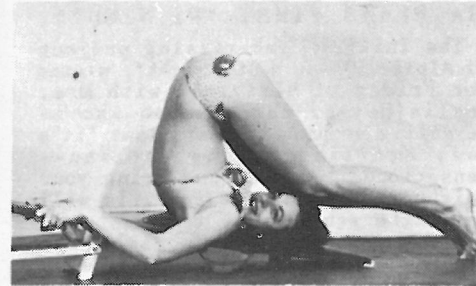

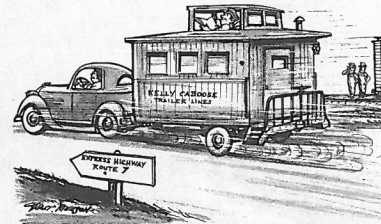
PTA PLANS FIRST "PI NIGHT"

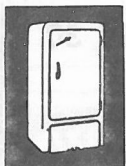

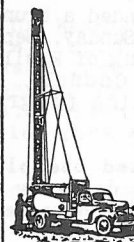

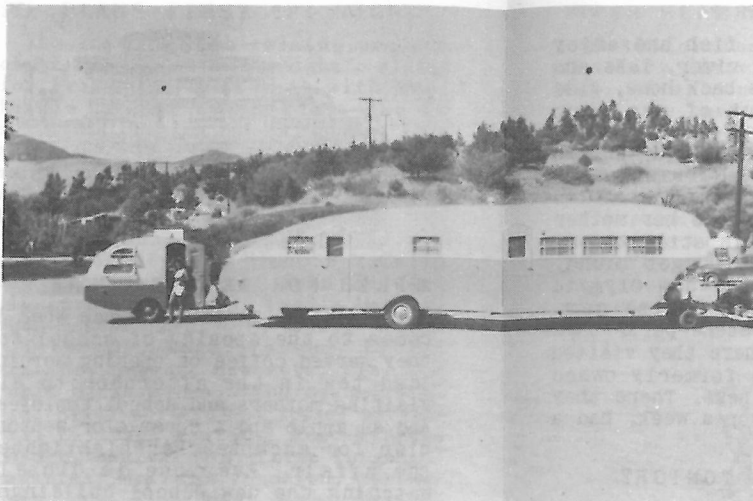
