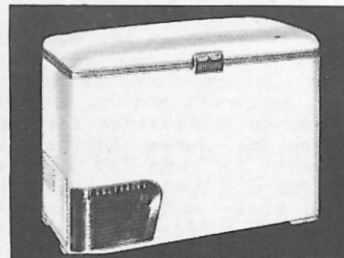

### ALPINE ROADS IMPROVED

A number of major county arteries and some minor roads are receiving or will soon get working over, reports Sam Hansen, head of the county road station here.

Alpine Terrace, a slightly area southwest of Tavern and Arnold, has been surveyed and 'weather permitting, will be reconstructed, graded and oiled, states Hansen. This was in bad condition since it was a private subdivision.

The road to Loveland lake, Eltinge drive, and other minor spots will be smoothed and oiled. The 1.3 mile cut-off where Sweetwater bridge was moved is now finished, bridge painted, signs up and is a fine addition to the Japatul route which soon will be completed through to Descanso. Just now the 6 mile paving extension at the upper end is nearly done. The road over to the Lawson valley area will next be started. The Dehesa road down has been surveyed and will probably be straightened and paved within a year.

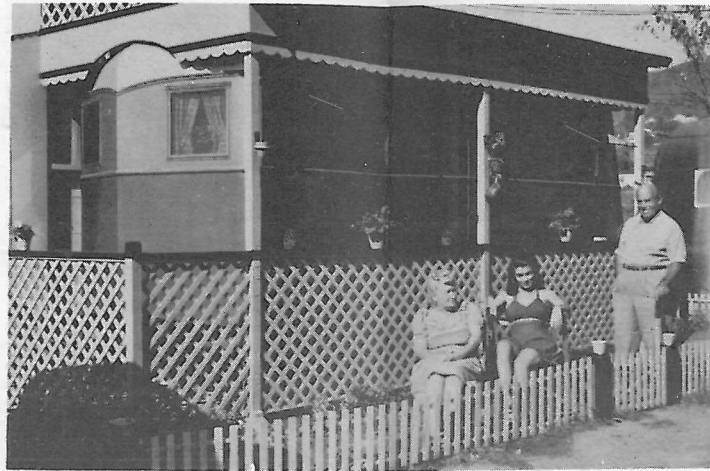
