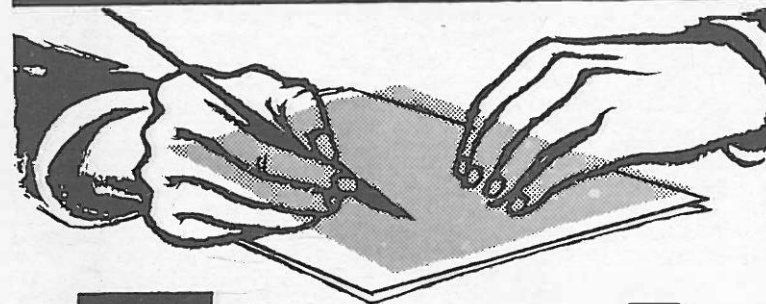

Service Charges or Labor Bills

A T.V. SET SHOULD BE REMEMBERED AS BEING A LUXURY IN ALL PHASES. THEREFORE. SERVICE CHARGES AND LABOR CHARGES SHOULD BE WELL TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION AS ALSO BEING A LUXURY. SUCH AS CALLING THE REPAIRMAN TO YOUR HOME WITH HIS TRANSPORTATION. THIS DEFINITELY JUSTIFIES THE REPAIRMAN IN MAKING A LEGAL SERVICE CHARGE. WHEN HE ARRIVES AND FINDS THE SET OPERATING CORRECTLY. HE STILL IS JUSTIFIED IN MAKING A LEGAL CHARGE. WHEN HE LEAVES HIS SHOP FOR YOUR HOME HE IS UNDER THE IMPRESSION THAT YOUR T.V. SET OR RADIO IS NOT FUNCTIONING CORRECTLY. AT THE SAME TIME THE REPAIRMAN IS NOT JUSTIFIED IN CHARGING A LARGE SUM FOR THIS SERVICE WHETHER HE REPAIRED THE SET OR NOT.

HOUSE CALLS SHOULD NOT EXCEED \$4.50 FOR THE CALL. WHERE \$4.50 IS CHARGED WHEN THE REPAIRMAN WORKS ON THE SET. HE WILL CHARGE THE MINIMUM OF \$3.75 AN HOUR PLUS THE \$4.50 FOR THE CALL. IF THE SET HAS TO GO TO THE SHOP, THE SAME MINIMUM SHOULD APPLY. HOWEVER. THE REPAIRMAN MAY CHARGE A FLAT RATE NOT TO EXCEED \$6.00 FOR THE CALL AND ANY AMOUNT OF TIME HE NEEDS TO WORK ON YOUR SET. THIS INCLUDES WHETHER HE CAN REPAIR IT IN THE HOUSE OR THE SHOP. THESE CHARGES CAN ONLY BE EXPECTED WITHIN A REASONABLE DISTANCE OF THE SHOP.

RADIOS SHOULD BE APPROXIMATELY \$2.50 FOR THE CALL. AND \$1.50 AN HOUR BASIS. IF TAKEN TO THE SHOP-- \$1.50 HOURLY MINIMUM. AUTO RADIOS WILL VARY IN LABOR COSTS.

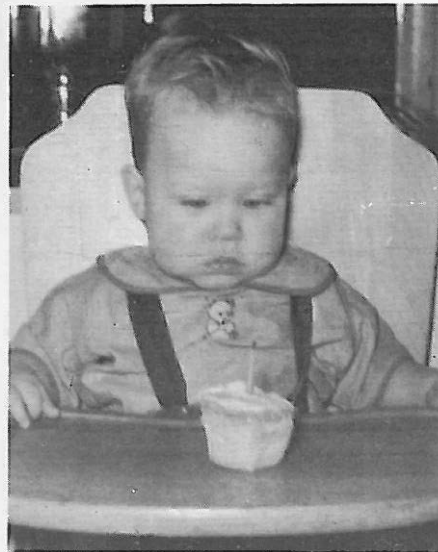
