FIRST WHITE BORN HERE IS DEAD

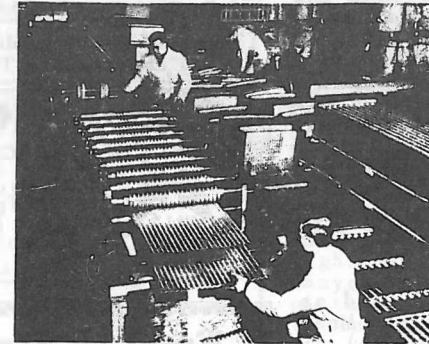
