The Sun on Jan. 15, 1953, ran a story on it, with an editorial on Feb. 26th, which elicited comment from an evidently high official in the form of a letter to this office:

Your editorial of Feb. 26 about development of water resources is an example of outstanding and progressive thinking on the subject, not only in terms of your local community problems but also for the entire Pacific Southwest.

Many of our citizens are not fully aware of the fact that every well drilled to tap underground water supplies depletex those sources of supply and lowers the depth to water table where they may be reached for pumping to the surface. So critical did this situation become in the Owens Valley a few years ago that, in the town of Independence, where a well dug 10 feet deep had supplied water to local residents. after a period of pumping by some 400 deep wells the water table had been so lowered and underground water resources so depleted in 1929, that the well at Independence had to be dug 150 feet deeper to reach water at all. Not until water was brought into Owens Valley again from other sources in the Mono basis was this lowering of its underground water table corrected.

Alpine, Fallbrook, and other localities in S.D. county are today facing a similar situation of depletion, both surface and underground, that Owens valley was subjected to a few years ago.

He concluded by giving state, city and federal offices where more data on this urgency might be had, which The Sun has turned over to the chamber of commerce, hoping that it will take early action.

But the main thing is to get water for Alpine!




