VOTE FOR HOSPITAL OCT. 27

The back country's long awaited Grossmont 100-bed hospital will be nearing actuality by late 1954 if bonds necessary to help finance the \$2,000,000 plant are approved by the voters at a special election on Oct. 27. Federal and state governments, recognizing the need, have made grants of \$1,173,000 but this is good only if taxpayers vote yes on that date.

Mrs. Howard Ball, chairman of the Alpine area of the Woman's Auxiliary, has appointed Mrs. L.E. Carlson as election chairman. She is rounding out a complete organization which will be responsible for getting out the vote.

A citizen's committee has been formed with Robert L. Swaeringin, El Cajon, as chairman. Offices are at 139 N. Orange, El Cajon.

Mrs. Frank J. Doerr is a member of the Citizen's committee representing Alpine. She will assist the committee in completing plans in publicizing the bond issue and in getting out the vote.

Directors of the hospital district declare it is their intent to contain the redemption of these bonds within the present tax rate of 2 mills.

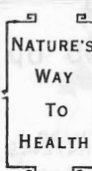

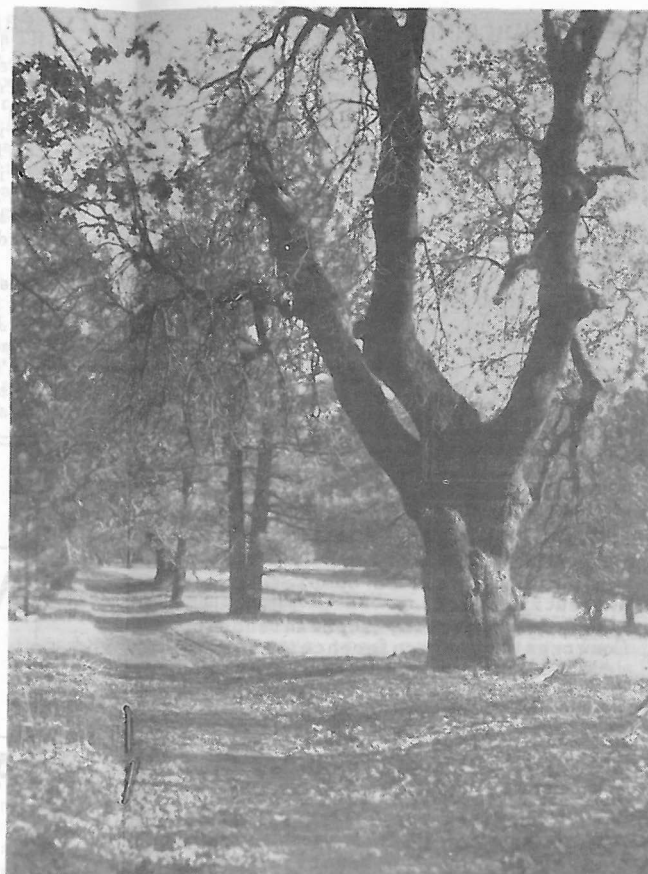
