This community is all a buzzing over the prospects of having regular buses running between Alpine, El Cajon and San Diego.

Executives of Greyhound and S.D. Transit System, have been here conferring with people regarding this important matter.

The present activity was started three years ago when Mr. and Mrs. A.D. Forchette, Upper Blossom valley below Alpine, called the S.D. company PHONES FOR JAPATUL-LAWSON

Service by the middle of 1954 is assured for Japatul and Lawson valleys and way points, reveals Wm. Rank, manager of El Cajon's office which operates the Alpine area services, who was a visitor to The Sun office last week.


### PTA PIE NIGHT DUE



### VOTE FOR HOSPITAL OCT. 27

The back country's long awaited Grossmont 100-bed hospital will be nearing actuality by late 1954 if bonds necessary to help finance the \$2,000,000 plant are approved by the voters at a special election on Oct. 27. Federal and state governments, recognizing the need, have made grants of \$1,173,000 but this is good only if taxpayers vote yes on that date.

Mrs. Howard Ball, chairman of the Alpine area of the Woman's Auxiliary. has appointed Mrs. L.E. Carlson as election chairman. She is rounding out a complete organization which will be responsible for getting out the vote.

A citizen's committee has been formed with Robert L. Swaerengin. El Cajon, as chairman. Offices are at 139 N. Orange, El Cajon.

Mrs. Frank J. Doerr is a member of the Citizen's committee representing Alpine. She will assist the committee in completing plans in publicizing the bond issue and in getting out the vote.

Directors of the hospital district declare it is their intent to contain the redemption of these bonds within the present tax rate of 2 mills.


MOUNTAIN RETREAT OPENS



back at night?' Forchette is a carpenter, works presently beyond S.D., points out that each man operating a car runs costs up, adds to traffic.

McClure admitted they would have to put on special coaches, agreed that fast buses could not make frequent stops to pick up and drop commuters and other passengers.

Forchette then contacted The Sun. with the result that Monday night there was a meeting at the Forchette home where McClure was to have appeared, but was called to El Centro. Whalen, on the phone, said he would be in Alpine within a day or so to survey the situation, thought 'the density of population is too thin', but when Editor Irvine pointed to the 2400 population, Whalen expressed

### surprise.

While Greyhound holds the franchise east of El Cajon, it is hardly in a position to handle local traffic, of which there is a great deal between Alpine and E.C., including the many residents of Harbison Canyon. Sufficient demand would no doubt switch franchise to the smaller utility that could serve this area.

Forchette did not wait for any machinery to get going on the idea, promptly put out petitions, got around 300 signatures. Everyone emphatically wants bus service. Many business and military people commute daily, with such service could be driven to the bus, and save auto costs and traffic hazards.

Complaints have been frequent here that Greyhound cannot be depended upon due to schedules being affected by distant events; buses are often crowded, speed through without stopping, and service is too infrequent. In addition there is but one stop in Alpine, at the Log Cabin Cafe station.

If it is found advisable, Whalen told Forchette, the transit people will put on service for a month's test, and if the trial indicates enough patronage, regular service could then be contemplated. 
