#### BAPTIST CHURCH OPENS HERE

Alpine's fourth church is now functioning, having just opened in the building formerly operated by Carol and Ray Dennison as a taco-beer business. It is the original Nylander property on Hiway 80 a mile below the village, south side, opposite the Fitzgerald cottages. It is being purchased.

The Rev. Wm. E. Jones in charge with Ed Wilson, Sunday school superintendent, residing there with his wife and three children. It is sponsored by the Lakeside congregation, where Wilson hails from. Jones is from Santee, head of the extension bureau, serving Edgemoor farm. It is the second church Lakeside has sponsored, the other being First Southern of E.C. Jones, English born, is from Michigan, his wife, an Ohioan.

Sunday school (all grades) is at 9:30, worship, 10:30, Bible Training Union, 6:30, evening worship, 7:30 with Wednesday evening prayer meeting at 7:30.

#### ALPINE HONORS ROY CLARK

**EDITORIAL**

**IS NATIONAL DEBT A SHADOW?**

While our great newspapers harp so incessantly upon the Communist menace and Christian churches so repeatedly blast the Russians (when they should be praying for them), perhaps it is meet that America's tiniest newspaper should say something about our Moloch at Washington.

There are several phases of our national government that might be revised to conform to the original foundation ideas of this wonderful country. Thomas Jefferson, one of the greatest of all Americans, who wrote most of the Declaration of Independence, once said 'The whole art of government consists in the art of being honest'. Also 'A little rebellion now and then is a good thing'.

Along with fur coats and freezers we have had tax official scandals and a lot of other things. But mainly we suffer from excessive taxation to pay for excessive spending. If there is no rain, the outdoors will be as dangerous as in the house, when Christmas comes, warns Fire Chief Sam Randazzo, 'and so let us be ever watchful for fire hazards.

Nothing is more tragic than a beautiful holiday home turned into charred mass, with perhaps loved ones injured or even dead! He lists precautions!

Is the light circuit adequate? concealed wires overloaded can become red hot.

Use only firesafe trimmings. Keep the tree trunk base in water to prevent drying.

Check light cords, sockets, etc. better discard a light set than lose a home.

Keep tree away from heating systems and place a sheet of firesafe material under the tree.

Don't use same tree or lights circuit for an electric heater.

Finally, regard your tree as if it were a bucket of gasoline. It's that dangerous!

Be fire-conscious. Your Fire Dept. wishes you, and knows you will have, a very merry Christmas.

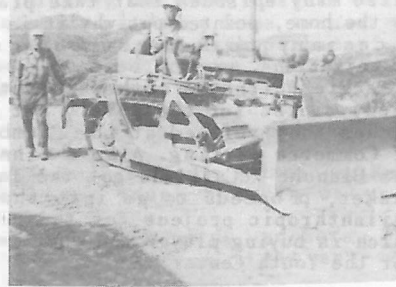

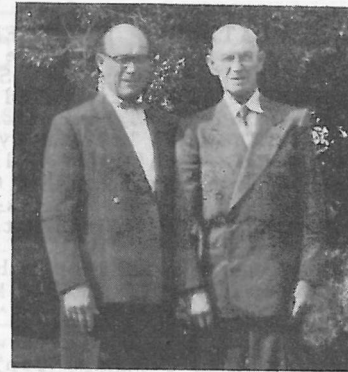
