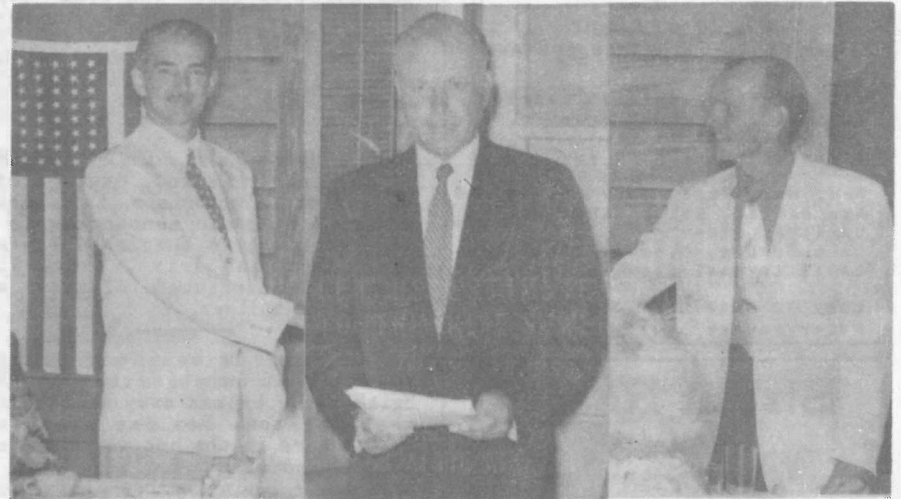

MORE PHONES SHOW GROWTH

On the first of last month, 804 main phones, not including extensions, were being dialled through Alpine's Hickory 5 exchange here, reports manager Wm. Rank of the E.C. office. To date, 31 have been installed in Japatul, bringing the valley that much closer to Alpine and the nation.

Records show that the U.S. averages 29 phones per 100 population, S.D. has 36, and Alpine about 3.45 which would give it a population of 2460, just 60 over what the Sun holds. Highest in the U.S. is Washington D.C. with 63.9, San Francisco next with 54.3.

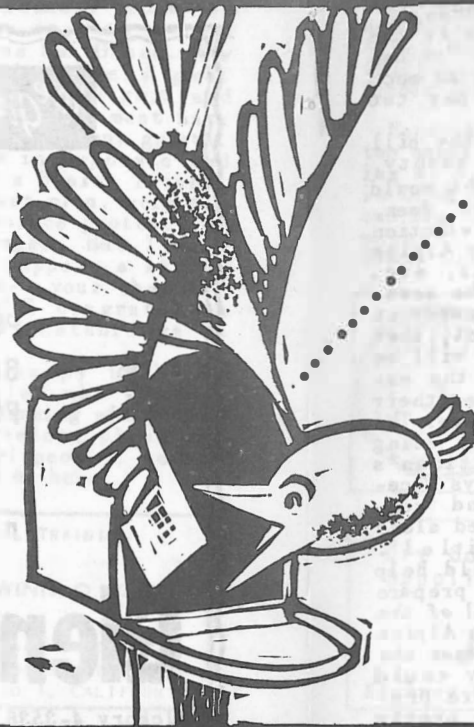

'overruled by county officials', and that the bonds had been advertised and sold in November, making present payments necessary on two years' principal and 1 1/2 years' interest. Had they been sold after January, the pay load would have been deferred.

'You have to pay \$115,000. in 23 years' said Vincenze, 'and the way they set it up will save you interest'. But the heavy payments today, are what caused all the trouble.

Use charge, same as other towns, runs from \$1. a year per pupil at the school to \$9. for a trailer, \$18. for a dwelling and on up, they reported. The privilege fee may be spread over 10 years at \$25. a year. Future rates depend on the number of users, each will reduce the tax by 1.1¢.

Several leaders took the floor, asked many questions, among them, Hugh Kidder with copious notes, Al Hinkle, H.A. Spear, Wm. S. Lethbridge Robt. C. Bostrom, Louis Landt, Sam Randazzo, Dr. Frank Bornowski, Bob Wilson, W.E. Homes and Johnnie Mae Grandeur. Her remarks at the end of the show helped a lot: 'we had not expected to have to pay so much so soon- we just cannot pay two year's taxes in one year'.

Among charges that upped the bill were land, survey by the county, which the people had thought would be free, special bond lawyers' fees, printing, advertising, some election costs (\$300. subscribed by Alpine businessmen), inspections, etc.

The fact is Alpine has the sewer ready to operate, and the sponer it gets going and users connect, that much quicker the cost load will be reduced, was the gist of the explanation. Several signified their intention to apply for service. The task of tying in is already being estimated for some by Kitzman's Plumbing, without charge, says Vice-President Larry Anderson, and 'connection fees can be financed along with the contract, on FHA Title 1'.

Note- We believe it would help matters if the county will prepare a brief explanation in detail of the matter and publish it in the Alpine Sun. We believe it would appease the taxpayers, at least they could leisurely digest the entire proposition which today is a pretty sore point with everyone. -C.I.

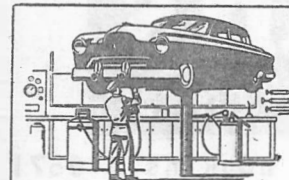
