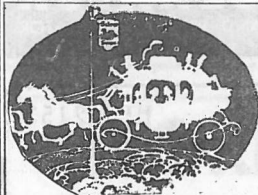

The Dog Owners' Protective Association will have a lively session at the Youth Center here on Wednesday, Oct. 27, at 8 p.m., announces its president, Mrs. Gertrude Fournier, owner of a collie kennel.

South county dog lovers met Wednesday week in Spring Valley to air the case of Mrs. K.A. Jerney, whose complaint in court brought a \$200. suspended fine to Mr. and Mrs. Ken Neary, who operate a collie kennel where they are building a home on Highway 80 a mile below town. Their dogs had been barking, Mrs. Jerney declared. Judge A. Fenton Garfield heard the case.

'The meeting is not only to protect dogs', Mrs. Fournier told the Sun, 'but to help people who have to listen to barking animals; it is more educational.'

The county has some 40,000 dogs, 10,000 licensed, and 40 breeding kennels with over \$1 million in show dogs, the association stated, and is endeavoring to recruit 20,000 members.

'Something must be done to give dogs a few rights, declared Mrs. Margo Hughes, owner of Ave Maria Gardens, Glenview, a worker for the organization, who attended the trial.

Mrs. Jerney, living on Midway Dr. back of Neary's, has two houses and acreage where she has goats, a pig, chickens, and says her sleep had been disturbed for a year, before she went to court. Neary is a researcher in jet engines at Ryan, raises dogs as a hobby, having six blooded animals worth \$2500.

Suspension of the fine is for one year, but if two or more complain, Neary will have to pay. The court will not hear complaints for 30 days.

A new court action in the affair is slated for Tuesday, Oct. 26 at 9:30 a.m. before Judge Garfield. This time the Nearys are plaintiffs, Mrs. Jerney being defendant. Court records show the charge against her being 'disturbing the peace by using vulgar, profane and abusive language'.

MORE SCHOOL BONDS DUE

On Dec. 16 an election for \$87,000. in bonds has been called by the Alpine Union School District for erecting eight new classrooms, which are badly needed, reports G. L. Klipp, board president.

The District's bonding capacity is now only \$63,000. but the additional \$24,000 can be sold within the next two years. The old school will be sold to augment bond money.

Currently they are using two condemned classrooms on the old site, plus a makeshift one on the auditorium stage. By erecting all facilities on the new site, operation and maintenance will be lowered, also eliminating two hazardous daily crossing of Hiway 80 for lunch, declares Supt. Frank S. Brown, adding that the bond money is for classrooms and rest-rooms only.

Cost of the issue will be about 20¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation. Voters may register with Mrs. Frank Doerr, or at the city hall, El Cajon before Oct. 23.


Note- The urgency of added classrooms assures the success of the election. This will bring the school plant to way over \$2 million. Another point to keep in mind is that one day Alpine's steady growth, and the slowly descending water table, will mean that we must get water. Keep that in mind! - C.I.
