ZONING PROTECTS PROPERTY

Down in beautiful Eucalyptus Hills near Lakeside they are feuding over proposed zoning against poultry ranches. The county planning commission, expert at this, is called in by residents who realize that as unincorporated areas, like Alpine, grow, they must sometime face this problem. Today our fine community is slowly awakening to the urgent necessity of planning its future growth.

Many nice homes are being built and more are planned. When we get ample water, this place will become one of the county's finest suburban communities.

But if it is allowed to grow without planning, valuable properties can quickly be jeopardized, values lowered, people get disgusted. Under present unlimited freedom, anyone may start a wrecking yard, boiler factory, body and fender shop, chicken or cattle ranch-- hogs come under strict ruling-- or build some cheap housing.

If you want to protect your property values, you better get busy, through some civic organization, and get Alpine planning started. C.I.

FREDENBURGS KILLED IN CAR

During the rain last Wednesday week John L. Fredenburg, 40, fire commissioner and his wife Neva, 32, were instantly killed. He had diverted to the shoulder as the car of Wm. J. Anderson, 23, navyman of S. Dakota, and his fiance, Jeanette Williams, 17, skidded across the highway broadside into him. The driver escaped with cuts and bruises while Jeanette suffered shock. (see pictures).

Neva was born in S.D. on April 1, 1922, leaves her mother, Mrs. Bernice Sneath, Ramona, formerly owner of L & L Feed Co. here, which the Fredenburgs took over when he left Rideout Bros. in S.D. They lived in a trailer at Alpine Circle Court. He ran a radio-TV service shop while she worked in the city. Both were ham radio operators.

Fredenburg was born Oct. 3, 1914 in Stamford, N.Y., was raised in Gloversville, went to high school at Johnstown, came to this state in 1942 His brother, Robert, of Poughkeepsie, came here for the funeral. He had one other brother and four sisters.

He had been active in civil defense, organized the American Radio Emergency Corps in 1951, built up GHQ in Balboa Park, had taught and aided many young operators, would always go out of his way to help young people. The Fredenburgs were married in March, 1947.

'Yes, they were two swell kids' lamented Agnes McGuffie, their neighbor in business, 'and many's the time Johnnie would go out of the way to help a yone-- he even delivered prescriptions out of here, to help anyone out'.

Both were given funeral services at Johnson-Saum Knobel Mortuary in P.C., with entombment in Cypress View.

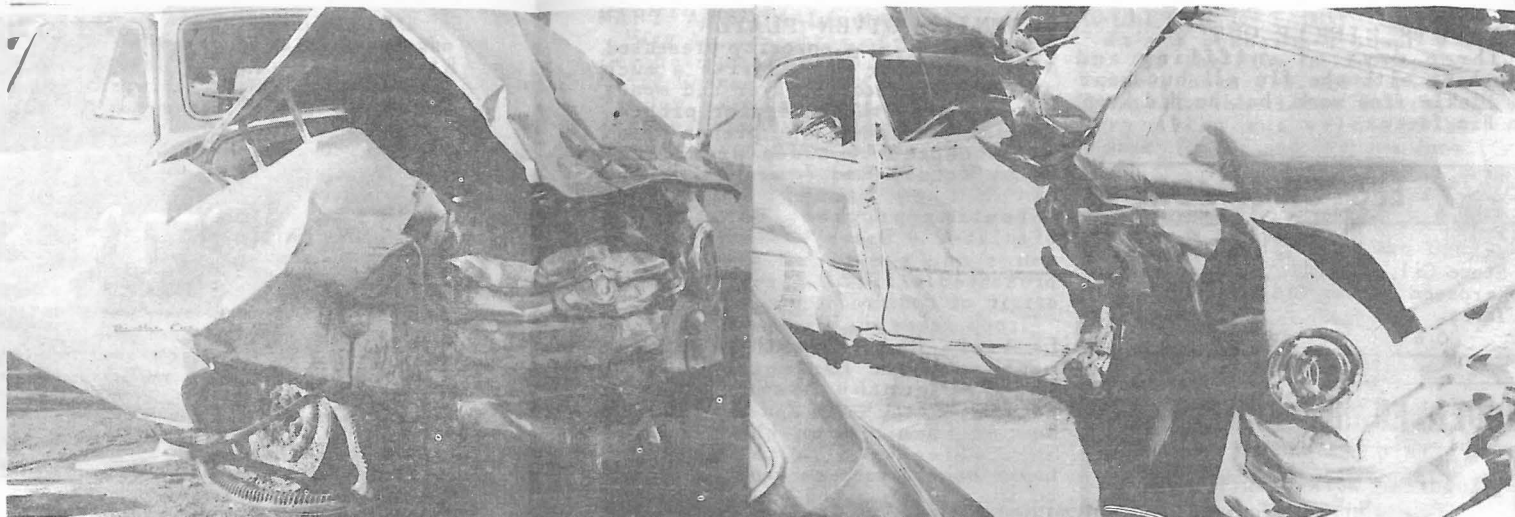

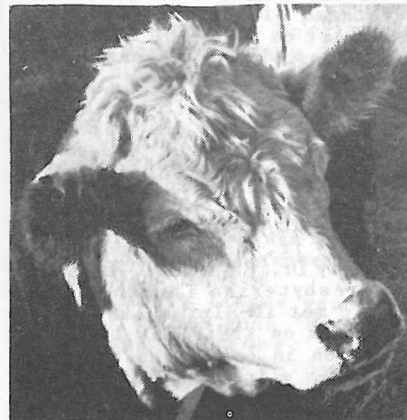

will then pass the required ordinance and the numbering system officially goes into effect when residents and businesses will be duly notified of their numbers.

'In the meantime' Yakel tells the Sun 'there are some 50 odd roads, lanes, driveways or easements in your area that are not named. These can't be numbered unless you people request it, submitting at least three suggested names for each road so the county may assign one that will not conflict'.

It is suggested that every resident of an unnamed road get busy at once, with other residents--even if there are only two or three--and suggest names, sending in a letter to the Sun, which will submit the entire lot in time to receive names and numbers.

Just as soon as the map is official, showing the numbers on all roads, the Sun will publish the first map of Alpine which will be of great value to everyone here, plus many businesses, government agencies and others.

Note- This project was started by the Sun in August of 1953, and we are happy to see its fruition, another step in the progress of Alpine in preparation for future growth. The next project is zoning and water! -CI
