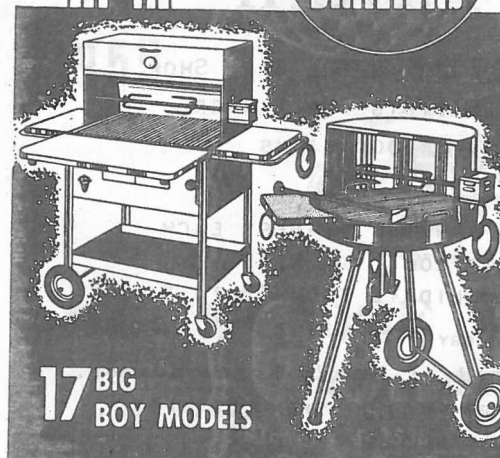

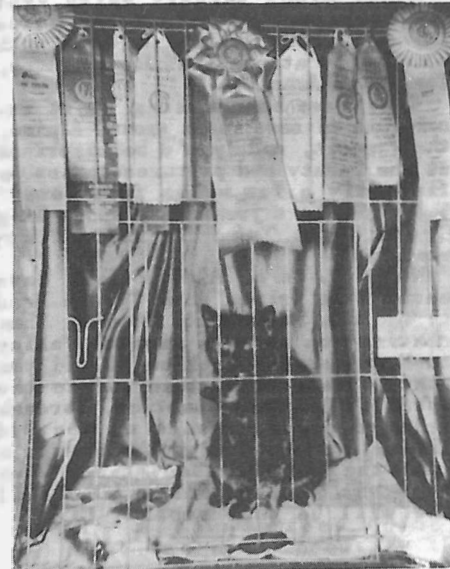

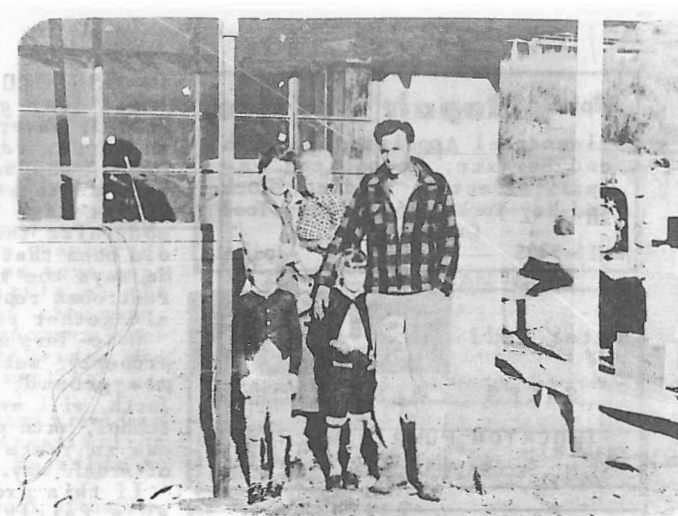

TO USE OLD SCHOOL ROOMS

The four good rooms of the old school, Tavern Road, are to be put in shape, reports Supt. Frank S. Brown, who says "Since the people want us to keep the old school we will retain the four good rooms, modernize them, sell or wreck the old ones that have been condemned". He says the roofs will be renewed, restrooms repaired and improved and altogether put in o.k. condition.

Note- This means that the valuable property, well, sanitary equipment, playground, tennis court and so forth, will eventually be the primary school, with possibility of an added one in years to come, at the foot of Arnold way.

If this property were sold now, at a fairly low price, perhaps \$25,000. as some had proposed, the taxpayers would have had to buy more land later for enlargement, or voted costly bonds for added rooms at the new site. In 5 to 8 years this older site will be worth at least \$100,000. we believe. -CI.

Bill Suter, chairman for this area for Civil Defense, has slated a public meeting for 7:30 tonight in the school auditorium.

"This is an open meeting and everyone is urged to come" says Suter, veteran of the navy in WWI. "With the menace of the possibility of an atomic attack in the S.D. area, a no. 1 target if a war should come, he points out, Alpine should know a little about what it would have to expect and do".

NEW POOL FINISHED TOMORROW

Carl Schweiss was elected president until the permanent organization is accomplished, with Reynolds as secretary.

Main topic was the school situation consensus seeming to favor retention of the old school, with improvement.

The next meeting is slated for Tuesday April 12, at 8 p.m. in Fuller Hall when further organization will be made. The object is for a clear inghouse of ideas affecting the entire community, so every one may express the opinion of his membership in the council.

"This will save the chamber from having to come out either for or against any problem; it will put it up directly to the people", states President Lethbridge.

Next problem to be approached is Alpine's imperative zoning and future planning.

Don Walker, president, turned the evening over to Chairman Marcus Schaeffer who introduced George Clark, of Valley Stationers, E.C., and 1955 president of the Mother Goose Parade, who gave an enlightening talk on the highway, safety and growth.

He pointed to El Cajon five years ago, pictured Alpine as in that stage, believes that five years hence the place will have grown tremendously and Highway 80 has much to do with that in bringing residents and business.

"All economy is moving east on this ribbon called 80" he said, "and for defense, 80 is most important, being the only outlet from a target area, which San Diego is. No, you can't stop expansion, and this area is moving ahead fast now."

Walker then told of progress on finishing 80, freeways to El Centro and other major improvements that would affect Alpine.

John A. Davis, president, La Mesa-El Cajon Savings and Loan, and Don Bates, Alpine realtor, were named directors. The latter as chairman, with Clarke Irvine and Mrs. Marion Norcross, were named as a committee to endeavor to get a Tavern Road sign placed below that entry on 80.

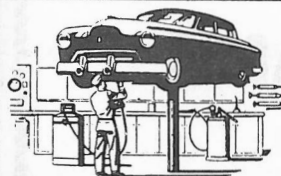
