80 NOT TO BYPASS ALPINE

Recently at several local meetings it was reported that state highway officials had surveys for Highway 80 to be rerouted south of town.

The Sun decided to get at the truth and tell Alpine about it. So on the phone F.E. Wallace, engineer at S.D. for the state, scotched this rumor. "However, in a 1946 report on this area," he states, "such a route was reviewed but no survey was made. The plan was to roughly follow old 80 from where it leaves new 80 (Harbison Canyon Road) and pass south of town, rejoining 80 at Honey Hill. This was in order to make possible a 4% grade."

Thus there is no immediate prospect of 80 leaving the town. Such a route would do away with the big grade below here.

Note- We thought that the county might have delayed the urgent widening and straightening of Tavern from 80 to So. Grade Road, so as to fit in with such a proposed change of 80. This stretch has been promised for some time, and we hope that time is very soon. -CI.
