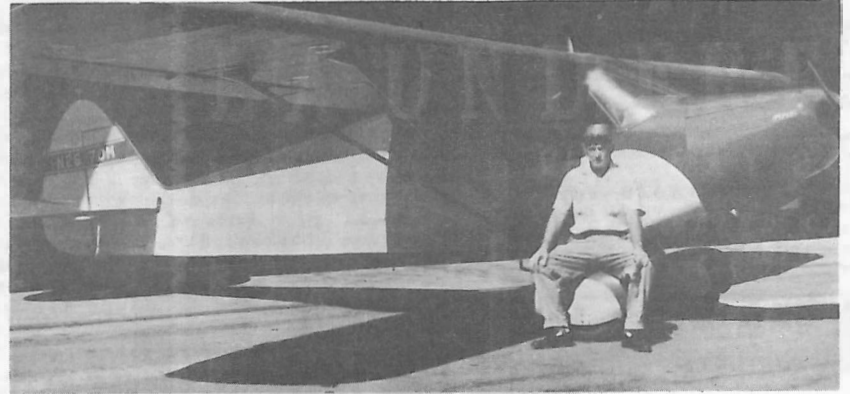

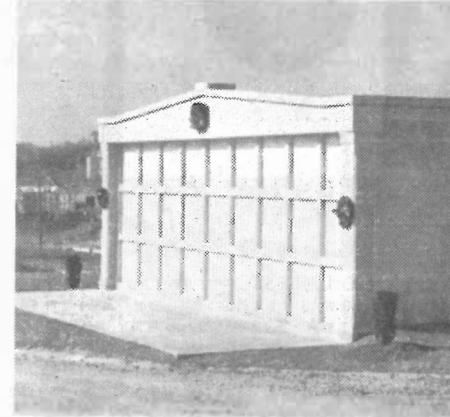

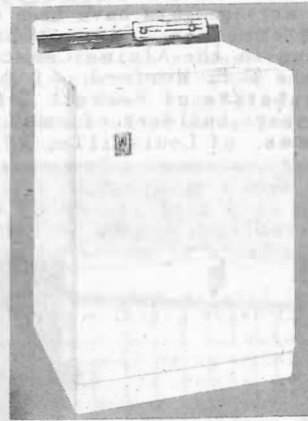

BIG RANCH GOES TO WILSON
For \$55,000, cash the 200-acre ranch the Highlands, owned by Gordon Wilson and Brothers Cecil and Ed Lewinson, was auctioned by the sheriff to Wilson and Frank W. O'Neill, La Jolla. Some 30 others were on hand, but none made bids. Sheriffs J.W. Work and W.B. Povey conducted the auction to settle the suit of partition. Chas. E. Burch, jr., represented the buyers. First bid, \$30,000, was made in the name of Harbor Finance, by Ben Pollock, upped by the buyers to \$31,000. Seven bids finished it, the last two being 54 and 55 thousand.

Personal property, a tractor, went to C. Lewinson at \$600. With his wife and his sister, Marie, the Lewinsons have been living in the ranch house, caring for the property, will soon move to other quarters in Alpine.

New owners could not say definitely what their plans are but it is believed that the beautiful property will be developed, possibly subdivided.

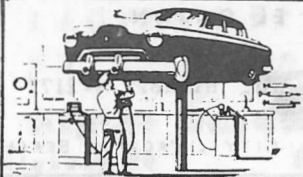

EARLY PIG GAINS PROFITABLE

Although there are not too many ruralites in Alpine raising hogs, a number do maintain pens, not only for their own use, but for market.

'For those who do', says Hunk Anderson, Glenview Feed Co., 'research has shown that a pig's weaning weight has a definite relationship to the time it takes to get him to market as a 200-225 pounder'.

It appears that every 10 pounds of extra pig weight at weaning time chops off about 15 days of the time required to get the hog to market. Good nutrition for baby pigs is the important factor in this, hence research is making it possible for raisers to cash in on heavy weaning weights, he adds.

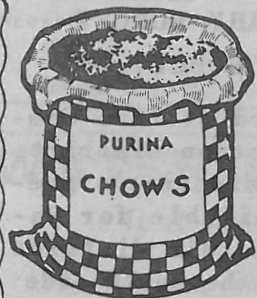

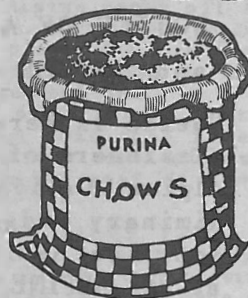

constructed as to enable interment above earth, water and the elements, protected by stone, steel and concrete. This has long been the method of burial among the nobility, families of wealth, and for national heroes as Washington, Lincoln and many others. It has been in use for thousands of years, even before the pyramids, which were tombs for the pharaohs.

Until recently this type of entombment has been prohibitive in cost so that it was beyond the reach of the average man or woman, but now, operated on a community basis where many desire space, it actually costs less than ground burial. The proposed one for Alpine will lend beauty to the hilltop cemetery as well as give protection to those who are entombed, thus leaving peace in the hearts of those who have placed them there.

ibility (Ed. Code Sec. 18223 to 36)
forced the move after Supt. Frank S.
Brown presented letters of condem-
nation from the state's departments
of architecture, public works and
fire marshall indicating that the
old wooden edifices at the Tavern
Road site were not quakeproof and
were substandard both from structural
and fire hazard standpoints.

According to G.L. Klipp, Board
president, plans will be formulated
to take care of children during the
remainder of the year by rescheduling
classes. During the past few years
pros and cons have been presented
for abandoning this site, but the
board, according to Klipp and Myron
Cady, member, believe that the
community has expressed its wish to

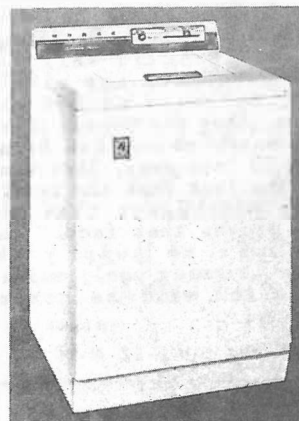
