SCHOOL BOARD GIVES 9 POINTS IN FAVOR OF TAX RAISE

FIRST FIRE WAS A DANDY

Editorial**Swaddling Clothes Dangerous***Washington*—In a recent report the Red Cross reveals that more infants have died of

suffocation while supposedly safe at home in their cribs, a 15% increase. More died this way than the total number killed by infantile paralysis. Simple falls caused half of all home deaths, with rugs, high heels and waxed floors mostly to blame. It is believed by health teachers that women bundle their infants in too heavy and too many swaddling clothes to the exclusion of healthful air which not only lungs; but skin need every second.

Note: The more sunshine and outdoor air a baby has the tougher will its resistance be. It will build sunshine vitamins right in its own bloodstream and all organs of elimination will not have to take on the duties of lungs and skin. Little ones should be allowed to run around in their birthday suits, or at least in skimpies.—C.I.

DRIVERS WARNED FOR SUMMER

Parents as well as motorists have been alerted by the S.D.C. Traffic Safety Council to be urgently careful during vacation as already this month two children have died in traffic.

Ronald T. Strong, president, points out that 'thousands of youth will be out of school and playing near their homes and playgrounds'. He also mentions special driving care on highways en route to vacation spots. In June, July and August, 1954, 48 lost their lives in such accident in the county, he says.

the measure with some reservations-- as fully explained in the last issue, the town seems to be split on the proposition.

Here are the 9 points the board has made public;

1. Need for more teachers to insure reasonably sized classes.
2. In order to maintain good instruction.

3. In order to make necessary repairs on old buildings.

4. The tax rate will drop to 90¢ per \$100. of assessed valuation which would endanger the entire school program.

5. To provide for growth; at least two new teachers will be needed next year.

6. All money left over each year may be used to- 1. cut down the tax rate the following year or- 2. be transferred to a building fund.

7. This requested tax rate is permissive. It does not necessarily mean that \$1.48 rate will be used. Only that portion that is absolutely necessary.

8. We have practically no reserves and we should have sound reserves.

9. To provide funds for summer school.

Every taxpayer is urged to attend school board meetings which are on the first Thursday of each month, at the Alpine school:
