



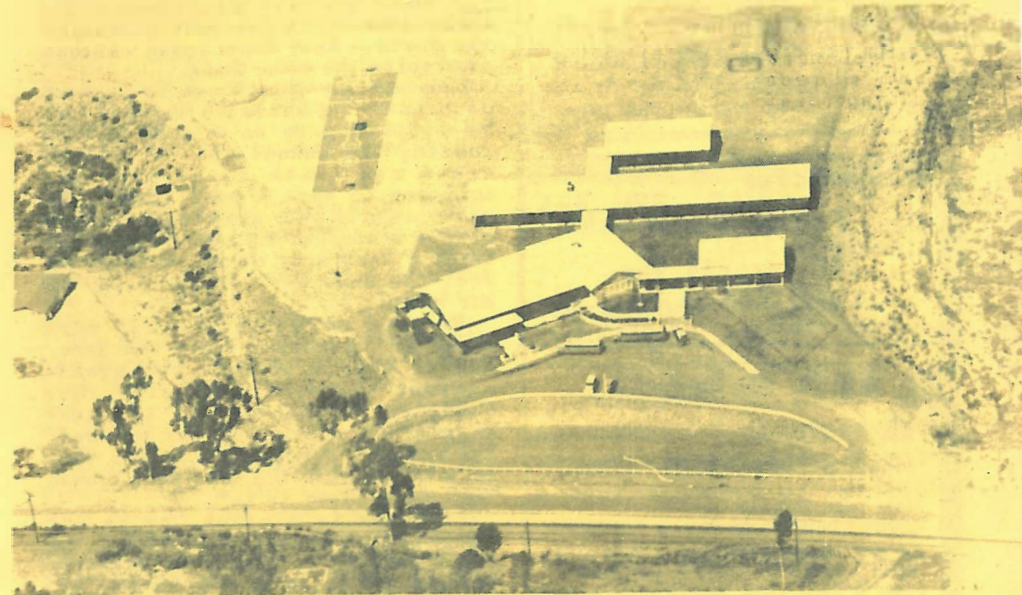

Still others have no use for Mrs. S-and-So. There are some that don't like me. And there are some that don't like Frank S. Brown, our school superintendent.

AIR STRIP NEEDED HERE

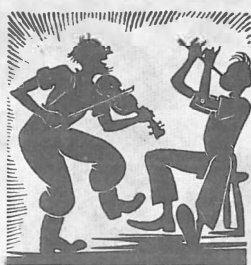

TAX WILL PENALIZE COUNTY

When the cities put on a one cent addition to the 3% state sales tax people living in the unincorporated areas like Alpine, still were able to buy in those cities, but if delivered outside, paid only the state's 3¢ toll.

But now, Sheridan Hegland, of the legislature, says outside areas will be penalized as the bill was pushed through by the League of Cities but not without some effective opposition from the Farm Bureau group. He points out that the city forces want it for a club over unincorporated districts to encourage annexation or themselves incorporate. However, this 4% tax does not become effective until and unless it is approved by the supervisors. Therefore, it is up to the people to write or call their supervisor and let him know your mind.

Note- We believe that the rural or suburban areas should have something left of American freedom!

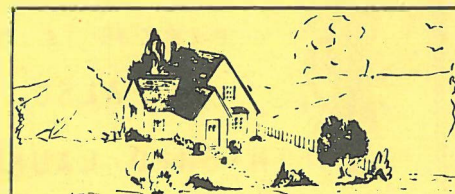
