FIRE TAKES HISTORIC TAVERN

A fast, hot fire at 5:15 a.m. Saturday completely destroyed the famous old Alpine Tavern landmark which has stood since 1890 at the corner of Tavern Road and Arnold Way which was old Highway 80 where the stages stopped for noon dinner.

It was built by Benjamin R. Arnold, the real founder of the town.

Les Ramsay, who with Wm. S. Lethbridge, and their wives, operated the place as a dining room from Christmas 1953 to April this year, were presently engaged in manufacture and sale of Vietas

BETTER PHONE SERVICE DUE

At an enthused meeting of the Alpine Chamber of Commerce with the businessmen's club last week, Wm. H. Rank, branch manager at E.C. for the Telephone Co., explained the details of the proposed new plan and base rate schedule for Alpine area.

It is somewhat complicated, but briefly means that users of phones here will, if the plan is okayed by the state utilities commission, pay only the distance rate to Alpine exchange instead of to E.C. as at present. In short, the subscriber with a private line will pay less than \$20. instead of over \$30. and those on 1 and 2 party lines will be charged accordingly less.

The area affected will be about 3/4 mile wide by 1 1/2 miles long. By the same token, those outside the base area in Alpine, will pay only to the Alpine exchange, instead of to E.C.

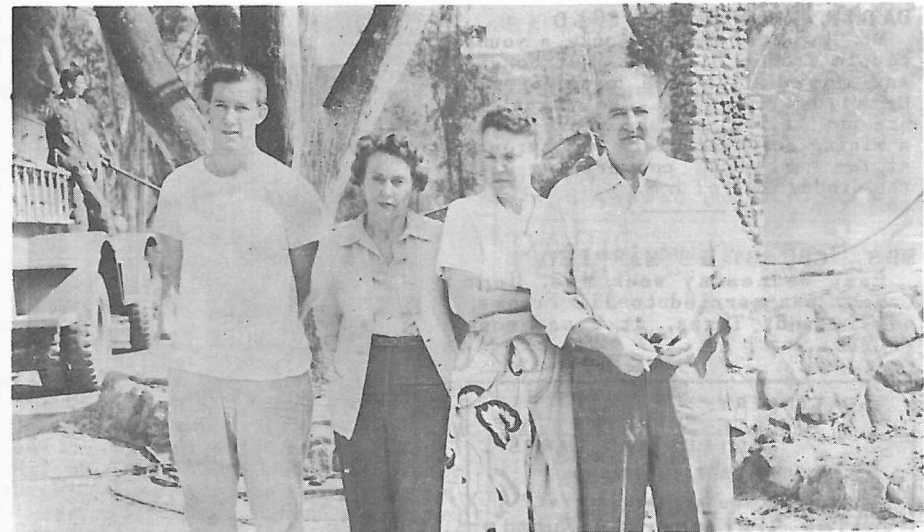

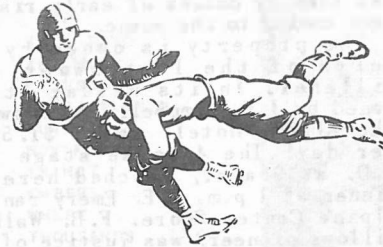

originals, handcrafted enamel on copper and gemstone jewelry. The Ramsays occupied the second floor of the 3-story structure, escaped only with their lives, fleeing the blazing building in their night clothes. The Lethbridges occupied one of the cottages, but lost their furniture and many other valuables including a gold boudoir set valued at \$2500. that had belonged to his mother.

Lethbridge was in Arizona on a sales trip, was contacted in Phoenix from where he made a fast return. They at once planned to use another building and so were back in business on Monday morning. They lost all materials and several thousand dollars in finished jewelry including many big Christmas orders for shops throughout the west. The business has been in operation since late last year.

The Alpine Fire Dept. (volunteers), did a wonderful job in getting to the scene and in saving other

structures. The old Tavern, of frame construction was tinder dry, burned spectacularly for two hours, was seen by dozens of early risers, many coming to the scene.

The property is owned by the heirs of the last owner, G.P. Millener. In its heyday it was owned by J.R. Campbell and known as the Alpine Hotel, rates: \$1.50 per day! The 4-horse stage left S.D. at 9 a.m., reached here for dinner at 1 p.m. C.E. Emery ran the Alpine Center Store. F.B. Walker, Willows pioneer, was justice of the peace while his wife ran 'Alpine Berry Fields' with an adobe house and tents, rates for board and room being \$7. weekly, tend and bed, with board \$5.

The horsedrawn stages went on the Cuyamacas, Julian, Stonewall Pine Valley and Morena Dam. A number of people living in the back country tell me they rode those stages, remember how popular the old hotel was, and how many hundreds came here from all over the nation for relief from asthma. another stopping place was Villa Viejas, run by S.H. Mauzy.

Today, the hoary old tavern with its musty lobby and many priceless relics, pictures, artifacts and the ancient scribbled register that held names of the great and the humble, is a pile of still smoldering ashes, but the soul of the place, the spirit of the early days, lingers and will haunt the spot for years to come.

Partial insurance covered the building, and jewelry business, and it is not known whether the owners will rebuild, but the modern art work still goes on and will prosper. Winona Copper artist and Jack Boyd, silversmith, are busy getting their work under way while Lethbridge and Ramsay work feverishly buying machines, copper, silver enamel and the many items for their zooming business.

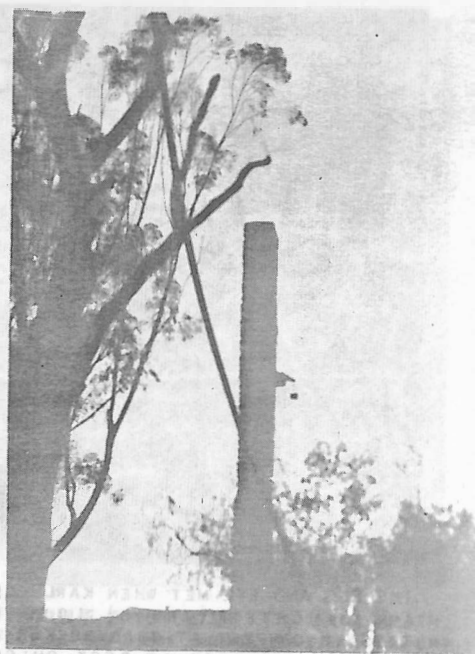
