Editorial**WHY BLAME THE CHILDREN?**

With each new year, over a million American families will be torn apart by divorce, desertion or death. This appalling figure leaves a wicked path, paving the way for juvenile delinquency.

The story of these broken homes is often tragic, for important intimate human relationships are shattered and millions are deprived of a normal, happy family life. If we are to help marriages succeed, we must find out why so many are failing, why homes are being broken, and what can be done about it.

When a child's security is taken away by one of many reasons, usually he is emotionally unstable from the conditions existing before the final break comes. Therefore the foundation for delinquency has been built on firm ground and the rest is easy when he is cast out in the world, unwanted and fearful of the surroundings he finds himself in.

Studies which have been made by sociologists show that no matter what the legal grounds, divorce is usually the result of certain tensions that cause the breakdown of the marriage. These tensions may be traced to differences in cultural background, in ways of living and personal habits, and in attitudes, values and ideals. Back of every divorce lies some maladjustment or conflict.

Many unions end in the courts because the husband and wife were *mismatched*. The marriage did not have much chance at the outset. If we could predict in advance whether a particular marriage would fail or succeed, we could avoid a good many divorces.

A woman wrote her doctor 'Come in and see my husband soon. It's his head. He has had it off and on for two days. Just now he is holding it in his hands between his knees!'

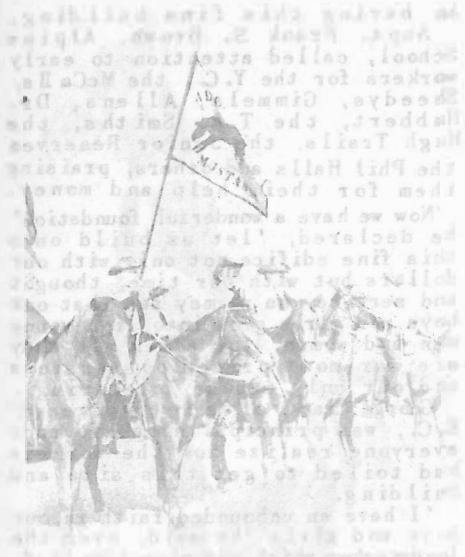

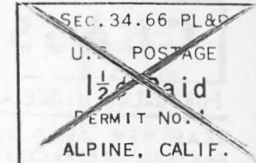
