Two fine organizations are sponsoring this latest project at the Y.C., the Kiwanis and the Gamma Gamma sorority.

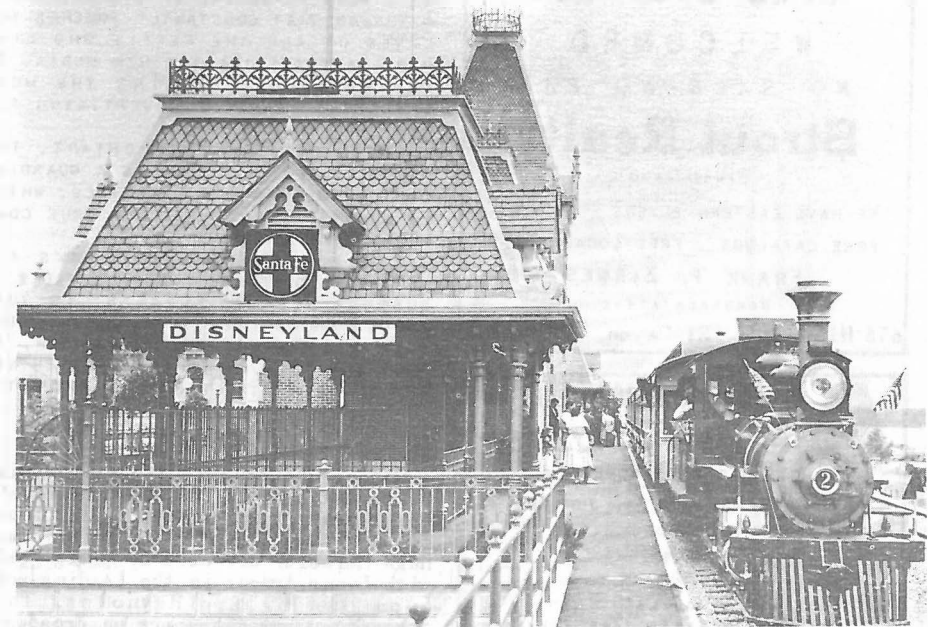

ARCHER TO MOVE CHICK RANCH

Within 2 to 3 years the Bud Archer poultry ranch and bowl on Victoria Dr., will be moved to 40 or more acres which Archer has just purchased from L. Landt above Willows Road, he revealed to the Sun.

It will cost over \$12,000, as all buildings and equipment will have to be moved and remodelled. Archer has an investment of \$140,000. and 11,000 birds. He came here in 1945 just after power was brought to upper Victoria, and had no near neighbors. In the 11 years that elapsed, the neighborhood has built up. While he keeps the place as sanitary as possible, he declares, he has met all health rules and has striven to keep the place in order.

Note- It has happened in many places that a rancher goes outside the built up area, buys cheaper land, builds his business, then as the area expands and people build, they start complaining about the situation. It is merely the cost of progress, that the original rancher is thus forced to find a new site farther from the built up sections. We should not blame him for this march of progress! - CI

COOKIE GIRLS ENTHUSED

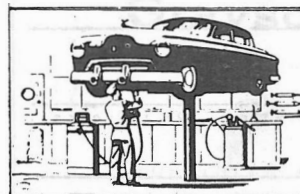
The 1956 Girl Scout cookie sale starts tomorrow at 9 a.m. and all

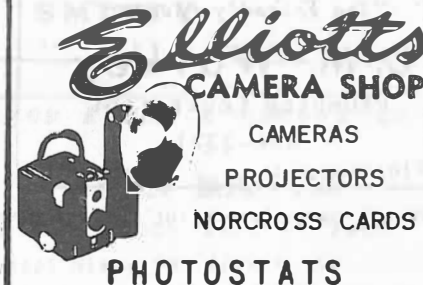

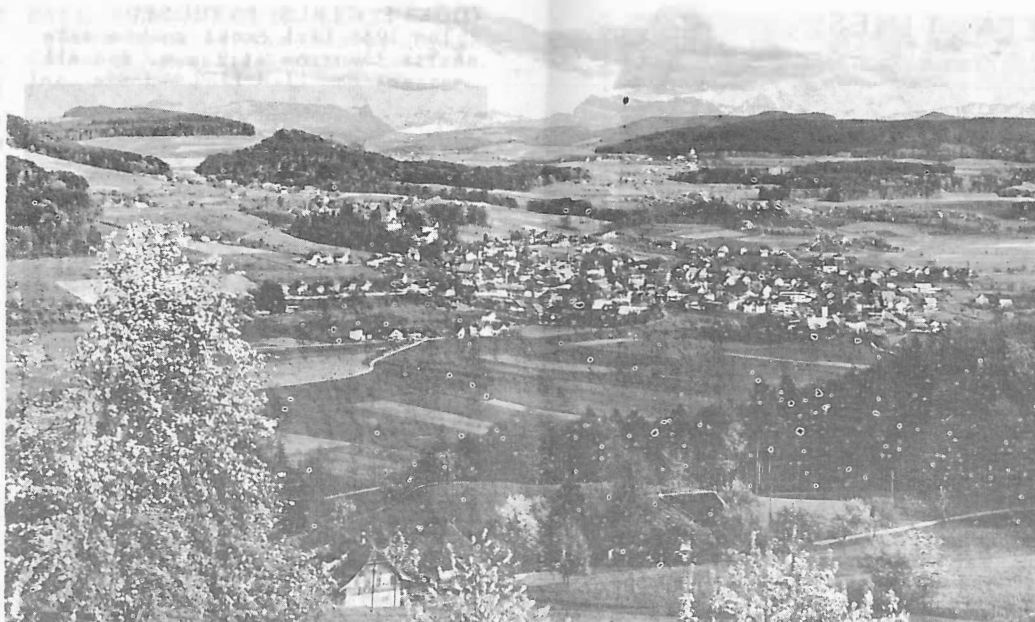
