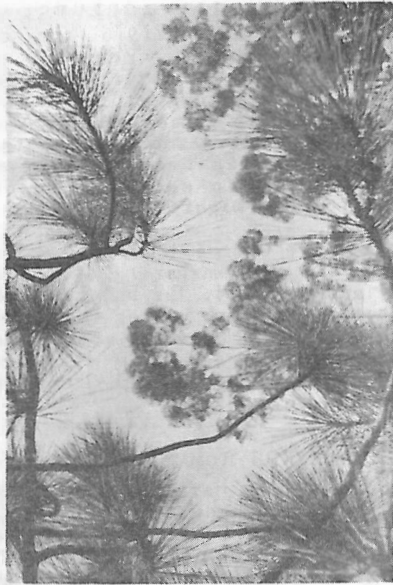

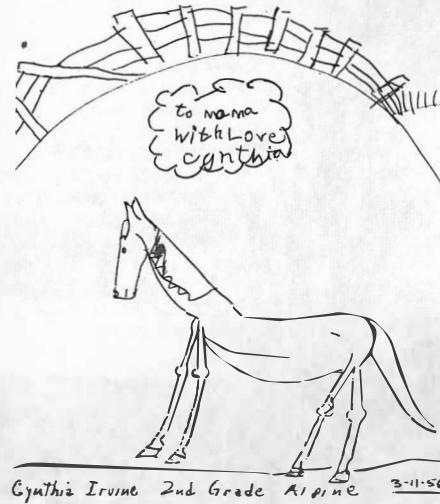

PUPILS HERE RATE HIGHEST
Pupils of Alpine school, on the average, are achieving between one and two months above the national norms in basic school subjects. Standardized achievement tests were given this year in grades 4 through 8 in reading, arithmetic, grammar and spelling. According to Frank S. Brown, District Superintendent, an analysis of the results from these tests shows that 4 and 7 graders scored four months above the national norms and the 5 and 6 graders one month above. At the time the tests were given, only the 8 graders fell below the norms.

For the past several weeks teachers have been locating the areas in which their pupils are weak and will give these areas special emphasis during the remainder of the school year. The tests were given and the results analyzed by Dr. Adrian Gentry, curriculum coordinator.

We recently heard about the young husband who sent his wife back home because she talked in her sleep — but not clearly. So he sent her home to mutter.

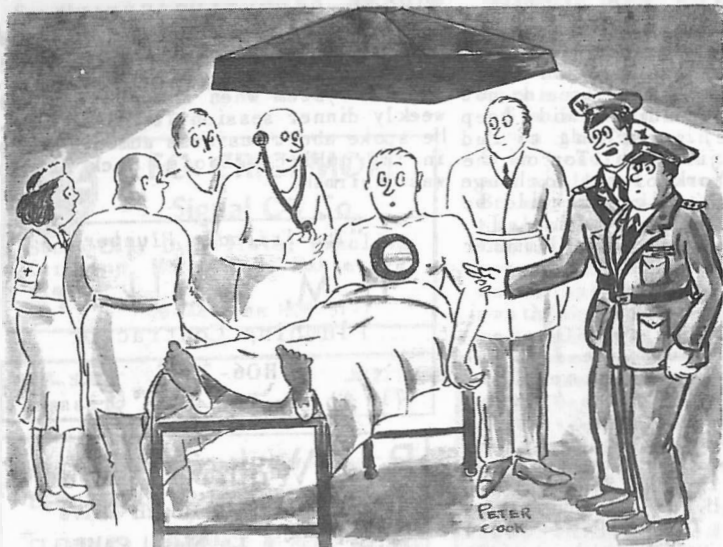

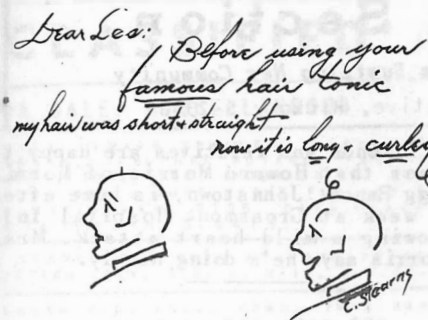


