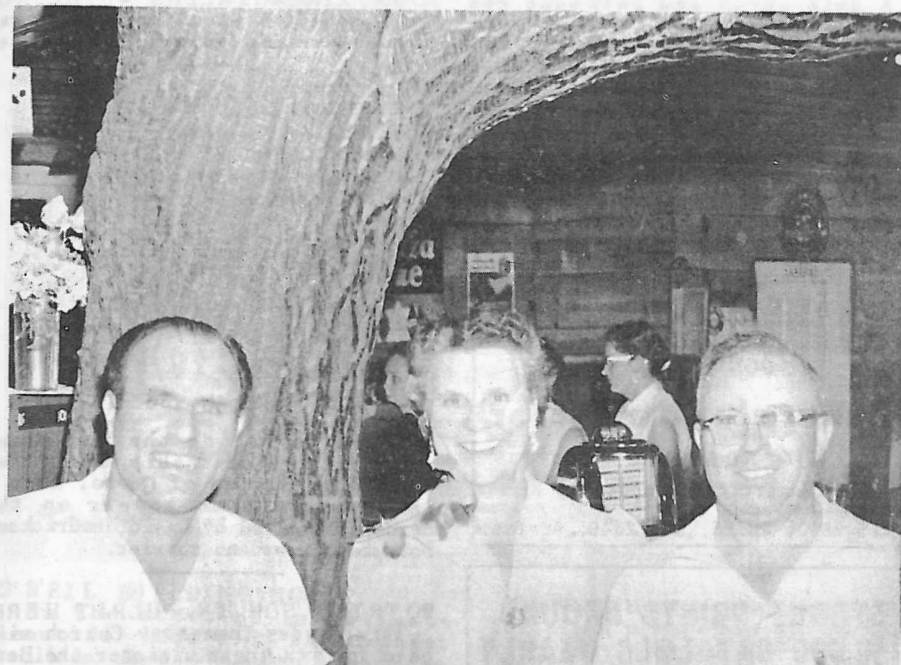

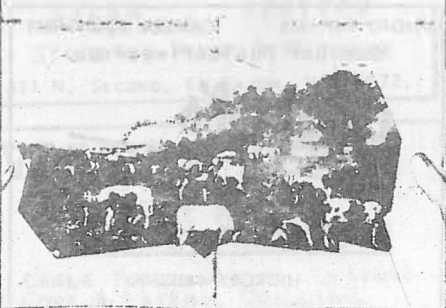

WOTRING SON IN PULPIT HERE

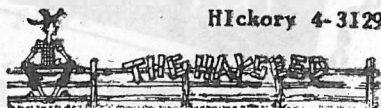

TRAILER COURT REOPENING

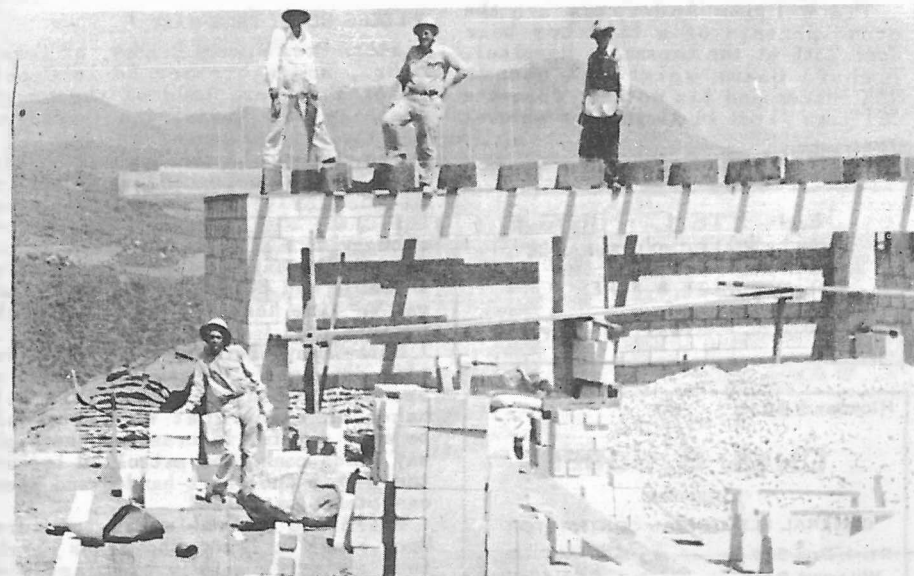

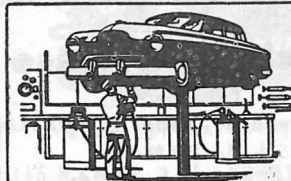

LUTZ FINISHES GRADING

Ready for paving, curbs and construction is 300' on Hiway 80 below the Y.C., where Harold Lutz is to operate a complete motor service. This is part of his 28 acres which front 750' on Hiway 80.

The service station will have two 35' driveways, blacktopped. Paving will be put in for the 20' from the present highway to his line which is 50' from the middle of 80. Grading will cost upwards of \$500. being done by Behan Welding, of E.C. This is to allow for ultimate widening of 80.

Two concrete bloc manholes 25' deep have been finished which will drain his property into a culvert under 80. This cost \$150. and were required before the highway officials would permit grading and filling. 'They have been very cooperative' says Lutz, 'and we had to put up a bond for a year, and must finish this work within four months.' This project is the largest commercial one to be erected here since Al Hinkle built his lumber yard, showrooms and office.
