CREEPING PARALYSIS TAXES

Last week S.D. supervisors voted 4-1 for the 1% countywide sales tax. It will be collected by the state, redistributed to cities and county. It starts Oct. 1. Cities have been getting the added 1¢ for some time while unincorporated areas paid 3¢. Thus county revenue will jump \$750,000. a year.

Supervisor Howell, Escondido, voted against it, saying it is unjust and inequitable. We believe that the sales tax, which keeps thousands employed and gives added work and trouble to every little businessman, is a vicious form of taxation. It is a gouge, especially on small purchases. You pay much more than 3 or 4% on small deals.

Most fountains and some restaurants give each patron a check, no matter who makes the purchase. Suppose you take two into a drugstore for a 15¢ drink, Each tab carries 1¢ tax, yet the sale is made to you, the one that makes the purchase. Thus on 45¢ you pay 3¢ tax and the store turns in only 2¢.

The overall picture on taxes is getting more distressing each year. We have more to pay, yet most do not earn more, and the cost of eating has crept skyward steadily.

County areas used to advertise climate, lower taxes and other inducements, but today that is all passing with more smog and taxes.-CI



On the critical list at Grossmont Hospital is Jimmy Presley, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jess Presley, Japatul Road, who accidentally shot himself in the abdomen with a 32 pistol Friday morning while watching TV at their home.

The Presleys were in S.D. on their egg route and could not be reached. The lad had the alertness to phone their next door neighbor Joe Markes who rushed him to Alpine for first aid at Dr. Woodall's, thence to Grossmont at 1 p.m. By 4 p.m. he was under surgery. The parents were finally contacted and have been with the boy most of the time.

Mrs. Presley told the Sun Monday that the gun was the father's, reposed in a top drawer of a chest and the boy had been warned about touching it, as he had his own small calibres which he knew how to handle.

Note- Guns at their best are lethal weapons, designed for killing or wounding some living creature. They are not to be played with. It is hard to tell a youngster to keep hands off of almost anything, leastwise a gun. loaded revolvers are dangerous; but an unloaded one is almost useless.


GRASS FIRE SUNDAY A.M.
