AIRPORT SHOWS PROGRESS

On Page 1 you see the picture of Al Howe's plane on the Viejas Reservation. This may presage an important page in Alpine's history; a step up in its progress and recognition, and the forerunner of more good things to come.

The Indians were interested in the idea, in fact the party show rushed out to see if we needed help. When we took off, they very kindly made road blocks so we could get clear. A landing field there would pep things up and this ideal flat land would be of more use to these folks, to Alpine and the county. And for military use it might prove invaluable.

When S.D. recently suffered eye-smarting and the papers wrote editorials about it, Alpine had a view of the dark cloud that drifted in from the sea, apparently coming down the coast from L.A. to mingle with the S.D. smoke.

Here Viejas Mountain, only a mile from town was hardly visible while El Cajon Mountain, two miles off was hidden. Scientists say that smog is the wrong term, indicating fog as part of the obscuring mass. It is more truly smoke, comes mostly from vehicle traffic.

Those living in Alpine are thankful that this altitude of around 2000 feet is practically smog free--but with the ever-increasing population traffic and industry, some are apprehensive of the future. Towns over 90 miles from L.A. have suffered.

PEARL FOSS DIES AT 76

Services in the Community Church were held Wednesday the 7th for Miss Helen Pearl Foss, 76, native of Alpine, who passed away the previous Sunday following a stroke. Interment was at Alpine Cemetery. She died at the home of her brother, Joe T. and his wife Bertha, who had cared for her. She was born in the same house which her parents Edward A. Foss and wife built in 1874. It was in that dwelling in 1880 that Alpine's first students went to school, including the Foss children. It is on Foss Road off of South Grade Road, near Tule Springs (now dry).

Survivors are four brothers, A. Percy, Harry and Joe T. of Alpine, and Robert, of Escondido. Percy, senior brother, was 82 last Thursday, is better known in Alpine for driving about in his tiny electric car. Harry is manager of the cemetery.

Miss Foss was a charter member of the church, belonged to the Woman's club and was eligible for the DAR.

FIRE STATION IS BOUGHT

The F.M. Bratchers have just sold the present fire station, 2435 Hiway 80, with 100 ft. frontage and a depth of 400 ft. to Harmon C. Smith, of L.M., as an investment. It includes a double garage.

The structure was built eight years ago by Ed Fales for Everett Homes. Bratchers ran a feed store there for a year. Then it became a dance hall, tavern and finally was leased for the fire department, to expire Mar. 23, 1957, when the department will vacate and move to its own new building at the Y.C.

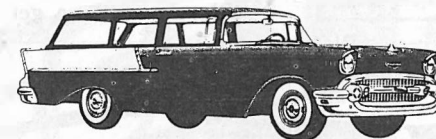

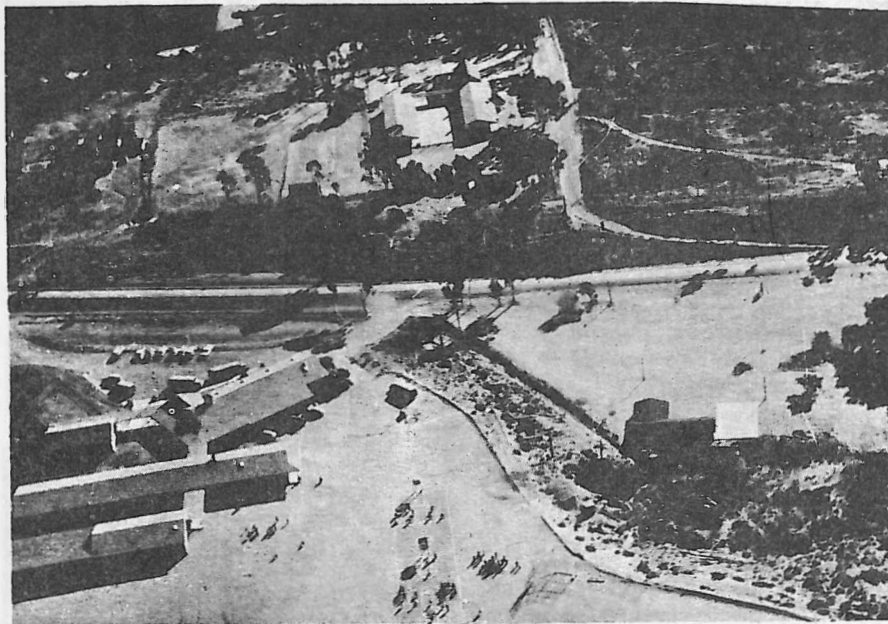

MRS. GAZIC SURPRISED

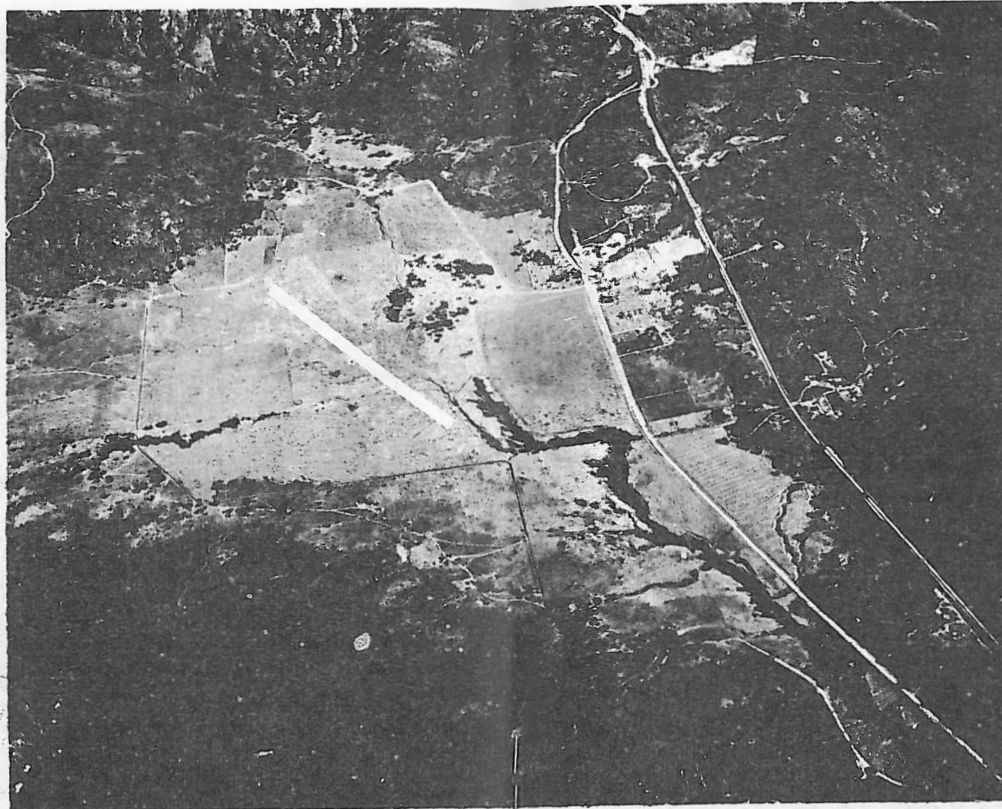

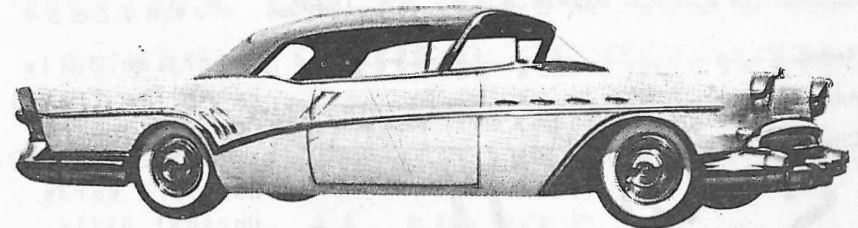

TAVERN ROAD PROJECT COMING

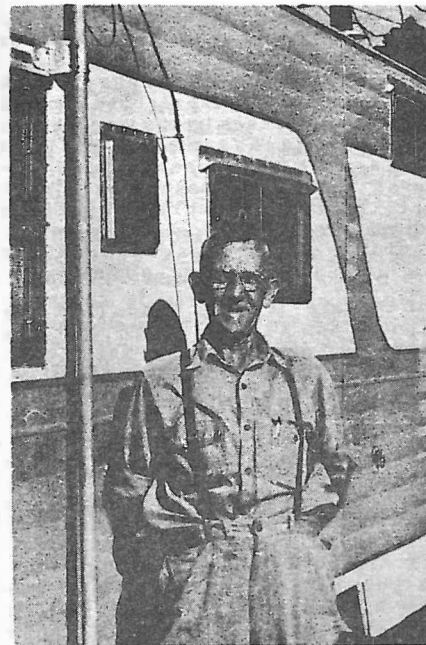
