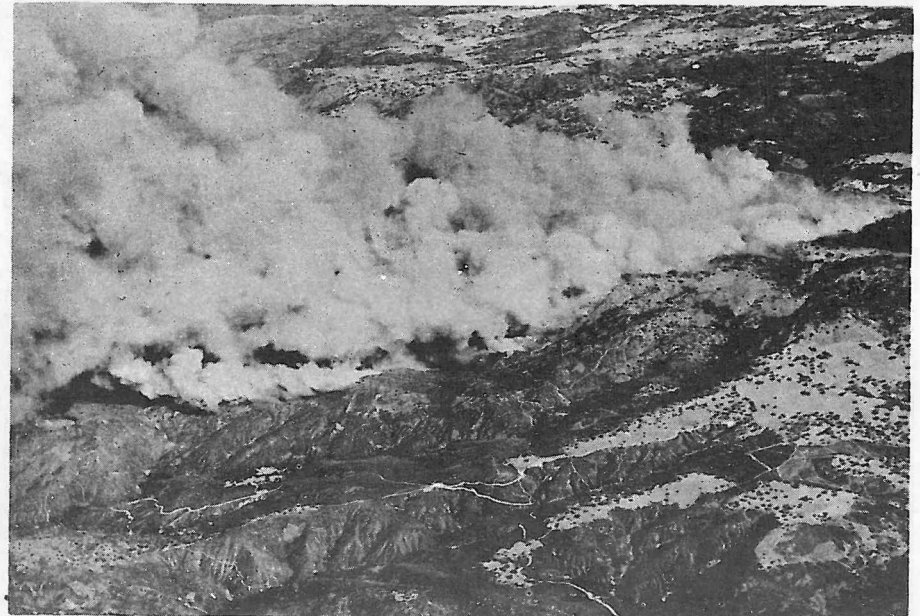
#### McCALLS OPEN RANCH SCHOOL

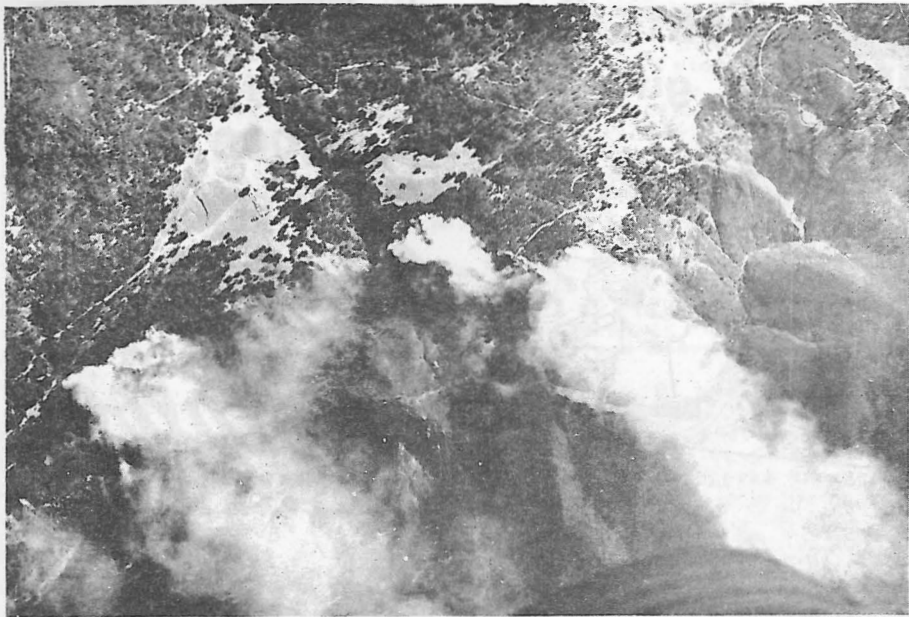

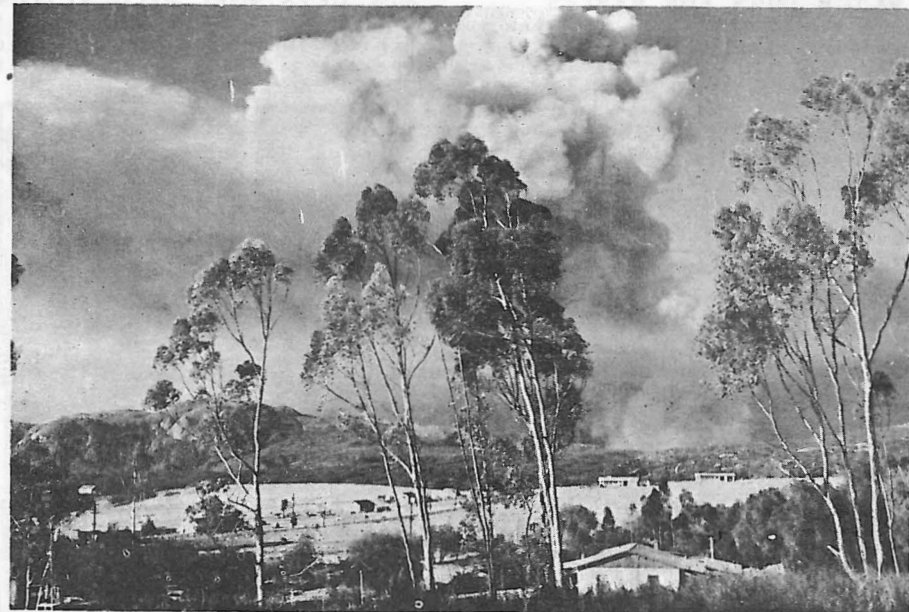

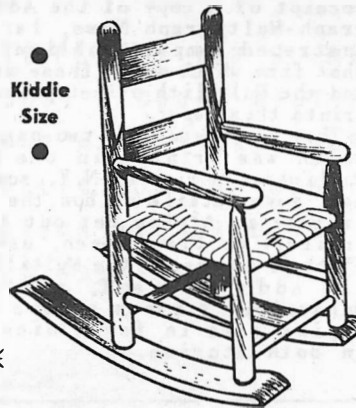

**WORST FOREST FIRE ALL DONE**

All that remains of the fatal Inaja Reservation fire which burned some 50,000 acres in a 90-mile perimeter, killed 11 men, destroyed several homes and ruined a vast watershed, is merely the probe by Forest Service officials. It was the worst fire in 25 years, started by a 15-year old Indian boy 'to see if the grass would burn'.

Funeral services were held for one local fighter, 19-year old 1955 Grossmont graduate, of Harbison Canyon, Carlton Pay Lingo, with the forestry at Descanso. See pictures by Al Howe on other pages.

Watersheds of two reservoirs are to be reseeded at a cost of \$22,500. from state and S.D. coffers, reports Jack Schrade who is working on the project. The U.S. will reseed federal lands. Cost of fighting the blaze was upwards of a quarter million.
