## Editorial...

### WHAT IS THIS AMERICAN WAY?

If the Sun had double its pages and twice its revenue, it still would lack space enough to tell the story of the strange, or is it crazy-- ways of our statesmen! Two readers hand me clippings dated Washington, D.C. for Feb. 16 and 17. One says the nation has a shortage of 159,000 classrooms and an enrollment of nearly 3 million more than present schools can handle. This means double-sessions, as we all well know. That report was from the U.S. Dept. of Health, Education and Welfare.

The other, from the same office, says that Marion B. Folsom, its cabinet head, says Congress has given him more money than he can spend in the field of medical research. Last year he had \$98 1/2 million. Health experts decided it should be upped, so they asked for \$127 millions.

But congress did better! They increased this to \$183 million, nearly twice as much as the year before. Folsom told his news conference he would do his best to spend it!

Next day he released the story on classroom shortage. So far not one legislator has suggested switching some of the \$183 million to build classrooms which, in our humble opinion, would work far more to aid the health and welfare of our younger generation.

These are the things that make us grassroots thinkers wonder just what is happening to our American way of life! -CI

### LUNG CANCER FROM SMOKING

The first public warning of a startling increase in lung cancer was issued by the American Cancer Society in 1951, although many doctors had thought the relation to smoking had something to do with it.

Recently the society reported it about 27 times as frequent among those who use two packages of cigarettes a day as among those who do not smoke. Cancer deaths among men who smoke regularly are eight times as high as among those who never smoked regularly.

Note- If something like smoking is suspected, it seems logical to eliminate it even though it has not been finally and definitely proved. It is known that this cancer among women has increased since females began using cigarettes. Likewise Likewise aluminum utensils are suspected as another cause of cancer, therefore we never use them.
