Editorial...**THREAT OF TOBACCO**

A reader sent me a yellowed clipping from a magazine that quoted the great scientist Luther Burbank many years ago when he was performing miracles in the plant world, giving the people new and better strains of fruits and vegetables.

Burbank was talking about tobacco and its positive injurious effects on the human plant. He wrote 'Always remember that the tendency of tobacco is to destroy. There is no doubt that some men have lived to be very old, notwithstanding the use of tobacco and whiskey. But they are entirely mistaken in believing that it was these that helped them to live long. Here is one proof; Look for all those who were boyhood chums of these aged survivors of tobacco and whiskey, and who, like them, smoked and drank. Where are they? In graveyards. Tobacco and whiskey helped to put the finishing touches upon them.

'Nicotine', he says-- which you know is used to kill many pests-- 'after you have used it awhile, puts you in a condition to be bumped off by the first thing that hits you'.

'What a shock people would get if they went through cemeteries and saw tombstones declaring that this man died of typhoid made fatal by a tobacco-weakened heart'.

More recent tests by Prof. Raymond Pearl of Johns Hopkins University, revealed the startling facts that for three groups of heavy, moderate and non-smokers, up to the age of 50, the death rate for heavy smokers is more than double than for non-users. And the number of non-smoker who survive to their 70th birthday is half again as many as the heavy users. After 70 there is not much difference.

Despite the high-powered and costly campaign by tobacco interests to discount recent findings that smoking can start cancer-- an increasing cause of death-- the fact

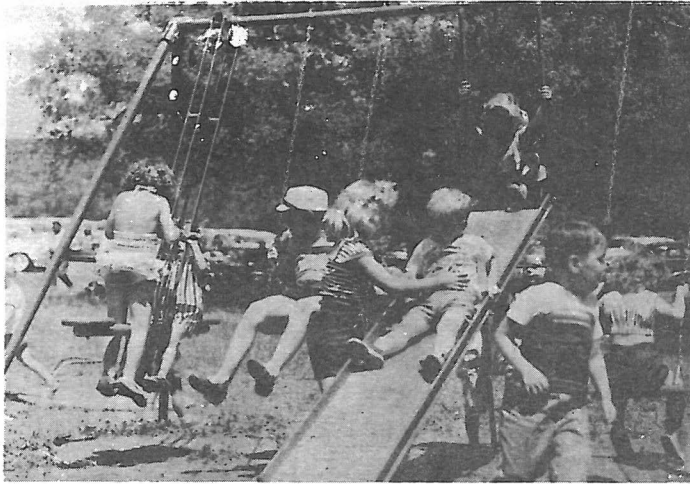

The accident occurred, according to Geo. Turner of the CHP, when a car driven by Katie Willis, S.D., grazed the bridge, swerved into the nuns' car, being driven by Mrs. Pauline Gibson, of Brawley. The Willis machine careened into the parked car of Jas. E. Loos, S.D. He was uninjured.

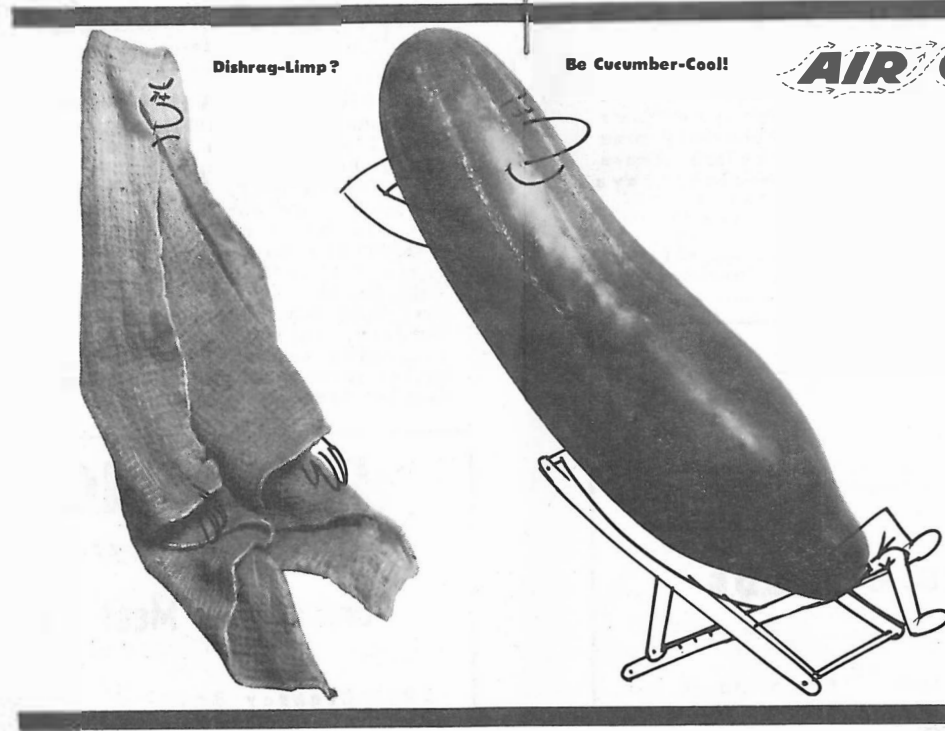

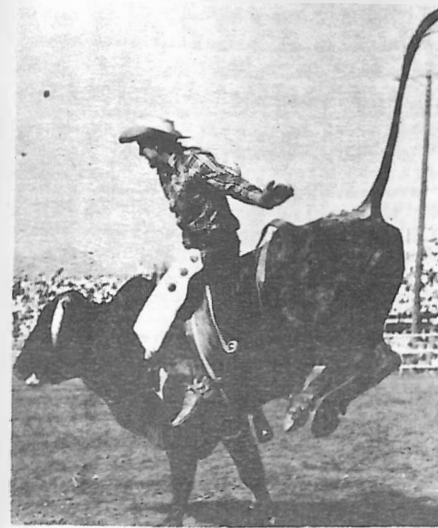

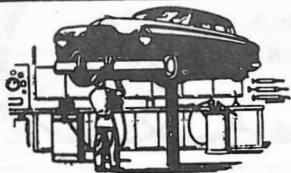
