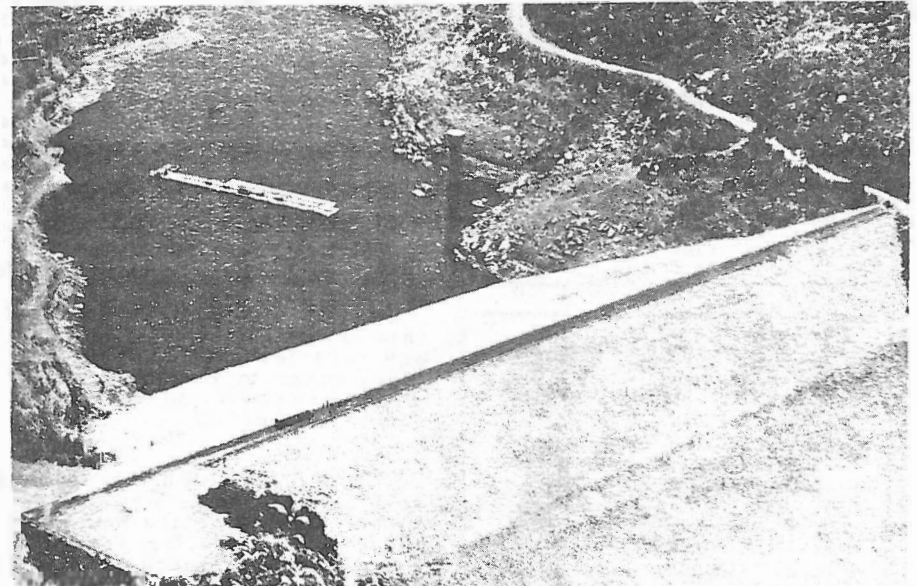
COUNTY WATER CALAMITY DUE!

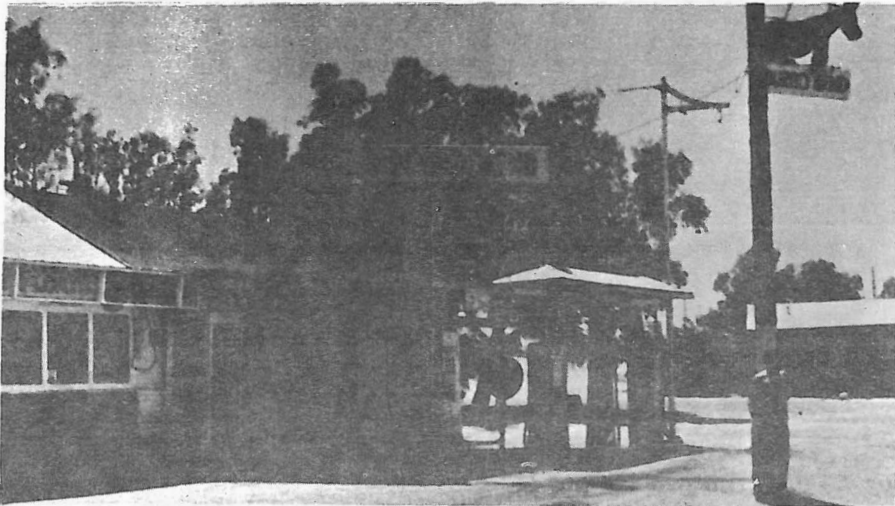

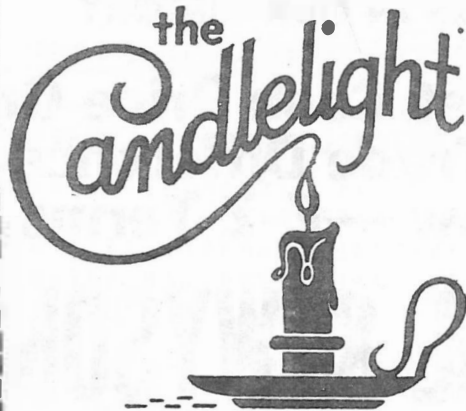

DOUBLE WEDDING ANNIVERSARY

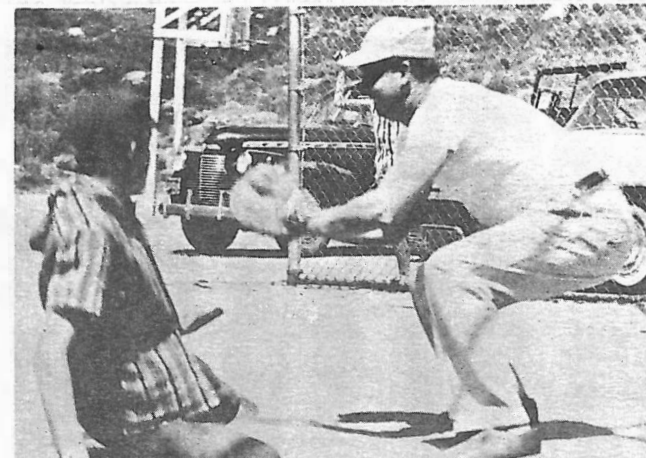

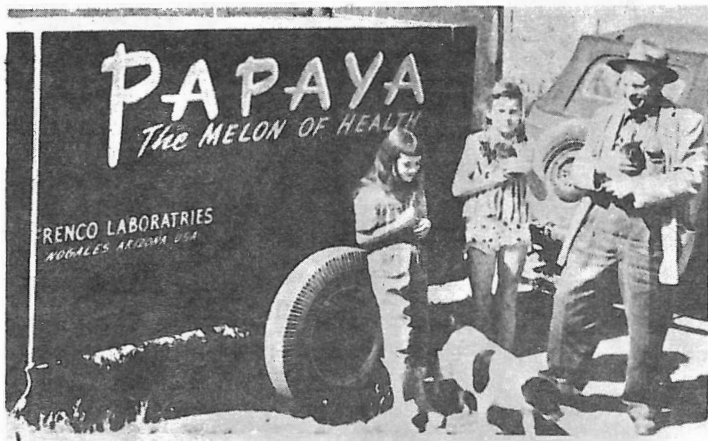

JUDO IS GRACE, NOT CRUELTY

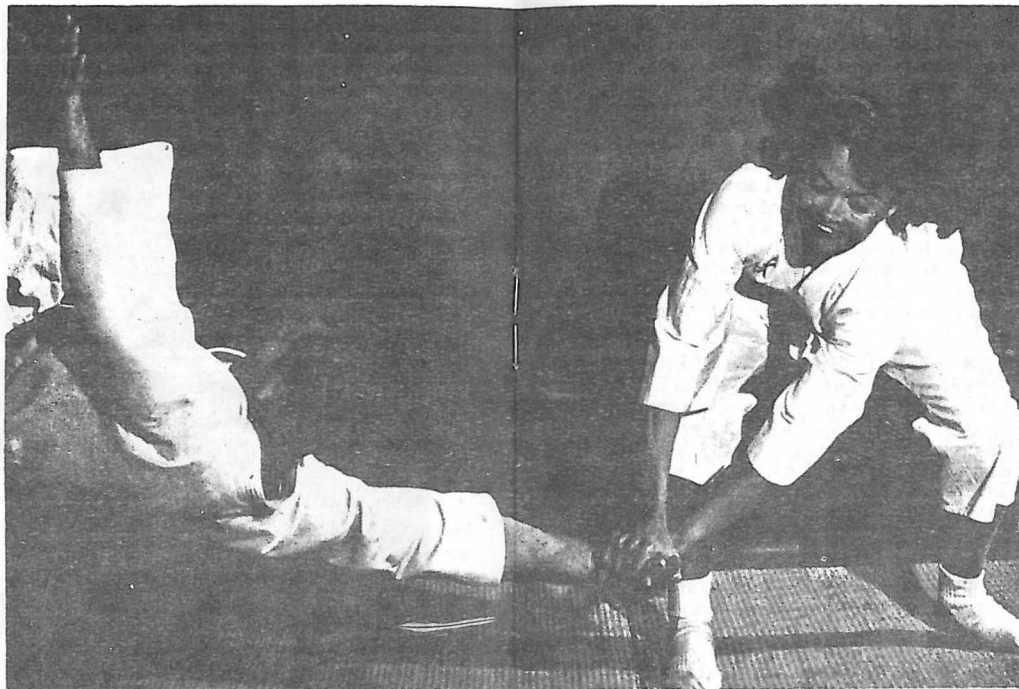

on So. Grade Road in Alpine.

Fred tells me he has had 11,000 hours of flying, many of which were spent in teaching, as he says many older men are now taking up flying. I was surprised to learn that it takes only 8 to 10 hours to solo, with these modern, safe Tri-pacers.

'Government records' Fred says 'show that students 50 to 55 have a safety record five times better than those 20 to 25, showing that safety depends more on common-sense than on youthful reflexes'.

I asked him how about these older men. 'Oh, there are many in their 60's and 70's who fly regularly for

business and relaxation, and at a fairly low cost'.

Our 150-hp Piper, a 4-place job, took us aloft and we headed southwest for the climb of 8000 ft. over the Laganas, to head for Alpine. We enjoyed talking as the motor hums unobtrusively.

I wondered about physical fitness for older pilots. 'Well, that's easy' Fred replied 'only a simple medical is required, and glasses are no deterrent'.

Breise, a native of Hartland, Minn., lives in National City with his wife, two sons, Vance, 19, and Wayne, 6 and Joann, 14. Vance was the youngest flight instructor in the state at 18, has 700 hours, has flown all his life, in fact, the mother went fox hunting by plane with Fred the day before Vance was born! Fred trained army cadets and the woman's auxiliary in Sweetwater, Tex., has been here since 1945, flew since 1929.

I told him how interested I was, had flown a good deal, lately with Al Howe, even had studied aerodynamics, so he said 'Here, take over' pointing to my dual wheel.

For the next 50 miles I had the thrill of a lifetime, piloting that beauty, and before I knew it, I was rounding Viejas at 5000 feet. In a few short minutes we circled Gillespie Field and I 'followed him in' while he barely touched his wheel!

In parting he said 'You'd make a good pilot, you're not excited, you've flown a lot, and you have inherent mechanical ability'.

Well, maybe someday I'll have enough time and spare cash to go for this wonderful flying business!

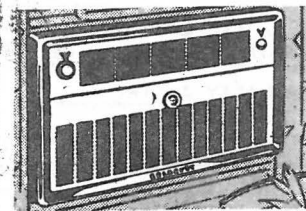
