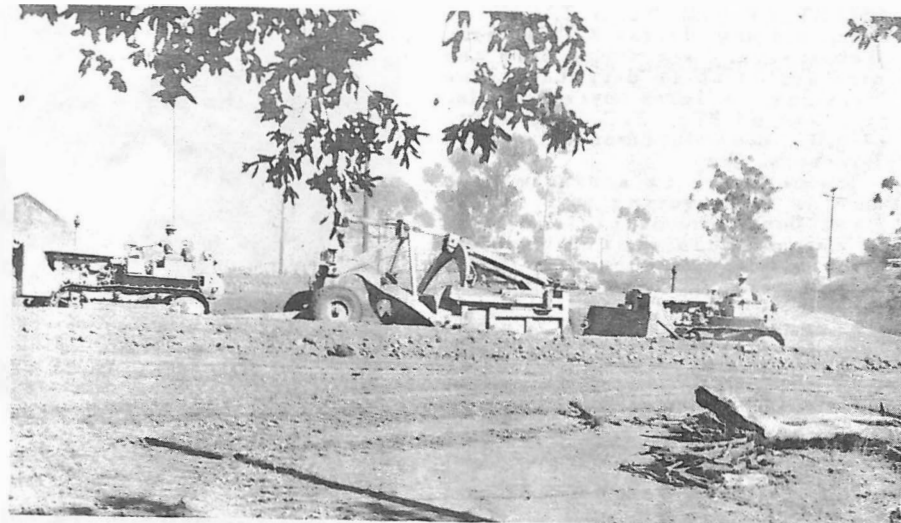
INCREASING DRUNK DRIVING

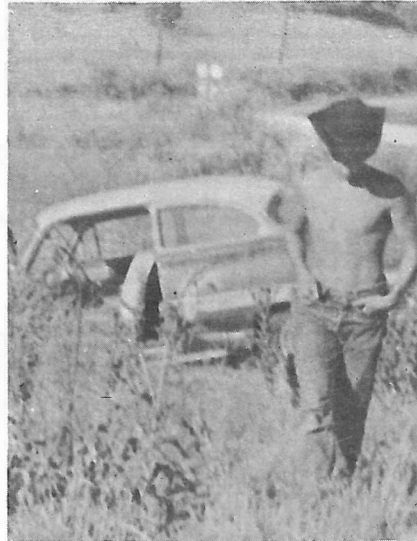
