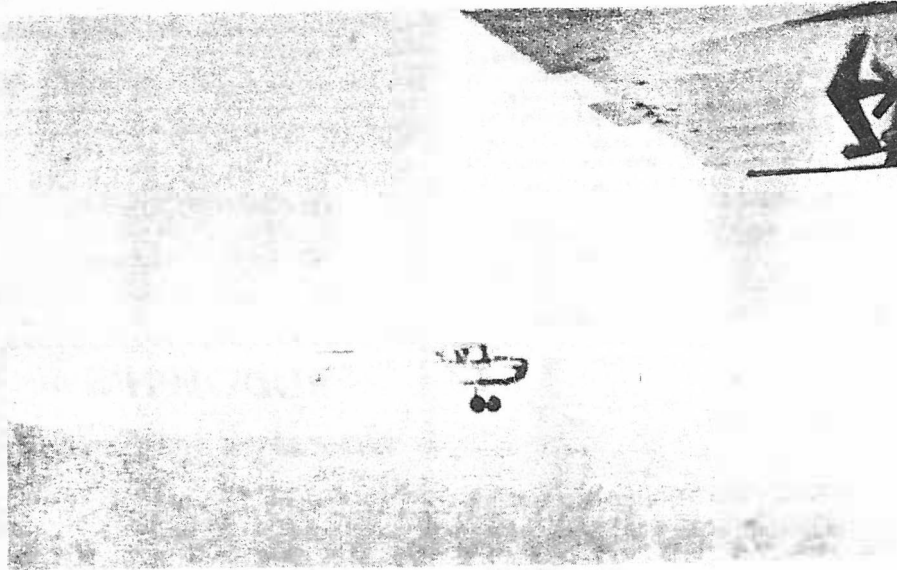

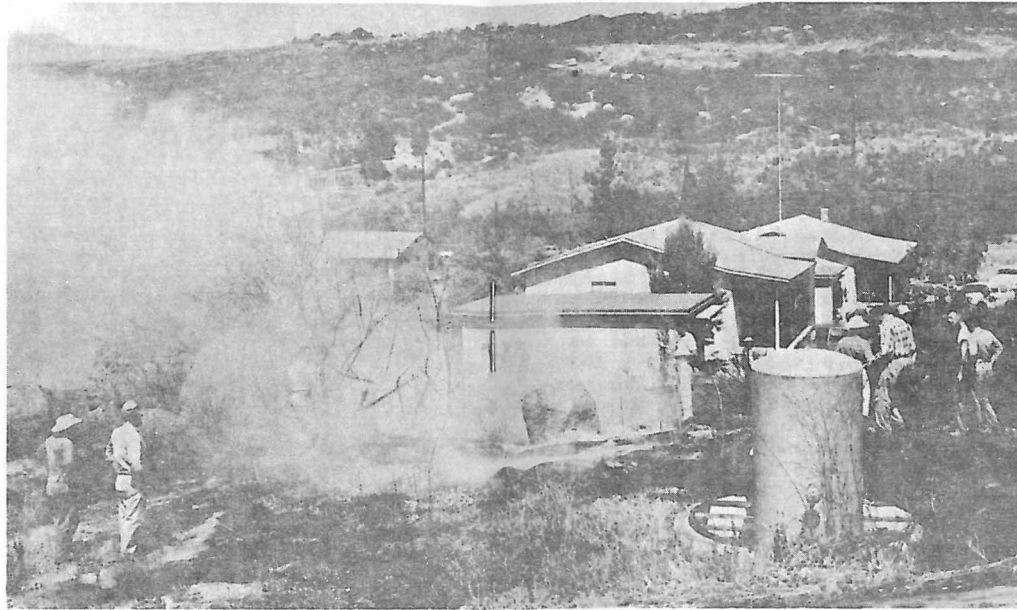
BUZ CROSBY GETS BABY BOY

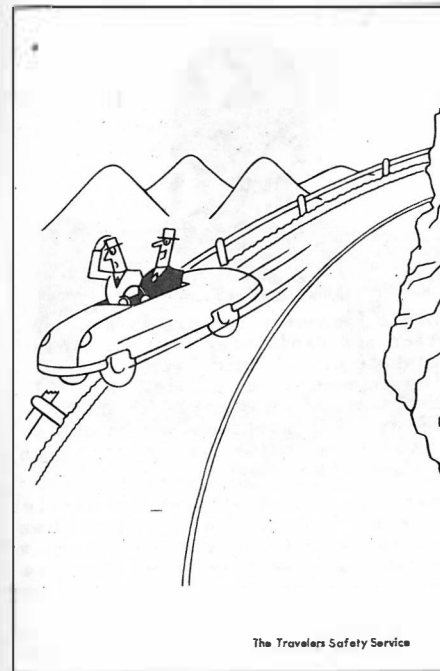

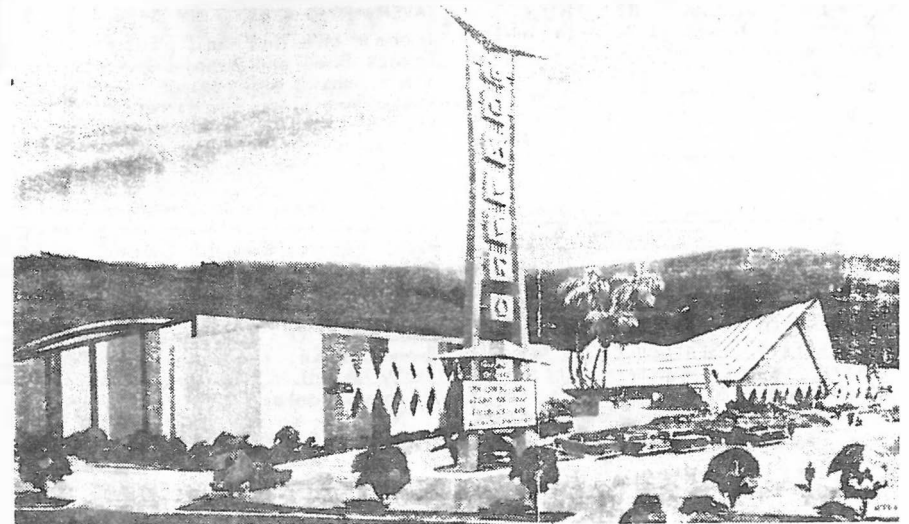
