

GLIDER EXPERT TO SPEAK HERE

James R. Qurgeon will present a thrilling program on 'The Art of Motorless Flight' at the monthly family dinner, Friday, No. 15th, at 6:30 p.m. in Fuller Hall. Movies and slides, in color, will accompany the talk. His 25 years of designing, building and flying gliders have encompassed experiences that only he can tell. When he explains how one can fly a glider, he will be relating facts from 500 hours of personal soaring.

The history of gliding will be covered together with facts regarding records set, such as: 44,000 ft. altitude, 545 miles distance and 56 hours duration.

Future plans of gliding, such as: non-stop cross-country coast to coast flights in less than 6 hours, and altitude attainments of 80.000 ft. will be factually presented.

Spurgeon was Governor of Soaring for the State of California for 4 years, at present he is a member of the Historical Committee of the Institute of Aeronautical Sciences on Gliders of the Smithsonian Institution. His accomplishments are also expressed in the work he does as a design specialist for Convair, in San Diego.
