BANK MERGER COMPLETE

Monday all branches of Security Trust & Savings Bank, including the two branches in Lakeside and F.C., which serve the back country, opened under the new name as a result of its consolidation with Security-First National of L.A. and Citizens National of Riverside.

This is now the nation's fourth largest bank with 200 branches, \$206 million capital and total resources of some \$3 billion plus loans of \$1.1 billion.

Editorial**INEFFICIENT SCHOOL PLAN?**

With Education Week just past and people still talking about the many editorials on the American system of schools and its many inefficiencies, perhaps it might be well to look over the idea.

Alpine's enterprising superintendent David B. Everett who has entered the 1958 race for state school head, has spoken in public many times on this topic.

Just off the Sun's press is a leaflet on his candidacy, in which he tells why he would like to run the state's schools. Among reasons is one we like: 'Half-day sessions could be eliminated in a matter of months. There should be permissive legislation for a year-round school'.

The worst operated businesses don't close up costly buildings and equipment for one-fourth of the year! Our school plant cost taxpayers over half a million for its 600 students to use only 9 months yearly. If our school were used the full year it could teach several hundred more per year, save interest alone of over \$7,500.

Alpine has received national attention previously for its desire to establish year-round education. Perhaps we may be the first to actually put it into effect. Let's do something. It's about time!-CI

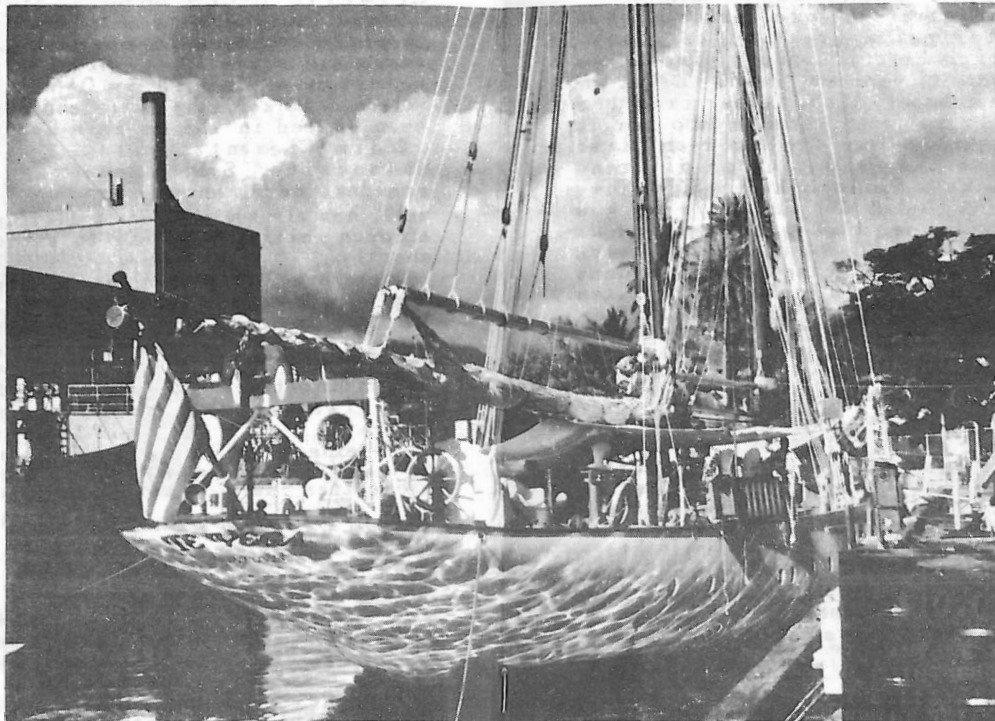
