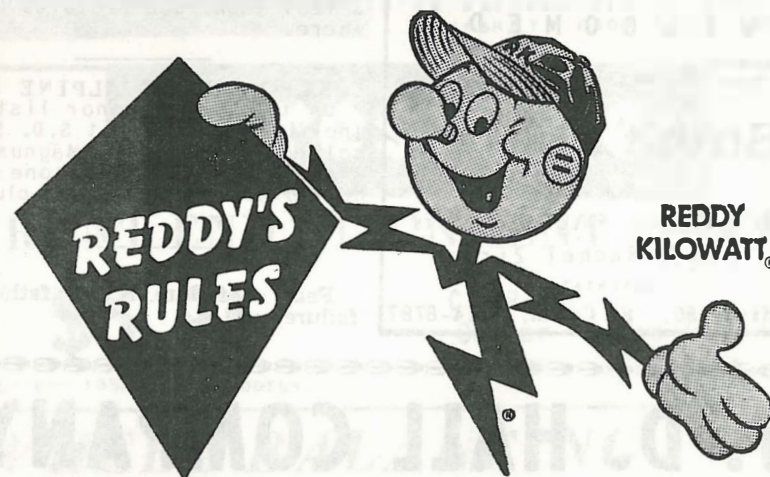

Laguna as of Mar. 7, found the average depth to be 12.8 inches with an average water content of 1.81 inches. This is one of hundreds in the state used to forecast runoff. This is the same as in 1957 only a month later, which is far better, but it is still below normal.

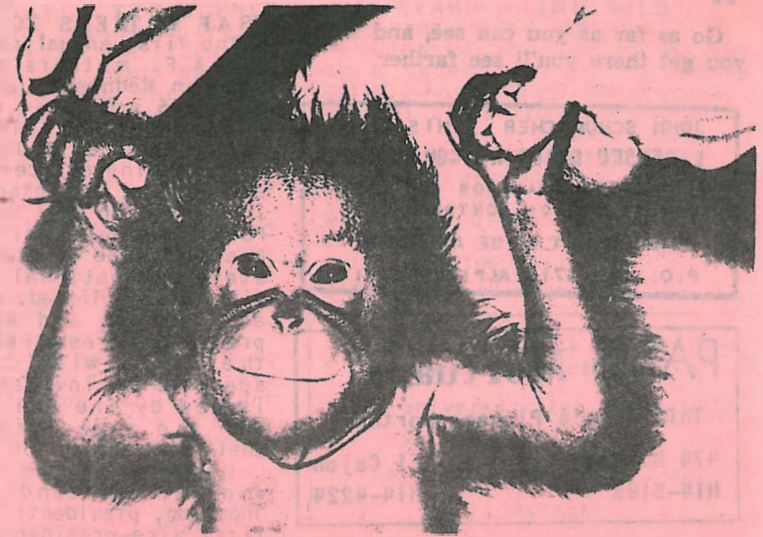
