# EDITORIAL.

## LET'S GET S RAIGHT ON WATER DEAL

Everyone in the Southland is fully aware of the increasing need for an adequate water supply. Everywhere the water level is falling. Even with plentiful rainfall, it still descends because so much more demand is being made. When your well goes dry, you quickly call the driller. Maybe you get water and maybe you don't. At any rate you pay plenty.

In our own case we had one well go out at 57 feet. We dug to 61 and it lasted only a short time. Then we drilled

to 245 feet, got no water but had to pay \$835. That money is still down in the dry hole!

Now comes the MWD with its acceptance of Alpine's request for annexation with 10,500 acres to receive water eventually. There will be back taxes, pipelines, pumps, feeder lines and so on, to pay for.

This is fine. This is dandy. but--- I believe that the engineers should give us a picture of the costs before people have a chance to talk it down ere it ever gets going!

Alpine had a sad time over its sewer system because the whole thing was not made entirely clear. Already some have talked against the proposed water district. To progress and improve, Alpine must have water and we do not want to see it sabotaged with talk before it gets really under way.
