EDITORIAL.

U.S. Gestapo Seen in Immigration Trick!

When William Heikkila, 52, was snatched off a street in San Francisco last week and flown to Finland by U.S. Immigration deputies via Canada, just another facet of dictatorship in America was revealed. The man was not even given time to pack a bag, see his wife, get his hat and coat or communicate with an attorney!

But the most astonishing point is that Heikkila was under jurisdiction of a federal court which was considering his fate even as the immigration sent him out of the country without due process of law.

However this is not the first time federal, state or county officers have abrogated the constitution, entered private property, arrested people, held them, and in various ways trampled upon the eternal rights of American citizens. Judges and others, even the press, roundly castigated those who perpetrated this unamerican act-- and the immigration head ordered the man returned.

He was born in Finland of naturalized American parents who were visiting their homeland. At one time, he-- like many thousands-- was a member of the Communist Party. For his own reasons he never became a citizen here. There are many others like him. However that is their own business. But it is our business to see that the constitution is upheld and the American people are going to see that it is.

If our immigration budget allows of sending people off on such trips, how about flying me over to Tibet? That's a place I've always wanted to visit, mainly to get away from some of the aberrations we humans are dragging around in our brains. So long as they pay my return flight, like they did for Mr. Heikkila!

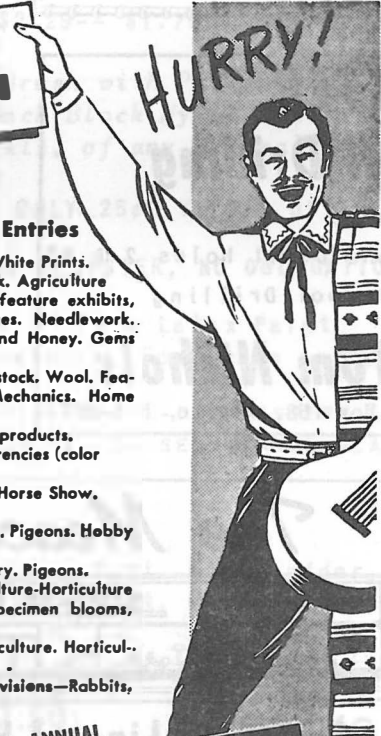

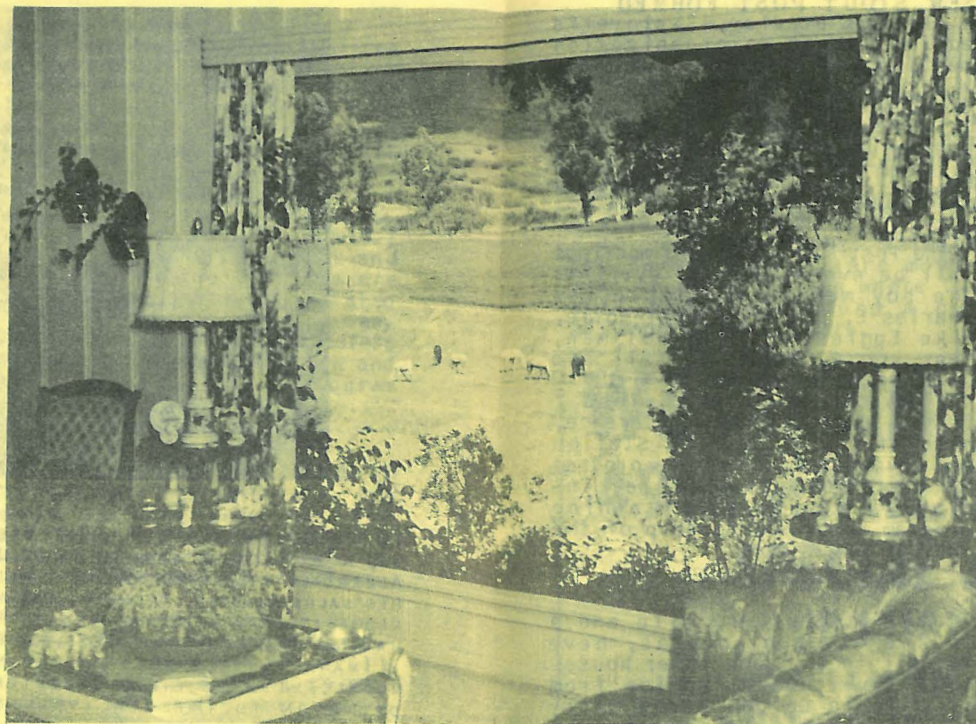

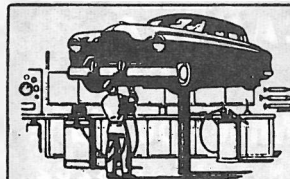
