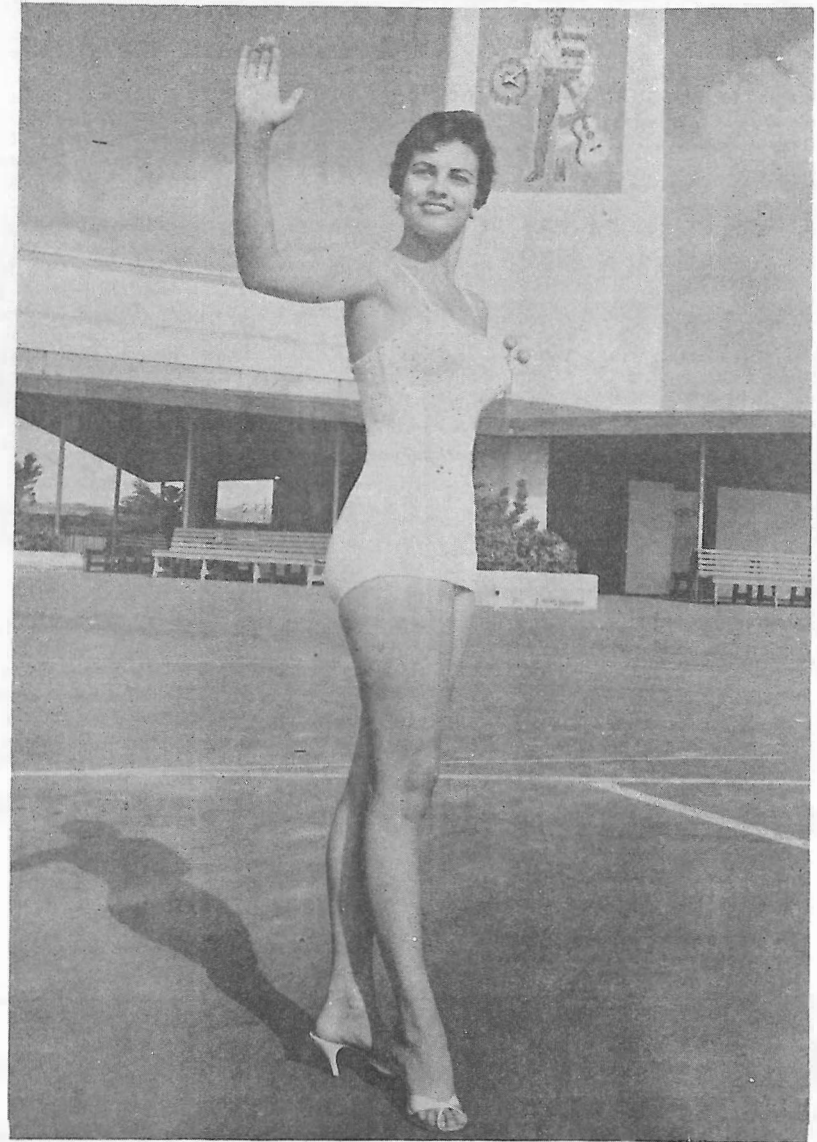

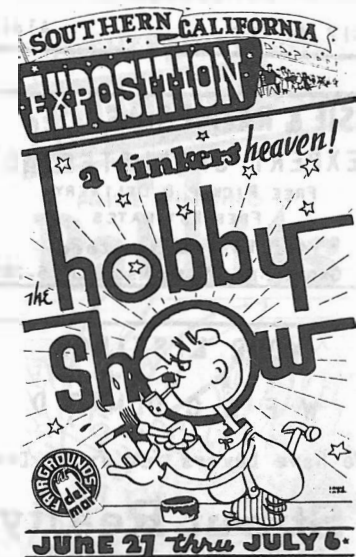

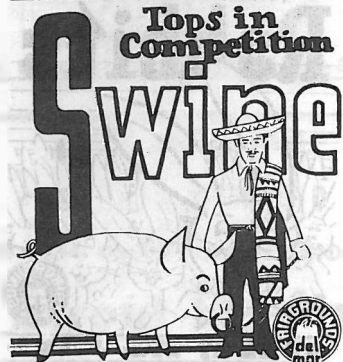
**PASS RECORD SCHOOL BUDGET**  
 Although the 58-59 budget for Alpine School District of \$239,000. is \$11,000 over last year's, the tax rate of \$1.50 for each \$100. of assessed value, will not be upped. School trustees gave it the green light at Monday's session.

Supt. David B. Everett, resigned to run for state head of schools, made up the budget, which includes an across the board pay raise for teachers of \$200. monthly. Undistributed reserve of \$28,000 was upped from \$19,000.

Present average daily attendance being 600, Everett advised considering a capital improvements bond issue for construction of a third elementary school, possibly in Harbison Canyon, which would save time and transportation as a large portion of students are from there.

a written permit for campfires

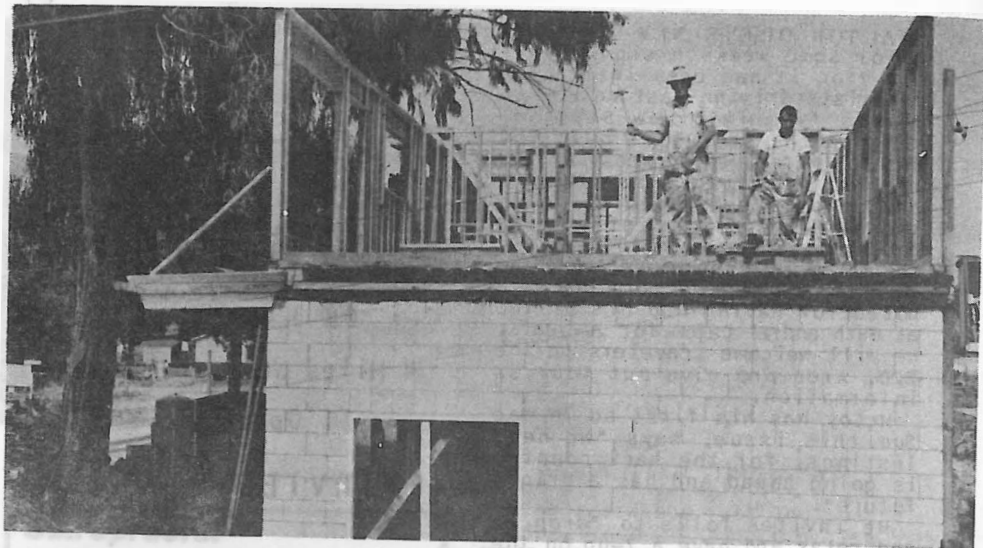

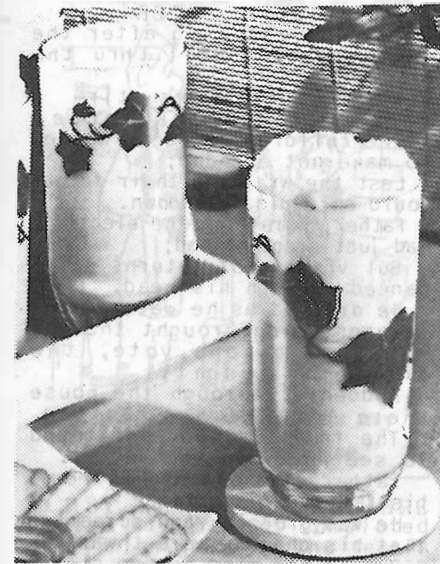

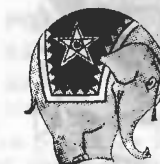

"The first loads of concrete were laid last week, says Pres. Vern Cheynoweth, "so it won't be long now!"

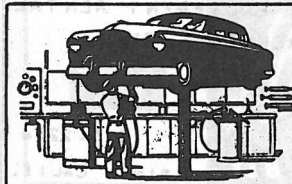

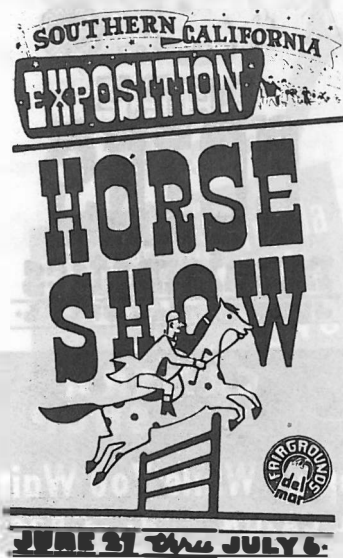
