has blithely passed a bill for 7½ million to build a monument on Corregidor, in Manila Bay, as a memorial to those brave men and women who lost their lives in WW2.

It is now in the hands of the senate. If petitions, resolutions and personal letters could sway legislators, they would not blow this huge sum on a dead memorial that could do no possible good.

As the national convention of ex-prisoners of war, held in Tacoma on July 11, they passed a resolution recommending to Congress that this money be spent on some useful purpose as hospitals, care of needy ex-POW's, internees and their kin, or in education.

I had the pleasure of being at a meeting of the local chapter in E.C., which endorsed this resolution, discussed the matter. Alfred W. Smith, state commander, made a brief talk on the subject that gave the idea to me for this editorial.

It seems to me that \$7½ mil—lion spent on a statue of any kind would be a feeble attempt to memorialize the tiny island that is in itself a monument to those grand soldiers who gave their lives there or suffered the ignominy and pain of surrender.



IN TERESTING NOTES FROM CESARIO IN SO. AMERICA Elder Arthur J. Cesario, jr.,

Elder Arthur J. Cesario, jr., stat oned in the suburban section of Liniers, Buenes Aires, has written some interesting letters home about his life as a missionary for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, his parents here reveal.

In one letter he writes; 'Missionary work, as I have found it, is very gratifying and humbling because it permits only momentary evaluations of worldly commodities. Our initial real challenge is the first lesson or conversation in spanish. I gave mine after having been there 1½ months.

The customs and incidents throughout Argentina is a growing abundance of ultra-modernization, being sustained on all sides by antiquity. One is quick to notice that the nation is not quite as advanced as our own. What is novel at home, but is have here, are the many slow rolling huge wheel farm carts along side hurrying, scurrying car infested streets. Seldom does one find a barber with electric hair clippers. They are all hand operated or scissors but they do good work in a short time. Shows are plentiful but six

months behind our present ones, and almost exclusively No. American.

'The general attitude is that all Americans are quite wealthy, and that a tremendous minority are millionaires.

'Milk is sold daily by a man

who comes around in a horse drawn cart. Those who want milk must have it poured out from a 3 gallon pitcher.

The position of truck driver is considered elite. The country is generally flat and quite humld, with a chief export of

meat goods.





All over the U.S. cities use artery names that lead to nearby towns as La Jolla, La Mesa, Pasadena, Santa Monica, and so on.

Thus, instead of advertising Fairview Station as being on 80, 3 miles west of Alpine, or the Fruit Rowl, 4 miles W of Alpine, they will use the terse '10,500 Alpine Elvd.'.

Frank Bellamy, resident and nurseryman on 80 said 'Good Idea.

I'll sign that right now.

W.P. Finnegan, manager of Mutual Liquid Gas, which serves all along 80, said 'the highway is growing and it will help us a lot in finding homes and businesses; its a good idea'.

Hunk Anderson, co-owner of Genview Feed Co., said 'I'm surely in favor, it'll help on deliveries and in emergencies'.

Hugh McCoy, pioneer realtor of S.D., who just opened a branch on

80 opposite Fairview, is already working on it as an improvement that 'will aid everybody on this route, besides help boost the Alpine area'.

He is well qualified to advise on such matters, being a member of the S.D. Realty Board, International Traders & Brokers Club; Nat. Assoc. of Realty Boards and past president of the E.C. Blvd. Civic Association that put over that artery some years ago.

The sheriff's office is for this plan, Chief Deputy Bill H. Woods saying 'Locating houses by numbers on the proposed Alpine plvd., rather than by Route and Box numbers, would be of great benefit to deputies in answering emergency calls'. It would also help in other emergencies as for fire ambulance, doctor, utilities, etc.

The second important change in 80 is its early status of freeway, and changes in route all along. Today public meetings in areas affected, says Engineer Dekema, are being planned. The current one being for the stretch from Laguna Jct., to Coyote Wells, which plans to skip Boulevard and other areas.

When asked about Alpine, he replied 'I don't know where it will go, but it will be north or south of the present highway we are sure. We will know in a few more months -- I hope -- nothing has been decided'.

One conclusion is sure, no matter where 80 goes from Alpine, it will briefly hurt some businesses, but ultimately it will mean a great improvement for the entire community. It has not hurt other towns as Carlsbad, Oceanside, Santa Ana and dozens of others, whose leaders squawked at first, but today are thankful.

It took the Sun two years to get street names and numbers for Alpine, and that has proved a top benefit to all, and means that eventually when the postoffice changes to numbers, it will save much confusion.
