## Man Dies in Fire

A hot, fast fire in a small frame house on Willowside Terrace, took the life of its occupant, Gerry W. Davis, 24, a Convair-Astronautics worker. He was the father of two in Vermont with his estranged wife.

The blaze was discovered at 6:45 by Landlord John Cardwell last Monday morning week, had started in the tiny living room.

Davis was found clothed but burned to death on the floor of the bedroom. Two nearby cottages were saved. Sheriff's deputy, Ralph Nunnery said the man had been drinking in Alpine bars during Sunday night, was last seen in a Guatay cafe about 4 a.m.

Units from Alpine, U.S. and state forestry controlled the fire.

# EDITORIAL

## Why Alpine Fights Fires Outside Own District.

Recently there were three fires outside Alpine Fire District: Viejas Reservation, Fairview and the Willows.

Alarms were called in here and equipment was sent out at taxpayers' expense. Our generous volunteers went along and helped conquer the flames.

State and federal apparatus was also on the scene. They are paid to fight fire in U.S. and California forests. Local departments always go along and aid in the battle, sometimes easily and quickly won,

sometimes difficult and lengthy and rarely fatal.

All fires burn valuable watershed, frequently destroy homes and buildings, and menace others. Containing a fire saves property.

We have heard many complaints, rightly too, that residents of the Willows, who were originally included in our fire district, and for which we paid well to organize, and pay taxes to support today, withdrew, and do not pay their share.

Had last Monday's fatal fire not been put out, a whole section of homes might have been in ashes. Should a fire get a good start on a windy day, the entire Willowside Terrace area might be razed.

The explanation of our fire department and the commissioners is that we help outside our district when the state or federal calls for help. They do the same for us. Also it gives our boys good training.

That is all very true, but the taxpayer who presently pays the full load, believes that outside areas should share Ho

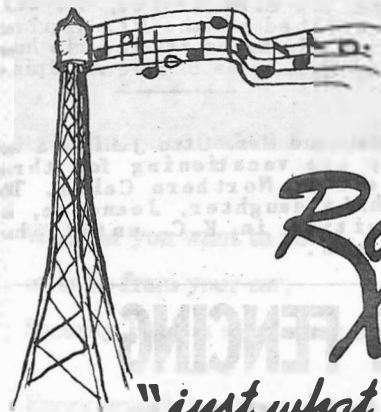

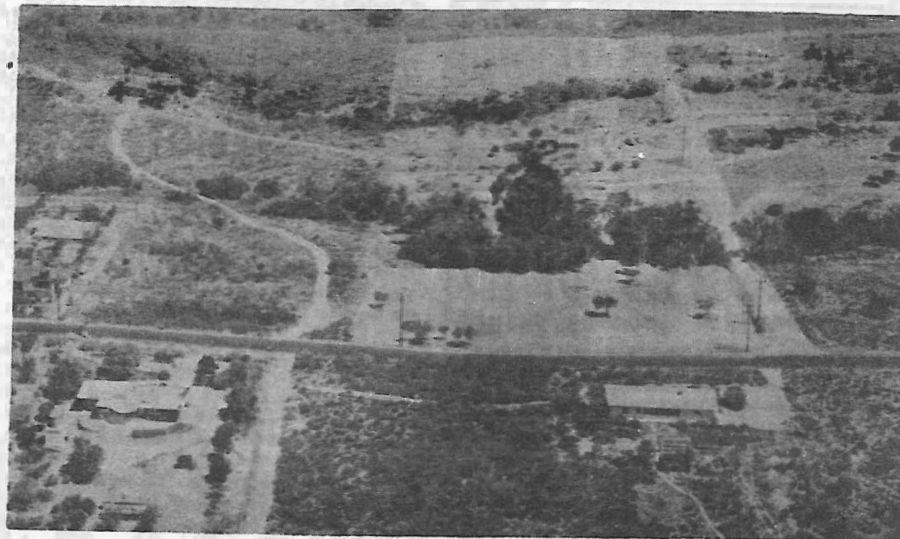

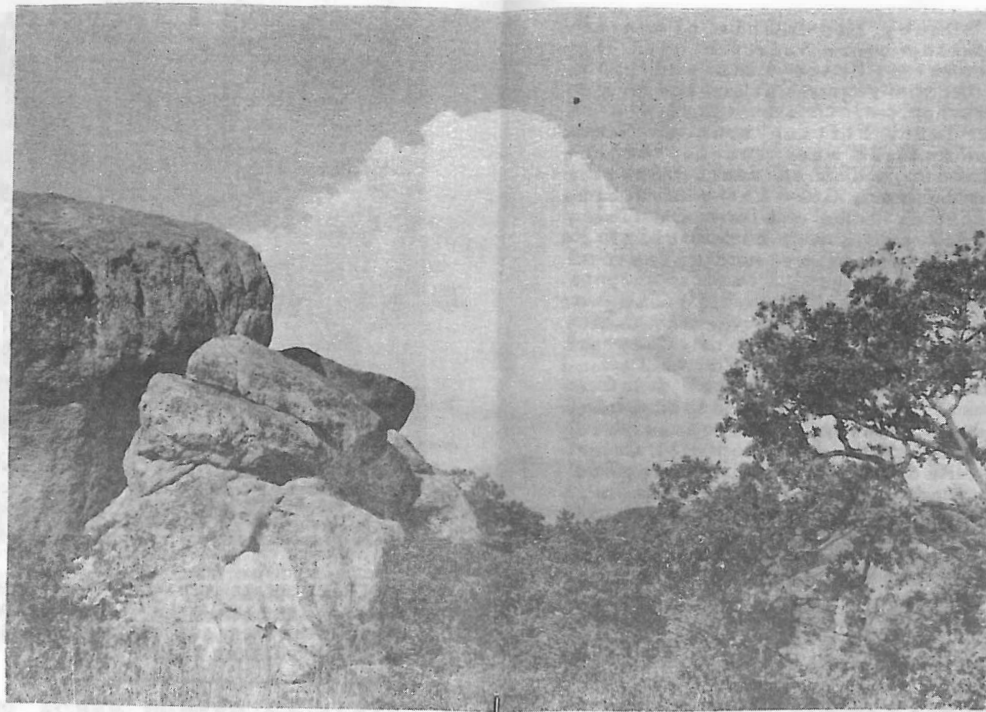
**TAVERN RD. STILL DELAYED**

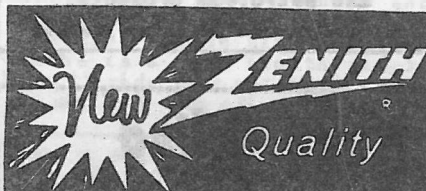

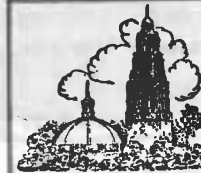

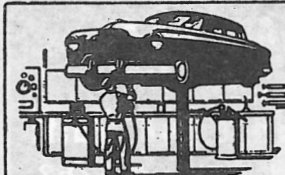

 acres on July 7, after Alpine after the county had issued a trailer park electric permit. The couple had spent \$7,444.12 up to presstime.

The percolation test was made by engineers as required and approved by the health department, for 12 trailer spaces. The county okayed the project, as to zoning, etc., and gave him blanks to make application on and an architect was engaged to prepare plans and the state also okayed the project which would be given a permit when the health departments part had been approved.

Note- When I first came here 21 years ago I told the chamber of commerce Alpine had a great future, should plan, be zoned and so on.

That chamber disintegrated. When I moved here the second time in 1949, I reorganized the chamber, again urged planning and zoning. That organization has since

become decadent.

The year I started the Sun, January 1952, I contacted the planning commission, contemplated a conference. Then new chamber officers came in and the matter went back to sleep.

In Oct. 23, 1952 this on planning was run in the Sun. 'Matters to consider in any area such as this are nuisances, parking areas in business districts, building restrictions, chicken ranches and animals, shooting and hunting regulations, and many other measures. It is pointed out that no drastic regulations can be made without a vote of the people.

Note- It has been mentioned by this paper that Alpine should consider its future and act today to prevent traffic tie-ups and other annoyances that arise with the growth of a community. Already the new postoffice poses such a problem (and it still does), with no parking lot on Arnold Way and a narrow street for the already congested situation. Advance planning is the only answer. Let's plan!

Today, Alpine is fourth on the list, little Poway being zoned now. Had community leaders worked together, we could have been zoned and this confusion sidetracked. -CI
