Children in 4th, 5th and 6th grades will be on full session, from 9:30 to 3:45.

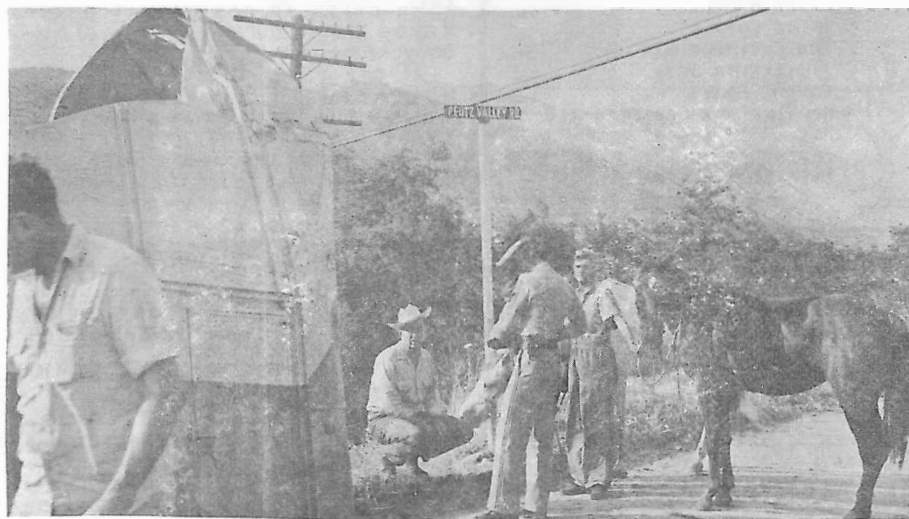
Junior High students will attend from 9:30 to 3:45.

At any rate, that plane might have caused a holocaust in the middle of Alpine. It might happen tonight! Or next week! Jets are now coming in on a new pattern, it seems, right over this area, to straighten out for approach by radar at Miramar.

Presently they are meeting in a store at 2251 Hwy 80, and have 60 members, with the Rev. J.C. Arnold in charge.

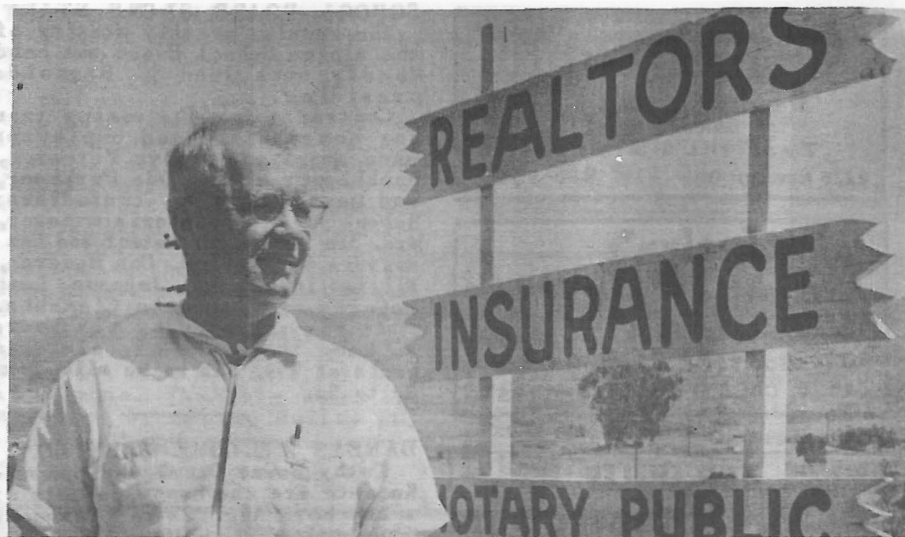
ALPINE SQUASHES RAMONA



CRASH KILLS JET PILOT

A 24-year old aviator was killed here on the night of Aug. 20 when his \$1,250,000. jet plane hit the west slope of Viejas Mountain, exploded and burned. He was Lt. jg. Clark G. Grazier, of Coronado, attached to Fighter Squadron 142, under command of Cdr. G.H. Whisler.

Sun photos elsewhere vividly tell the story of the plane that unaccountably flew too low on a Miramar radar approach. It was at 10:47 p.m. that the F8U crusader thundered into the rocky hill and exploded, many thought it was a quake. The wing section tore loose, flew ¼ mile, nearly hit the Brant Ranch house where six were asleep. The fierce fire lasted over half an hour, visible for miles.

Memorial service was held at Miramar for young Grazier and his body sent to Arlington National cemetery for burial. He leaves his parents, Capt. Clark G. Grazier, a Navy doctor, and Mrs. Grazier, Newport, R.I.

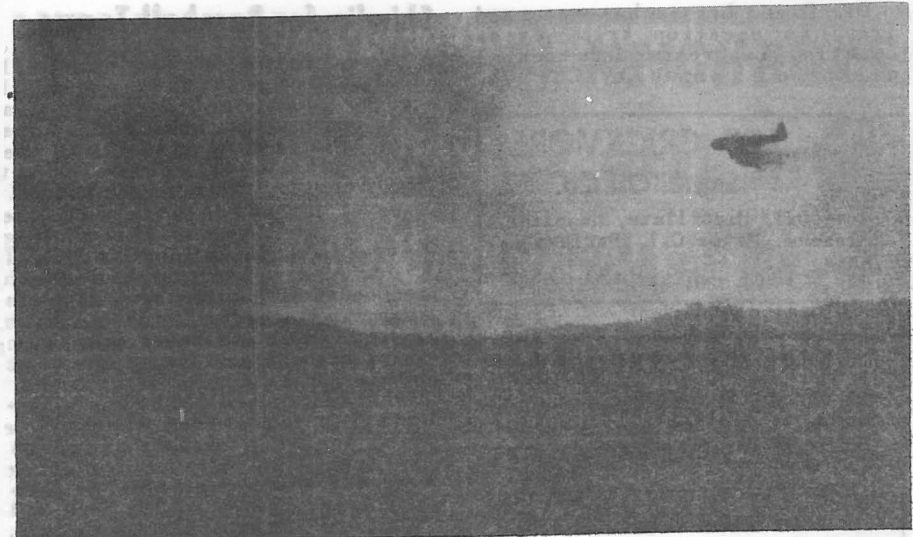
