This has been held up because of utility poles being moved by the phone and power firms, latterly because a number of property owners held up.

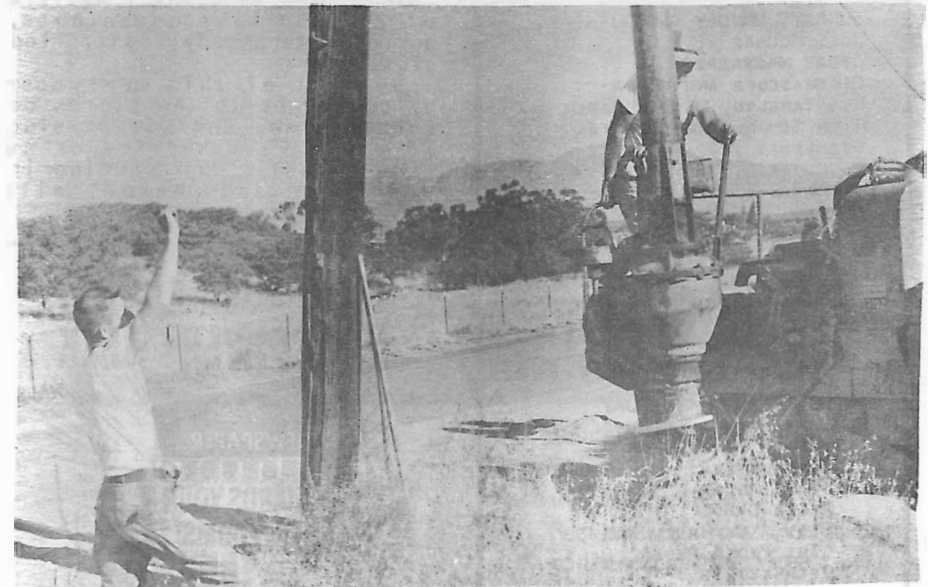

## HELIX NIXES WATER

At the Monday night directors' meeting of Helix Water District, it was felt that, from the long look, their district presently would not accept annexation of the Alpine-El Cajon-Dehesa proposed water areas.

It was suggested that all three be annexed to the Metropolitan at the same time. Boundaries will have to be revised due to some residents not wishing to be included. The three districts will meet soon to discuss plans.

Preliminary estimates by Byrl Phelps engineers show that the cost of joining the Metro would be about 72¢ per \$100. assessed valuation. When water comes in, valuation will go up, which would reduce the costs proportionately, probably down to 40¢.

A postal is being sent to those not desiring to be in, but should they wish to, they may return the card and get in. Deadline for this is Oct. 10.

Conclusion is that Alpine has a very promising future-- when it gets water, for with this ideal climate and rich soil, much could be grown year round, and building would advance instantly, with FHA loans, a bank and other improvements.

**BUILDING HOLDS UP WELL**

For last month the back country enjoyed continued building activity, Alpine's total for 7 units being \$11,400, including one \$5,000. home. Descanso had 5 for \$8,500 and Harbison Canyon totalled 5 for \$12,800, but Pine Valley used only one permit for a \$500. structure. In July Alpine's total was 7 for \$23,800; Descanso 3 for \$40,400; Harbison, 4 for \$8,400 and P.V. scored 5 for \$37,000.

**FREEWAY IS YET FAR AWAY**

In January the state expects to get started on the first half of the freeway across E.C. Valley, reports Jacob Dekema, engineer. Earth from the Grossmont summit 8-lane route has been deposited for the new roadbed. The new stretch will go from Chase; across E.C. Blvd., end at Magnolia with an interchange.

But not till 1961 will the second half be started, from Magnolia out to rejoin 80 at Flume Dr. on Tunnel Hill. Rights of way are still being negotiated.

Note: - At any rate the first half will greatly help Alpiners who wish to bypass E.C. But the urgently required freeway is for four lanes clear out to Alpine. It's no fun to lag behind 25 to 30 cars, trailers and trucks and be slowed down to 15 mph, with 35 to 40 as top speed.-Ed.
