school will be built to relieve present crowding. It would serve some 200, about a third, of Alpine's enrollment, living in the canyon.

Gilley is winding up a lengthy and scientific survey of the district which will culminate in a master plan for the future. He is strongly for ridding the area of double-sessions, says 'this crowded condition is a deterrent to good educational procedures and, until corrected, should receive highest priority on time and efforts'

The proposed site is in the 275 acres bought in Sept. 1956 for \$150,000. by Drs. Roy M. Ledford and Lyman W. Bruce, of S.D., from Reginald Small. The school has been negotiating with the owners and it is believed that the site will be acceptable, but nothing is definite. Appraisers are now working on it for both sides.

Trustees have slated a \$1,250,000 bond election for Jan. 27 to boost this building program. A million will be borrowed from the state, the quarter million to be voted. The board authorized Gilley to negotiate. If it passes, the buildings would be ready by the end of 1959. Federal funds of \$118,000. will also be asked for, as they are available to districts with children of federally employed.
