### Water District Approved

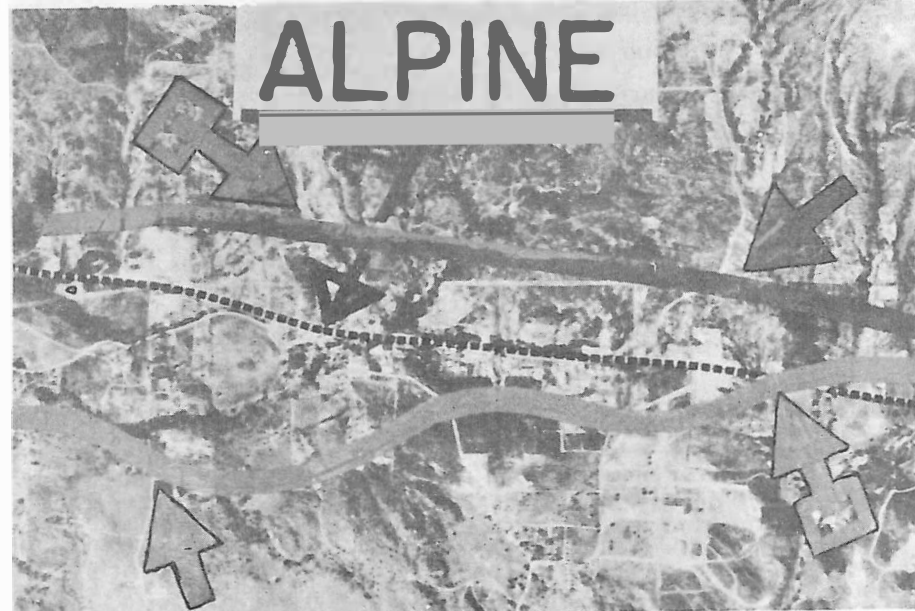

### BOND ELECTION JAN. 27

Alpine voters will go to the polls Tuesday, Jan. 27, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. to ballot on school bonds of \$250,000 for building added classrooms to stop double-sessions. Three polls will be open: Alpine School Auditorium, Community Hall in Harbison Canyon and Mrs. A. Little's home, Japatul Road.

A preview of this session will be held on Saturday the 17th at the auditorium from 10 to 4, with engineers on hand to explain the large aerial, photo maps of this area. Everyone is invited to attend, ask questions and learn what is proposed in this major development.

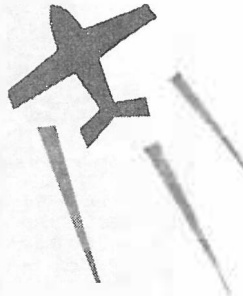
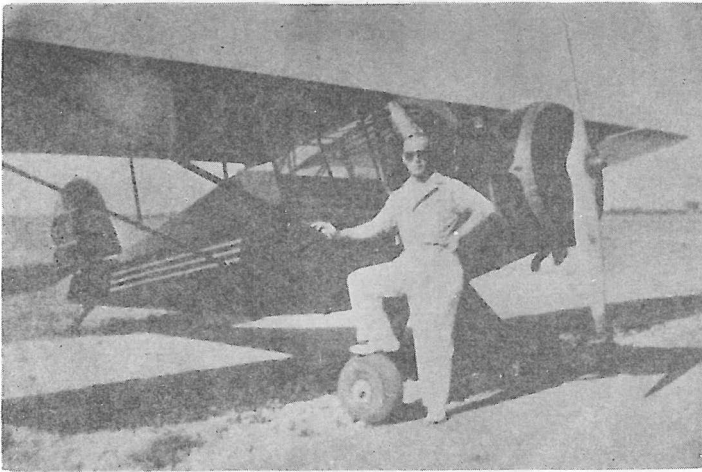

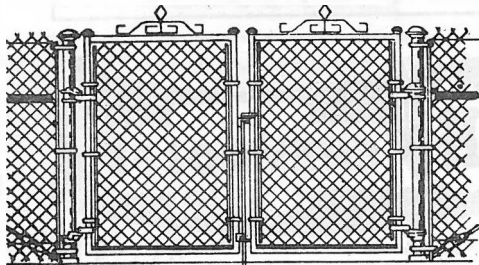

**PILOTS OF ALPINE**  
 Recent figures show that this state has more fliers than any other, and many of these airmen are retired. One in Alpine who did 15,000 hours is Frank Fitzgerald, Hwy 80, an early flier who learned at Santa Monica's old airport in 1921 using a Waco OX5, a Jenny and other war surplus planes. He then lived in Torrance.

In the picture he is with an old Spad in 1942. The ship was rebuilt, converted and redesigned with a 135 hp motor. Once he made a forced landing in a Waco on a Canadian lake, totally wrecked the plane but walked away safe. He formed the Niagara Falls Frontier Pilot's Assn., was otherwise active in civilian flying.

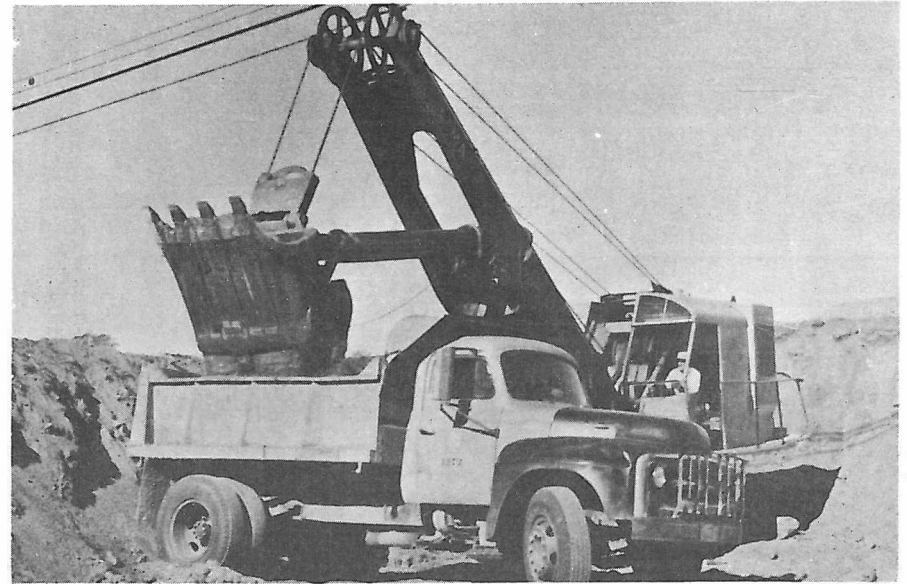

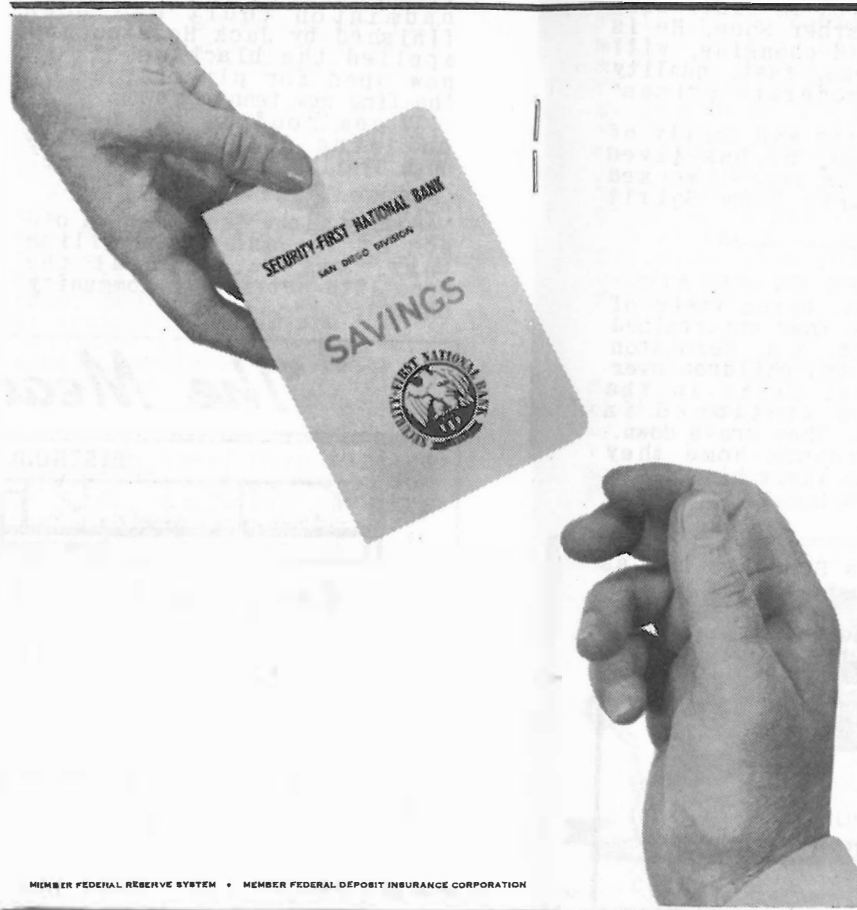


## Yale in Freak Accident

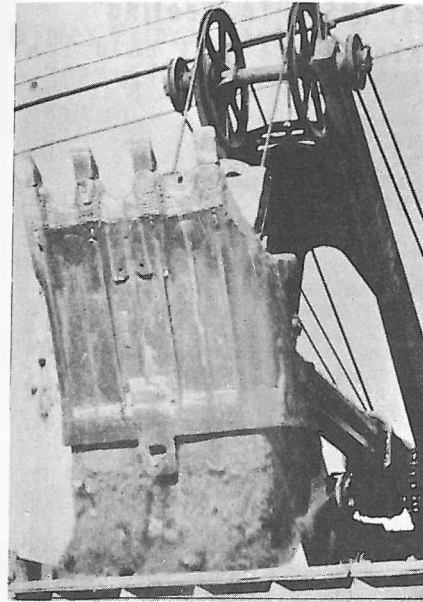

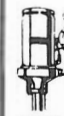

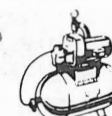

(see other photo on page 12), the proposed 4-lane freeway, a part of the federal project, is to replace 5.3 miles of present Hwy 80. The north route is 5.2 miles, the south, 6.0. The north would be on a 5% grade, the south on a 4%. Truckers say there is no appreciable difference, and for motorists, the difference would not be noticed at all.

One factor of importance is the cost, \$6,190,000 for the north, \$6,680,000 for the south, a lesser cost of about half a million.

Before highway officials decide on the route, they listen to opinions of citizens. Other factors are cost, grade, distance and engineering problems. The highway department says there is not much difference engineering wise.

Note- After studying the big air maps in the S.D. office, and talking with engineers, also Alpine businessmen, we believe that the north route might be the best. It will afford passing motorists a fine view of the area from above town. It saves half a million in costs, and for access to Alpine's business area, an interchange is planned for W. Victoria, only a short distance from downtown. In the photos, plain arrows indicate over or underpasses and squared arrows show interchanges or on and off points.
