EDITORIAL.

School Board has Done Pretty Good Job



Tuesday voters in Alpine's school district will ballot on two members for the board. Evident confidence in the present trustees and their policies brought in the bond issue and state loan.

This board and the new superintendent have worked harmoniously to improve conditions, and they plan more betterments. They have accomplished a number of major things.

a new bus was bought for cash out of reserves, saving taxpayers some \$1500. in interest and carrying charges. When a second one was needed they managed to get a used one in fine shape for \$1875. also for cash, again a like saving.

Four classrooms were completed without fanfare, paid for by federal funds under Public Law 815, plus about \$11,000. cash from district reserves to complete and furnish the last two rooms.

Although as all are painfully aware, everything is rising in cost and additional personnel as teachers, custodians, etc., must be employed as enrollment grows, the board did not ask for an increase in our local tax rate of \$1.51.

Complete rehabilitation at the junior high was made without gouging taxpayers. New forced-air gas heaters were put in. Asphalt tile floors were laid and a complete paint job in and out was finished. The upper play area was enlarged and graded to make a baseball field. The lower playground was leveled, filled and basketball court installed. Trees were taken out and the bus turn-around enlarged so big vehicles would not have to back coming in to load or discharge. This area was black-topped so buses may use it in rainy weather.

There has been a lot of talk about spending taxpayers' money, but to give credit where credit is due we must say that there has been some good policy making, management and financial housekeeping in our school district in recent years.

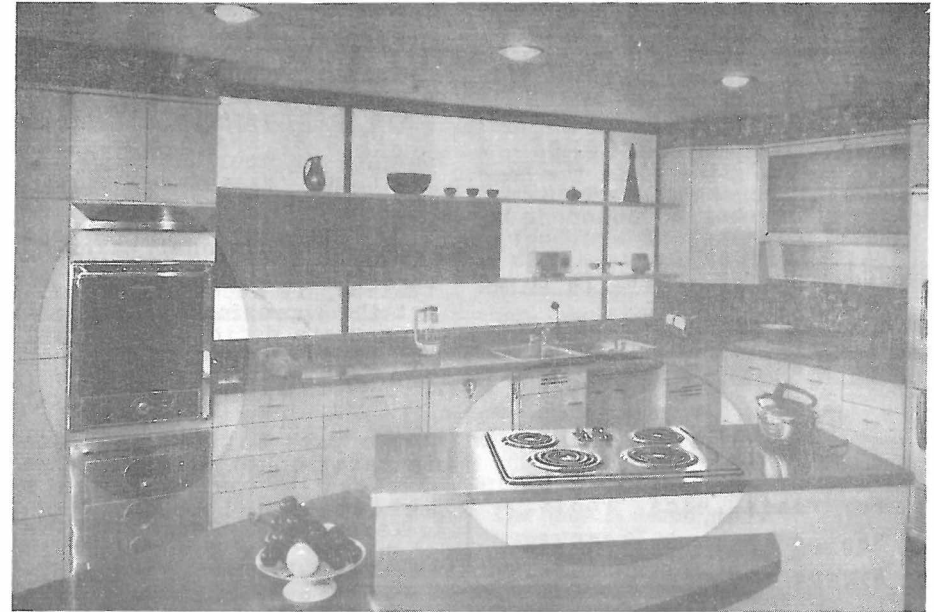

What of Thrift in Local Government, Mr. Irvine?

In your editorial of May 1, you saated 'Taxes have gone steadily up' -- what have we, as citizens of Alpine, just recently done but increase taxes

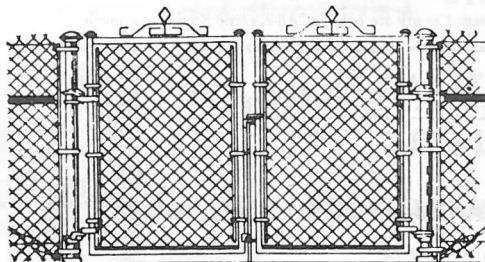
You also stated 'The national debt has reached frightening heights'. Let's take a look at our state taxes. They, too, have reached frightening heights to the extent that our new governor has requested additional taxes on beer, banks and corporations. There has also been a recommendation made for additional taxes on tobacco and income. This, we realize, is necessary to offset the approximately \$70 million state deficit as of Jan. 1, 1959. We, citizens of Alpine, voted to borrow a \$1 million from a state deficit of \$70 million.

Who pays for the increase in taxation to eliminate the deficit? 'The poor man's wallet.'

To quote-- 'Perhaps if we might get our government to use some 'thrift and intelligent investment' we might see daylight in this smog of high costs.' Perhaps if we might get our citizens interested in thrift and intelligent economy and investment at our local level we might be able to create a trend toward more intelligent and economical state and federal spending. The logical approach to the top rung of the ladder is from the bottom

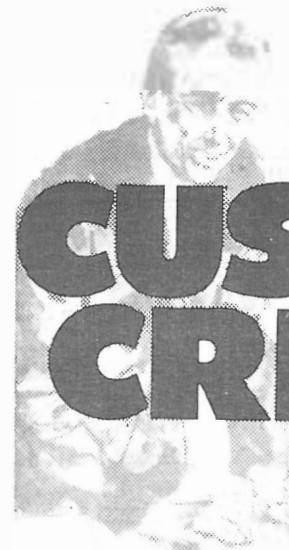

Debbie Yonic sure was lucky. Her dad put her on a plane and she flew to Cleveland all by herself. She is going to visit her cousins.

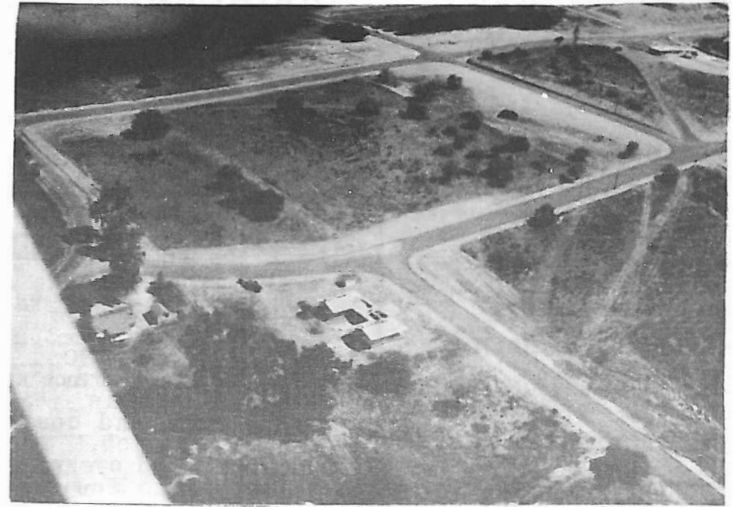
Joann Miller and Vonnie Kay Greathouse took a kitten. Now we only have one left.

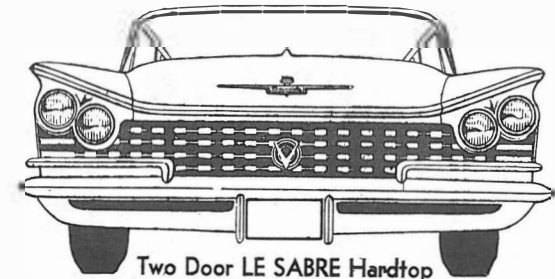

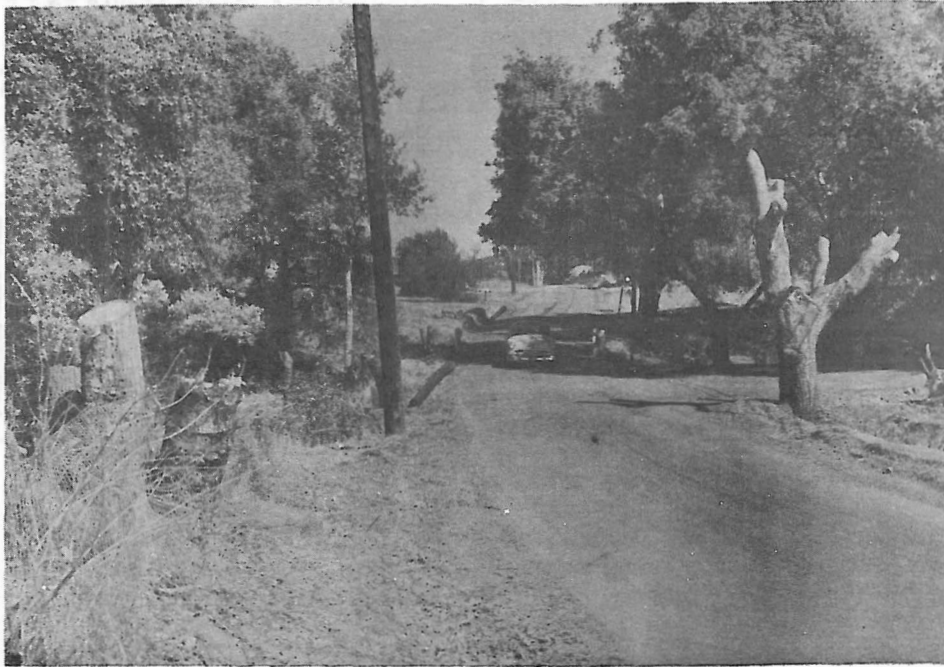

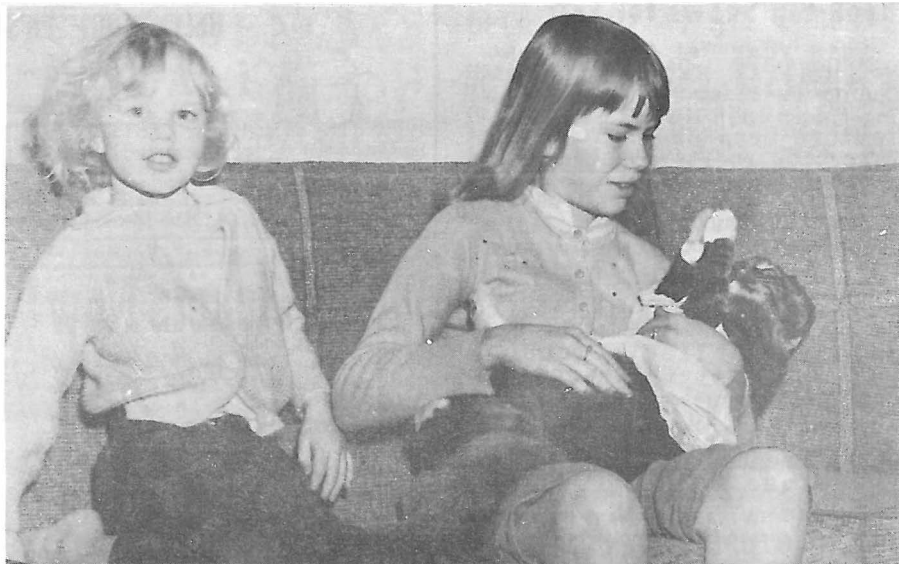

Steve Woodall had to spend a few days in Grossmont Hospital. He had to have a spot taken off his foot. He came home last Saturday.

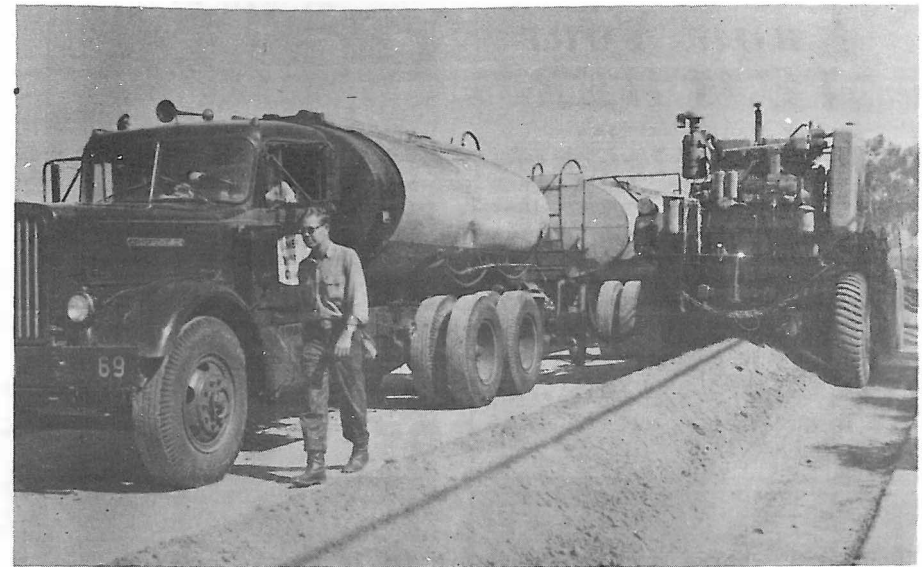
I have a new boy in my class. his name is Peter Brown. Robin Range and her family moved up to Sacramento.

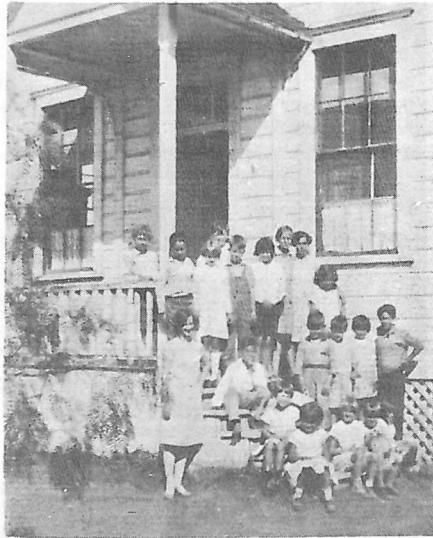
Know Your TEACHER

the East County Municipal Water District for Alpine, Harbison Canyon, Dehesa, La Cresta areas.

This was a follow-up of the lively session held March 30 when the proposed, final, new district was decided upon, with Byrl Phelps, engineer, in charge. He also conducted this meeting. The area

lies from north of Hwy 80 to the Sweetwater, and from E.C. eastward to the Cleveland National Forest.

John M. Cranston, an attorney of S.D., has been appointed to aid with legal angles in forming the district.

Water for this area would come from the Colorado to Slaughterhouse Canyon terminus near Lakeside. A gravity flow would bring it to a 39-million gallon reservoir at 1400 foot west of here. Pumps would life it to La Cresta and Alpine, while gravity would take it to the Canyon and other locations. (Sun for April 3)

'Total cost would run about \$1,139,000.,' according to Phelps.' This is for reservoir, pipelines, meters, pumps and so on. La Cresta and the Canyon already own distribution lines, but other areas would have to be installed and paid for by bond issue. The 1911 Improvement Act would not be used in this kind of district. Petitions with some 500 voters signed are now available for submittal to the supervisors, and another 100 or more names are desired,' he concluded.

C.R. Crull, engineer in the Phelps office, told the Sun that the actual monthly water rates for average domestic use, would not be high when compared with other districts; San Dieguito, \$2.47; Lakeside, \$2.50; S.D. & Poway, \$3.; Helix, \$3.10; Riverview Farm, \$3.70 and Valley Center, \$5.

Any voter not having signed a petition is urged to sign, as petitions are available at Alpine Land Co., office, 2175 Arnold Way.
