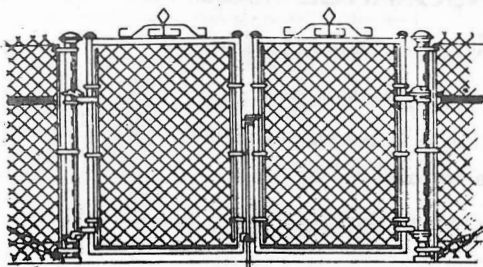

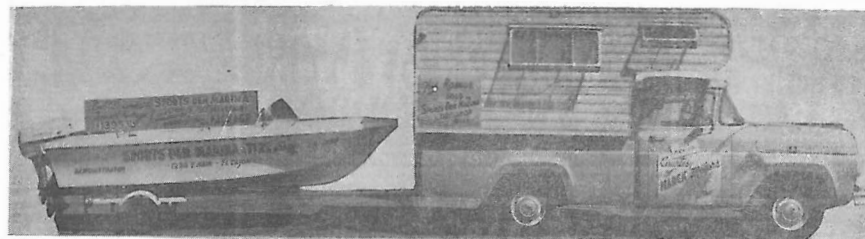

Show New Driller

Perhaps the most progressive step in well drilling was made when the Stardrill-Keystone Co. of Ohio, brought out its new 1-engine, rotary drilling machine which was demonstrated at Holiday Ranch here last week by B & R Diamond Drilling Co. of E.C. It is the first one on the coast.

This unique new machine, according to J.W. Parker, western sales manager can go to 1000 feet with a 6 inch hole, and it goes fast. It has a pull-down of 30,000 lbs. with draw-works of 12,000 lbs. It has huge levelling hydraulic jacks, one in front, two in rear, is even equipped with floods for night work. Everything is automatic and the driller can watch the pull-down chains as they lower the bit slow in granite, faster in soft rock. A big diesel supplies power for mobility, plus operating air compressors and the machine itself.

Bostwick Brothers, owners of B & R, are happy over its performance on the first job for Forrest McKinley's Holiday Ranch. They conquered 200' of granite in only two days, got a fine well with 30-40 gpm. Many visitors enjoyed their hospitality at the picnic ranch while the trade came from afar to watch. 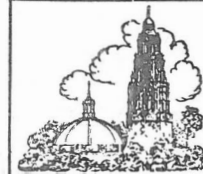

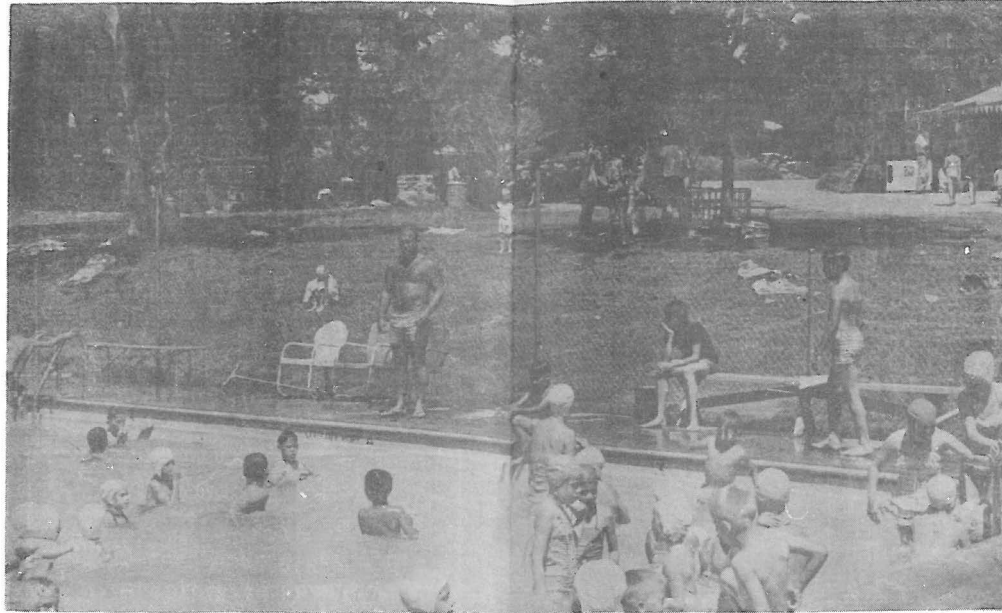

VIEJAS GRADE KILLS AGAIN

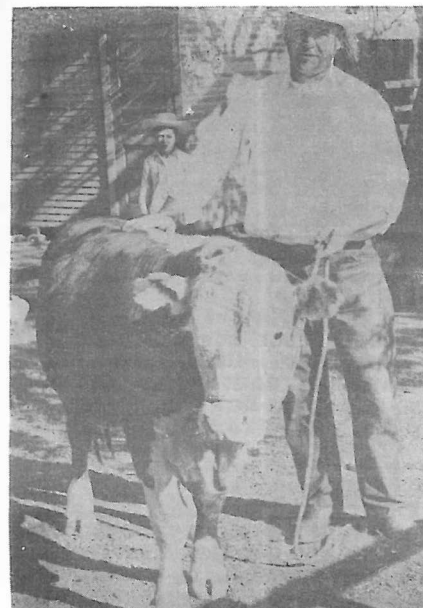

NEW WEATHER YEAR STARTS

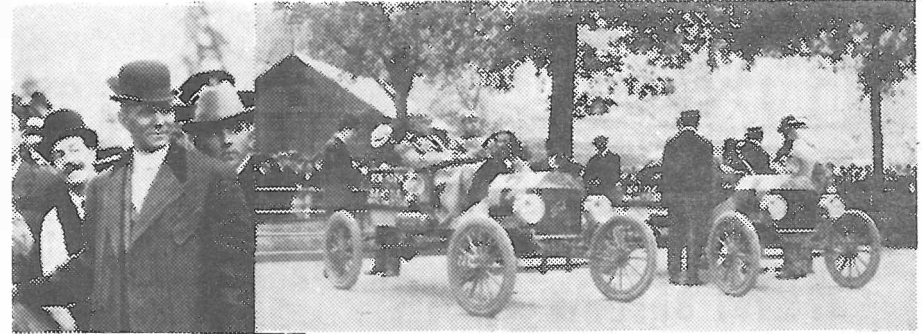

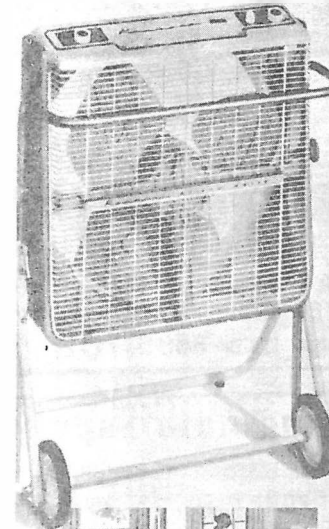

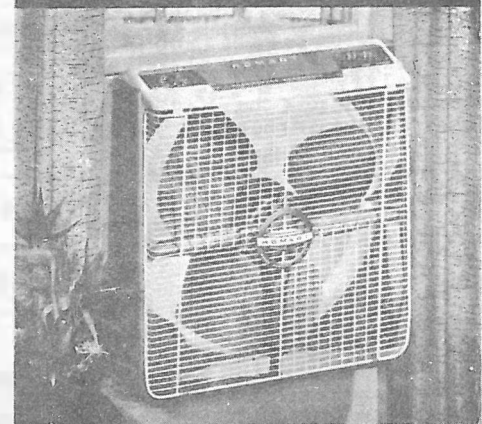
