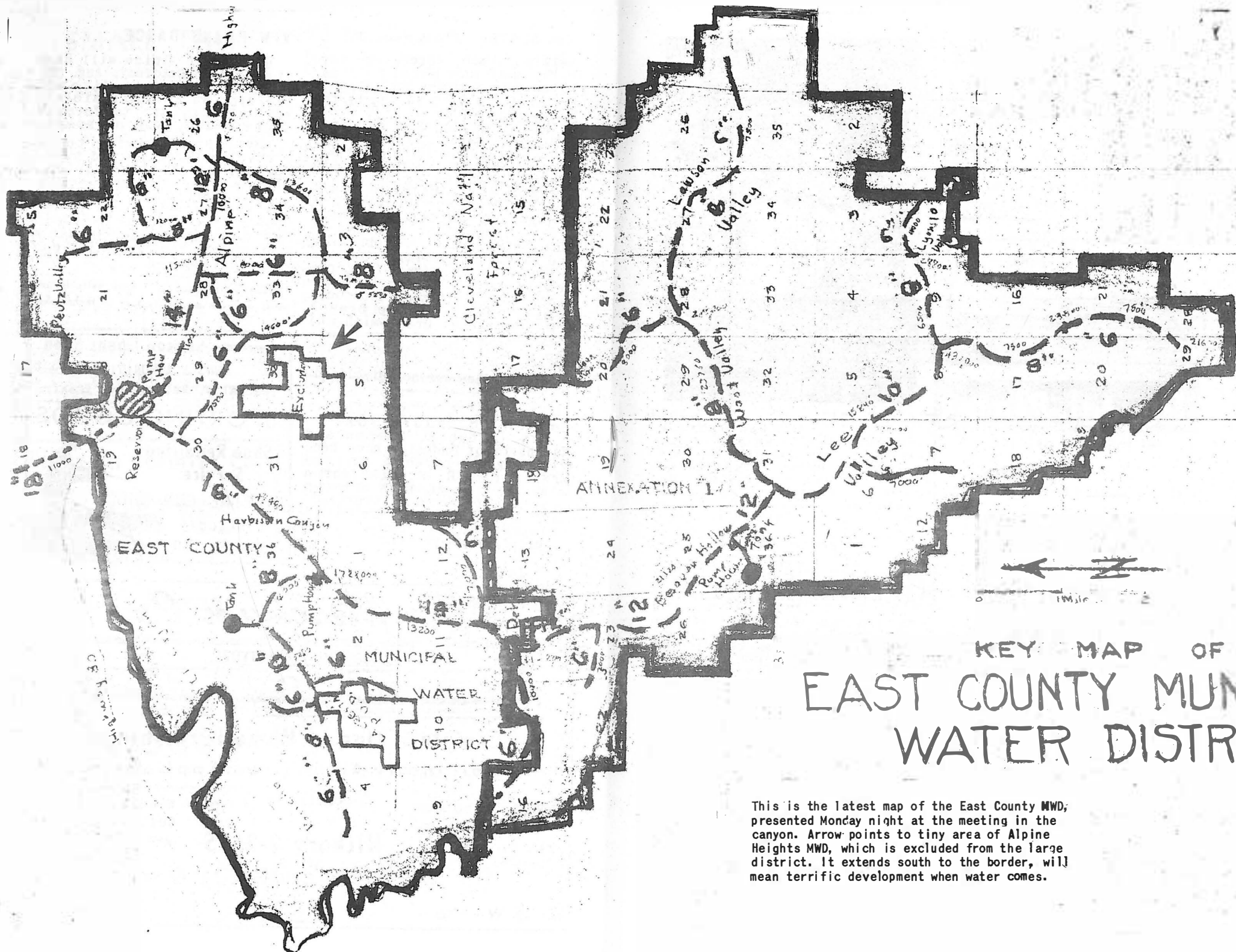

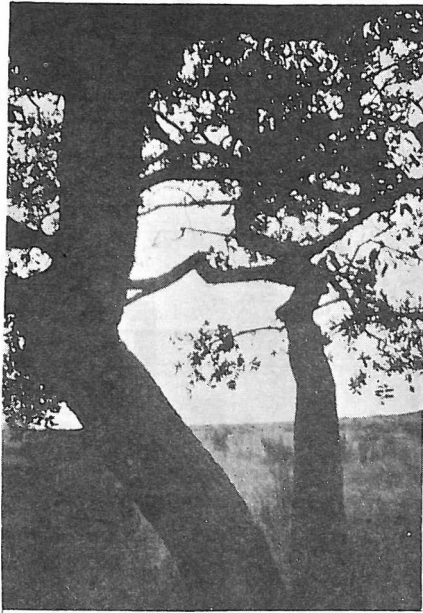

the south. "With the delays, and work of establishing new boundaries for the added areas" explained Phelps, "the election cannot be held till at least Jan. 15. First an election has to be held in the Alpine Heights MWD to allow exclusion of those who do not wish to be in that district, but who desire to be in the East County one". Their adjourned meeting is slated for Sept. 2nd.

All present boundaries have been approved and the southern section should get the green light in about a month. Total will be 49,000 acres, which will reduce the costs, it was stated. (For complete resume, see the Sun for 7-17-59). The map of the big new district presented Monday night, is shown in this issue.

In closing, Phelps assured the people "if anyone has a question, please let us know and if enough are interested, we will hold another mass meeting now. There will be one later, before the main election". Letters may be sent to the Sun, Alpine.

Representing the press were both Alpine papers, Earl C. Woodall, M.D., of the Echo and Clarke Irvine of the Sun.

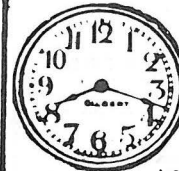
**KOALA BEAR DRAWS SMILES**

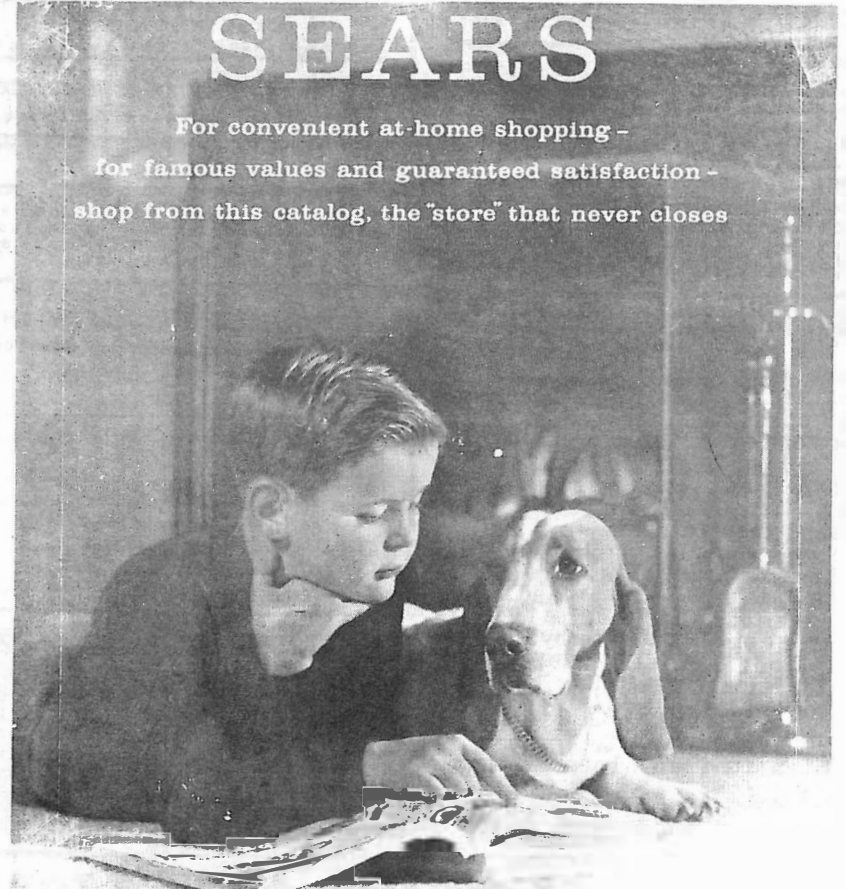
