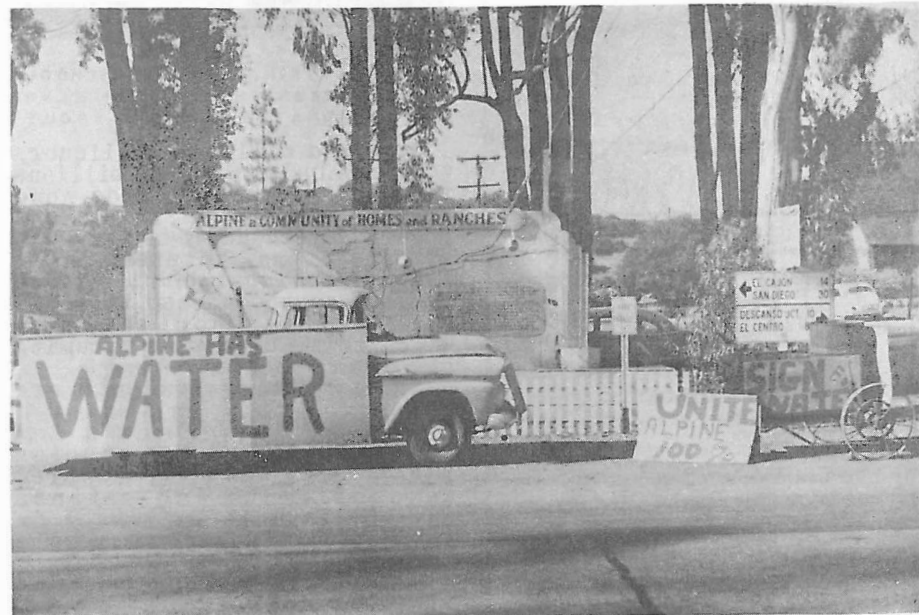

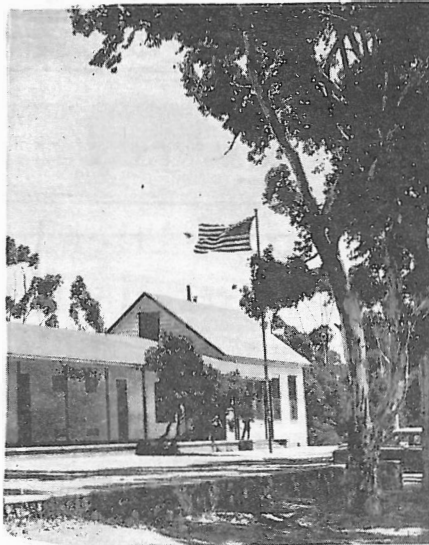

For the richest, most progressive nation of the world (at least that's what we say we are) to countenance such a disgrace as the present school problem, is one of the puzzles of the century. Or shall we call it disgrace of the ages?

We spend millions on liquor, tobacco, fun and folly, billions in foreign aid that aids none of us, and pay a fixed and growing overhead in storage of surplus items, interest on an illegal national debt, yet we are too short on cash to build sufficient schoolrooms in which to teach a fine upcoming generation.

Spring Valley students are going to study in tents, a temporary measure at a low cost. Well, our pioneering forefathers lived in covered wagons, tents and cabins. Why not schools in tents? Or surplus barracks, or simple cabins?

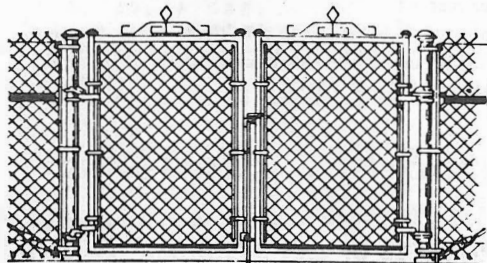

Dr. R.M. Ledford emceed the session in a masterly fashion, giving everyone a chance, and keeping it pleasantly brief. He sketched the situation, then called on Byrl Phelps, engineer who has handled the proposed East County MWD from its inception back in 1954.

Main theme was to clarify the facts of progress and why it is believed the Alpine Heights MWD-- now legally formed-- cannot get water. He told how all engineering data, maps, descriptions had been prepared and shown. 'About the time the description was accepted by the county authority' he stated 'it was then sent to the Metropolitan. We were asked not to have any exceptions in the district. We had one group (Heights) that did not want in the district. We left them out of our original description.

Mr. Freeland called my office and asked me to go down to Dave

Bird's office and declared that those folks did not want to be in the district. We left them out and were told by the County authority that we could not have these exceptions within the boundaries. They wanted their boundaries as near as possible enclosed boundaries.

'Their reasons were they had exceptions before and just about the time these districts were completed and the water mains started, then the folks that had been excepted then found their wells had gone dry and they wanted to be in the district.

'Now that is a fact that happened in El Cajon Valley; has happened in the Santee area, and has happened in the Helix area. There is the Jenney Ranch and other areas around Johnstown that are now asking for water. Blossom Valley did not want into the Helix district when that area was formed so we have had those examples and they have pointed them out to us and said we must have these boundaries as near closed as possible. We circulated petitions, we did have meetings here.

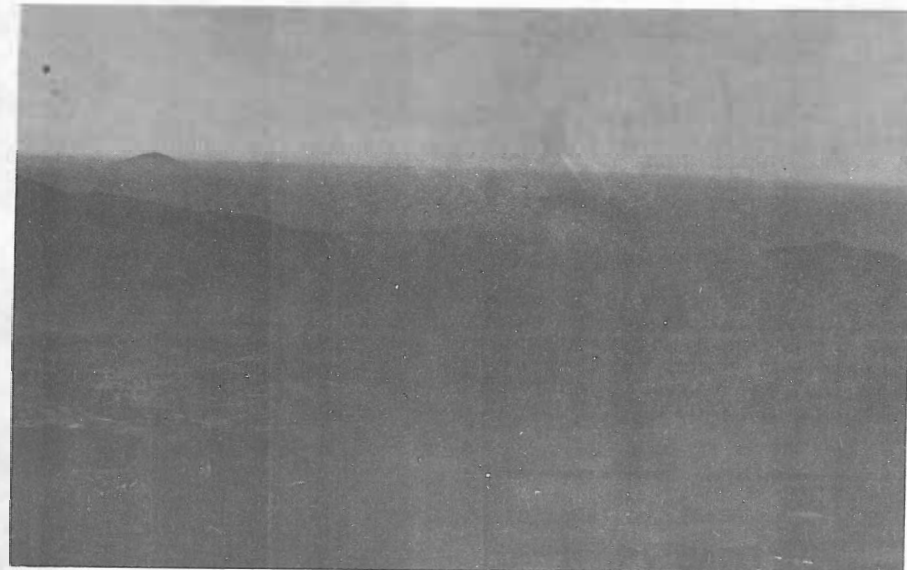

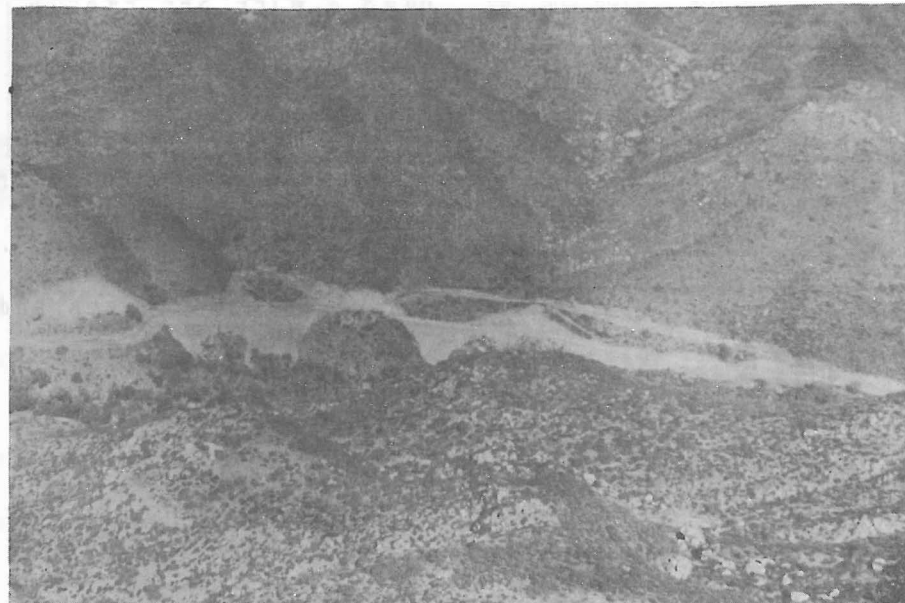

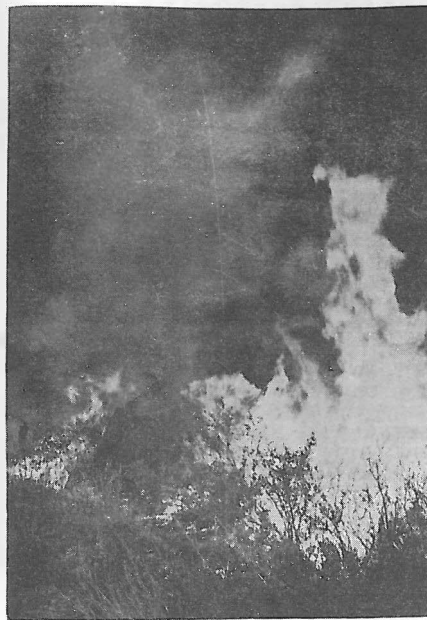

haired boy of 10, but it is not known if they are the Moyers' youngsters. They left a note on the door for the milkman: "No milk tomorrow, please". He left none, but did leave a bill for \$3.85.

On Aug. 1 they moved with their furniture into the cottage, a rental on the ranch of Wm. Hollenbeck. They paid a month's rent' says Hollenbeck, a radio and TV personality now on KITT an FM station in S.D. Sunday nights with Barbara Perry. This week the ranch was sold, so it is no more concern of Hollenbeck. (See story elsewhere).

He added that Moyers had taken the house after the former renters, W.J. Woodmancy and wife had asked if "their uncle and aunt could take over the rental", which they did. Woodmancy then left town. Mail for him came here but is unclaimed.

The boy had been riding a nice pinto pony and on the Saturday took it next door to Wake's Feed Store, and asked if he could leave it there "till we come back Sunday night". Wake said okay. His children cared for it, but Sunday night the

Moyers failed to get it.

At the cottage they left their dog, Trigger, a rabbit and ducks, with no food or water. When they failed to show, Wake asked about the horse. Mrs. Hollenbeck said they had not returned and the animals had no feed. The dog adopted the Wakes and they took over the other animals.

tion as quickly as possible. I have been asked to vote against letting Venture County into the Metropolitan WD. It is very important that you folks here get together and decide what you are going to do and stick by it and make some progress.


'I was asked whether the little area included in this small Heights district would or could be annexed to the authority. I couldn't see in the first place how Rio would ever want to make them a part of the Rio district and in the second place I don't think the authority would accept it. I don't believe it would be approved by the Rio, the S.D. authority or the Metropolitan.

'The authority has given its approval to a certain area up here to form the East County MWD. I think the authority and the Metropolitan would both approve. Both agencies would feel that it wouldn't be just to permit say a little area like Alpine Heights District, even if the community of Alpine was taken in, I don't believe that they would feel that it is just to the rest of the people and to permit it.

One profit from water will no doubt be in reduced fire rates. Wayne Kenaston of Eastgate Insurance, a partner with Jim Clements of Alpine, told the Sun that underwriters would make a study following installation of fire hydrants. 'It will take a long time' he says, 'but it could reduce rates from one-half to maybe two-thirds.'
