EDITORIAL.

What is America Sealing Inside Its Sewer Manholes?

This is written on the day that Russia's No. 1 man comes to town. Perhaps it is the most deplorable situation ever to happen in America: the government blandly announces that the greatest security in its history is being arranged to protect Khrushchev from 'possible harm or assassination'.

Anything of this nature-- even boos or a mild demonstration-- would do more for the cause of Communism than anything else. Since we invited

the premier to visit us, returning Nixon's sojourn there, where he was treated with respect, it should be only meet and right that we return similar treatment.

This situation proves visibly the tremendous hidden power of propaganda. America has practiced anti-Russian attitudes in every phase of life; the press, TV and radio, on the platform, in the pulpit, where least of all any one should be condemned.

The U.S. has been fed a lot of pap about Russians wanting to see America lessened in stature, but the fact is a lot of people here still do their own thinking; many are admirers of the Russian people. History shows that they have accomplished a lot in more recent times. Americans have been taught that they are the greatest people on earth, then when they go world traveling they discover that others have culture, physical fitness, intelligence, refinement and a few other traits of civilization.

No doubt he will note a few things here that we regret; the huge steel industry on strike; rat packs and gang killings; rapings and murders; highway slaughter; schools overcrowded; rockets sputtering out on their pads; millions in farm produce in storage upon which we pay taxes, just to have it given away or rotting, just to list a few!

While some sects are publicly praying and squawking about allowing Mr. Khrushchev to visit our shores, some might be silently asking that no untoward act may be done to put America disrepute. CI

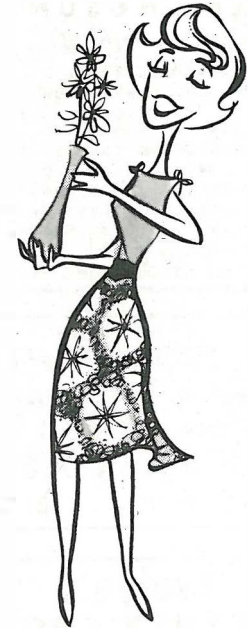

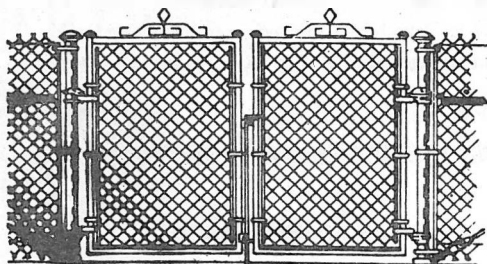

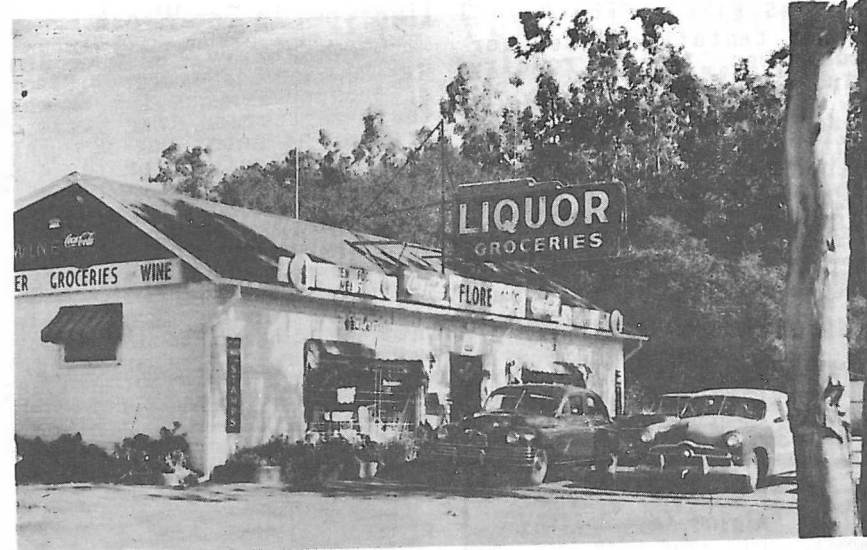
The new plant will include an administration building, two classroom structures of four rooms each and minor service facilities.

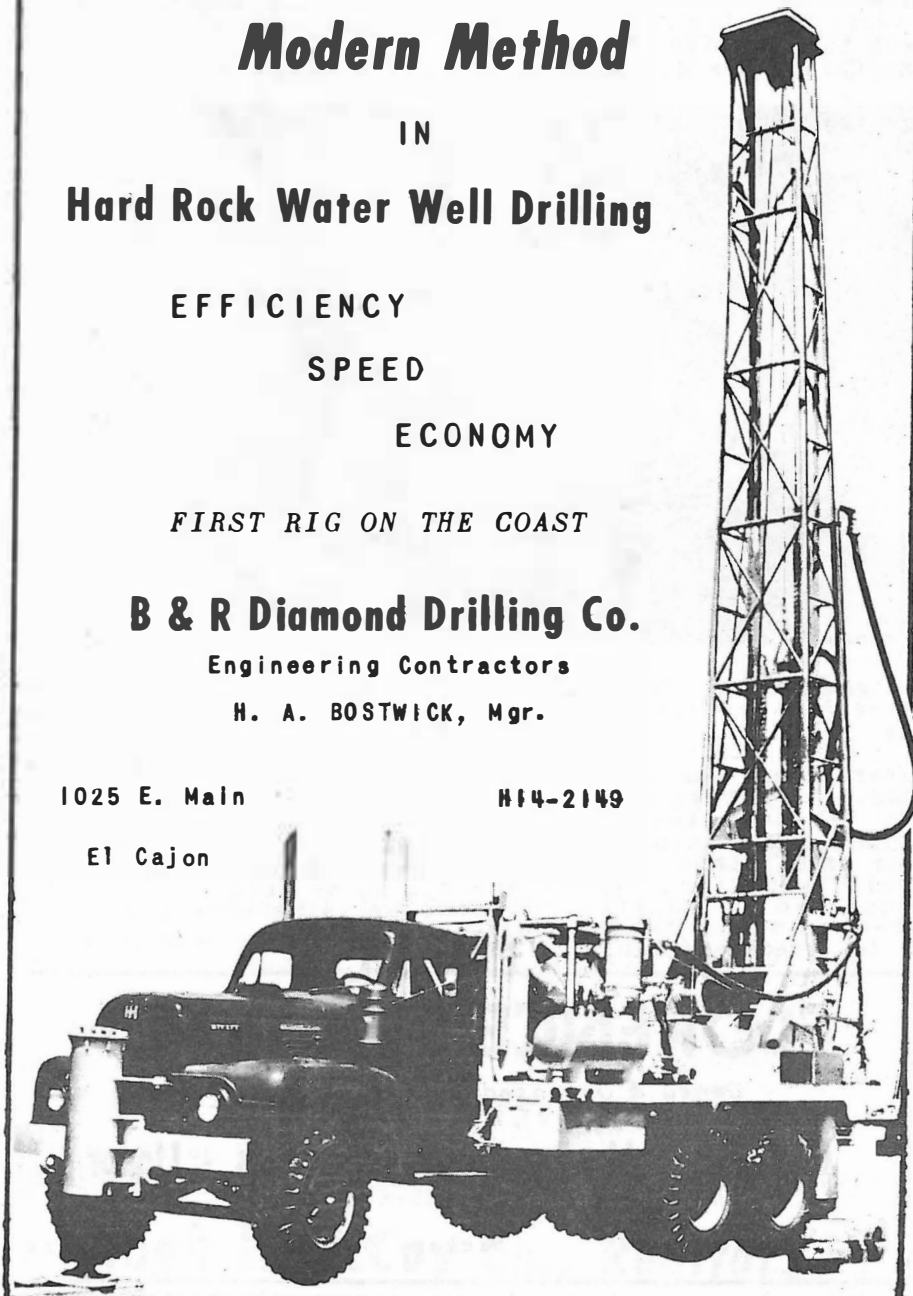

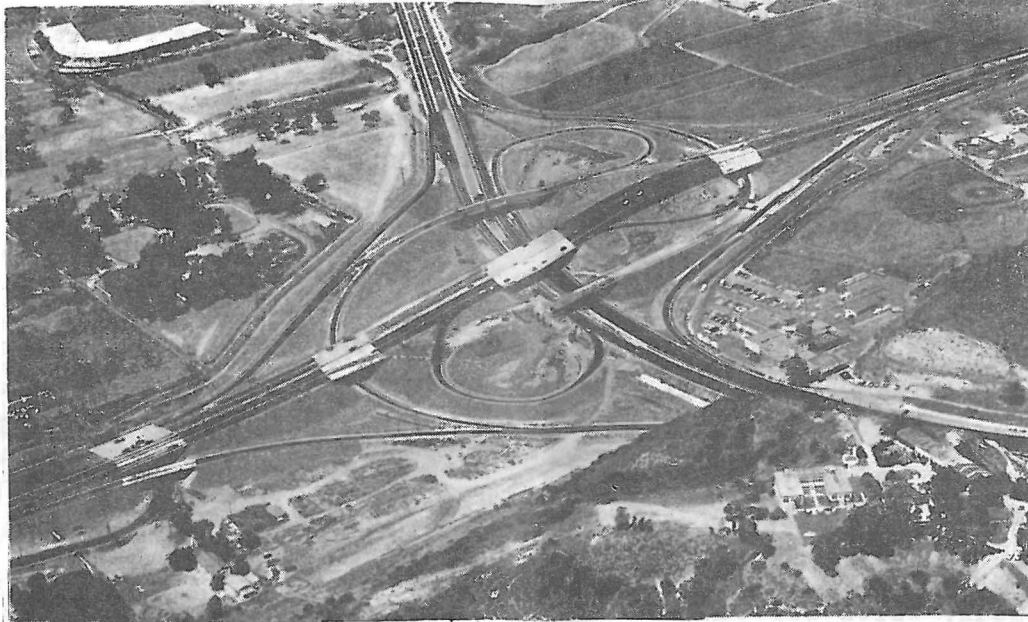

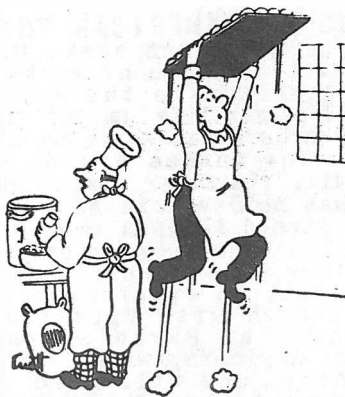
Pamela and Beckie Axson are back at Alpine School again. They live down in Peutz Valley and last year went to school in S.D.

finally concluded a 'hands off' policy till the hassle between the original East County, in process of formation for many months, and the hurriedly organized Heights district, become one.

One question facing Rio directors: is Rio willing to annex in the event Alpine Heights is successful to annex to itself the greater Alpine area? 'The committee recommendation is that you do not consider the annexation unless you annex the whole area', said one director.

Mr. Price believed that 'the County Water Authority leans to the formation of the East County' (This is so, as it has already approved).

Mr. Hendrickson remarked that 'the actual conclusion is that there is a disagreement in the heights area as to how they should get Colorado water and thus shall not consider the annexation until there is a manifestation of the people in that area'.

It was revealed that the Heights cost of annexation would be \$1.05, while the East County would be 72¢, plus a higher back debt load, which could influence voters to prefer the East County plan.

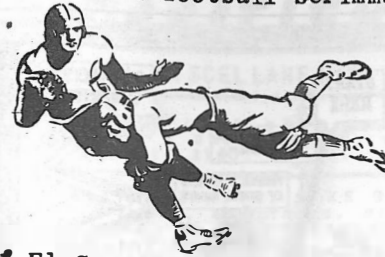

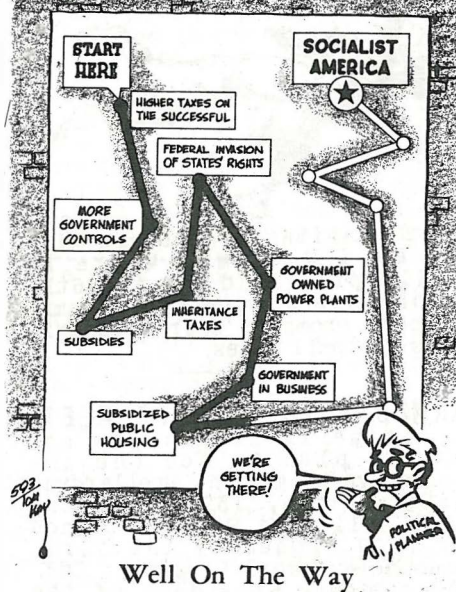

San diego county sold more property last month than in any other March in history. The record showed a total of 3500 transfers compared with the previous March's 3267.
